1. Describe the proposed ordinance or resolution.

The 2020 Coronavirus Emergency Response grant will allow for the Milwaukee Police Department (MPD) to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic in many ways. Funding will reimburse overtime used for relevant duties or to meet staffing shortages. Funds will be used to purchase prisoner conveyance vehicles, portable messaging signs, computers, software, teleconferencing upgrades, and the implementation of an online incident reporting system. Funding will support the installation of sinks, the renovation of a district prisoner processing facility, and upgrades to many restroom facilities, drinking fountains, and doors in numerous work locations to be "hands free."

No equity impacts are anticipated. The grant provides funding for equipment and technology upgrades, improvements to facilities, and overtime for the MPD to continue to provide essential services despite staffing challenges.
