1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

This grant Milwaukee Police Department (MPD), in partnership with the Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) and the Urban Institute, proposes to purchase state-of-the-art software for the purpose of launching a mobile anonymous reporting system (ARS) application within Milwaukee schools. The software will enable students, teachers, faculty, and community members to anonymously identify threats of school violence.

2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

This grant improves and maintains the ability of the Department to respond to emergency threats by providing accurate threat information to officers in the field in real-time, thereby increasing officer and public safety.

3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

This grant aims to improve public safety in schools by integrating different sources of information about potential school violence through a single stream for students, faculty, teachers, and community members to report potential threats. It also provides a multifaceted response by providing information to both Milwaukee Public Schools and Milwaukee Police Department. Finally, the research and evaluation by the Urban Institute will help to improve this program during the grant period.

The Urban Institute will conduct research and evaluation to determine the efficiency of the implementation and efficacy of the program.

The grant period extends from October 1, 2019 – September 30, 2022.
