

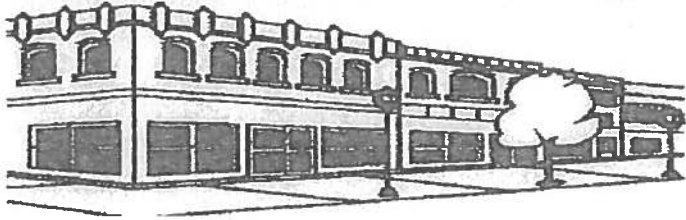
This report was written by P.O. Dean DRAJKOWSKI assigned to the License Unit day shift.

On Saturday, September 20, 2014, I was assigned to the Wisconsin WINS Youth Tobacco Initiative, which checks area vendors for age compliance tobacco purchases. I was working with Chanel L.E. JACKSON, B/F, 03-03-98, of 2770 N. 15<sup>th</sup> St., phone #553-0177, who is 16 years old and not of legal age to purchase tobacco. A photo of JACKSON was taken at the beginning of the assignment for identification.

At about 12:05 PM, JACKSON entered Villard Pump and Pantry located at 4105 W. Villard Ave. and purchased three Jackpot mango cigars for \$1.00. JACKSON provided a description of the cashier that sold her the tobacco. Upon arrival, I observed the cashier exited the store and entered a vehicle parked on the east side of the building. I approached the vehicle and identified the cashier as Mohammad R. ABU-SAIF, A/M, 10-14-67. ABU-SAIF admitted he sold tobacco to JACKSON. ABU-SAIF stated he checked her id and thought she was born in 1998. I advised ABU-SAIF she was only 16 years old. The other cashier present was identified as Amen A. KHAN, A/M, 07-13-76.

The licensee for Villard Pump and Pantry was Lokesh DASARI, A/M, 04-20-80. DASARI was responsible for his employee who sold tobacco to JACKSON. DASARI was issued a citation for adult sell tobacco to person under 18.

4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)
6. You may then provide testimony.
  - a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
  - b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
  - c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
  - d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.



This report is written by Police Officer Gilbert Gwinn, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

1. INCIDENT: On 08/24/95 a patron of the Richochet Bar located at 7009 W. Capitol Dr. was beaten by another patron. The victim suffered a fractured left orbital, numerous contusions, and swelling to the brain. The suspect was arrested for Substantial Battery.
2. INCIDENT: On 10/13/95 at 12:16PM Officers were dispatched to a Battery complaint at the Richochet on Inn located at 7009 W. Capitol Dr. Investigation revealed that a former employee came into the tavern, and pushed the bartender into the wall. The suspect then exited the tavern, and damaged the bartenders auto. The suspect was arrested for Battery.

When the police finally showed up, all they did was ride through the alley (the people obviously turned their music down at that point and drove off), and kept going. This is not the first time that the police don't even bother to step out of the vehicle. Many times, these people are extremely drunk and just pull off. It is now June 1<sup>st</sup> and I don't have any solid date on the hearing for the bar, nor do my neighbors. It's very difficult and frustrating for people like myself to try to fix situations in the neighborhood when we don't have the support of the city. I'll most likely be able to take the day off of work when I find out what the exact date of the hearing is for the bar, but I'm not sure how most people are expected to get a day off of work with such short notice. I feel like most of my efforts are a complete waste of time. I fully expect that the Ricochette owner will get another slap on the hand this year (even though he's done nothing that he said he would do at last year's hearing...AGAIN) after I spend hours down there on my day off of work. It's no wonder to me

that people in Milwaukee just throw up their hands and move out of this city. With that being said, can I please get a solid date for the hearing for the bar? I will take the day off and make my last efforts this year.

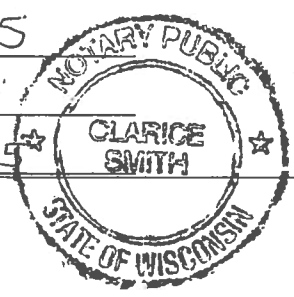
