1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):
The Milwaukee Police Department is the host agency for the Southeast Wisconsin Threat Analysis Center (STAC), an all crimes, all threats, information sharing fusion center for the eight counties of Southeast Wisconsin including Milwaukee, Waukesha, Racine, Kenosha, Walworth Ozaukee, Washington, and Dodge. Grant funds will be used to hire an Intelligence and Infrastructure Protection Analyst who will collect, research, analyze, and develop intelligence and protection products related to critical infrastructure, coordinate site visits and vulnerability assessments with local public and private sector and law enforcement partners, and share information to prepare and counter potential acts of terrorism to improve safety for communities in Southeastern Wisconsin and across the state.
2. Relationship to City-Wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:
The purpose of the grant is to improve STAC capacity to improve detection, prevention, deterrence, and response to crime and terrorism. The Intelligence and Infrastructure Protection Analyst will coordinate risk, threat, and vulnerability assessments and share information with partners. The grant will fund salary and fringe benefits for the Intelligence and Infrastructure Protection Analyst and critical training.
3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):
The total grant award of \$115,000 with a grantor amount of \$115,000 will fund hiring an Intelligence and Infrastructure Protection Analyst. No Department match is required. Position authority will expire on 12/31/2023 unless the Intelligence and Infrastructure Protection Analyst grant is extended.
