### **Executive Summary**

On October 27, 2022, Fiserv Inc announced that it would move its Corporate headquarters to downtown Milwaukee to Hub640, the location of the former Boston Store located at 640 N. Vel R. Phillips Avenue, a few blocks from the Deer District, the site of the Fiserv Forum. The announcement was met with great fanfare and excitement.


Fiserv President, Chairman, and CEO Frank Bisignano said, "Fiserv roots run deep in Wisconsin and we're proud to be expanding our presence and investment in the state and the local workforce."

The project began with an aggressive schedule, hiring a Construction Manager which engaged Prism Technical, serving as inclusion coordinator (IC). By March '23, Prism sent project introductory emails to over three dozen SBE certified firms and organizations connected to diverse local venders to notify businesses of the project opportunity and to solicit firm qualifications.

The project had a change in the CM leadership, bringing on Gardner Builders, with Prism remaining as the IC in July '23. The project faced this challenge without any changes to the standard city inclusion requirements noted below.

Professional Services: 18% SBE Construction Services: 25% SBE

Workforce: 40% RPP for onsite labor

## **First Source Hiring Event**

With the assistance of Prism Technical Management & Marketing Services several contractors working on the Fiserv HQ project participated in a First Source hiring event at SDC Milwaukee held September 27, 2023. The event was hosted by Employ Milwaukee and SDC and targeted RPP certified, RPP eligible and underemployed job seekers, as well as those looking for training opportunities.

The attendees were received by contractors hiring for the Fiserv HQ project, construction unions recruiting candidates and agencies offering free skills training.

The event was attended by over 80 prospective employees.






