Subject: Survey of Taxicab Rates

Pursuant to your request, a survey was conducted on taxicab rates for cities comparable to Milwaukee. Items surveyed include:
"Flag drop" charge (the initial charge to which all other fees are added). Mileage charge.
Waiting time charge.
Whether there is a fuel surcharge, and if so, the amount.
Charge for additional passengers.
Any other special charge, such as a minimum charge or luggage charge.
Date of last fare increase.

The following cities were surveyed: Chicago, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, Detroit, Indianapolis, Madison and Minneapolis.

This information was gathered by researching the cities' municipal codes and by contacting cab companies in these cities. The results are displayed in Table 1 on the following page.

Milwaukee's flag drop fee is the lowest of all the cities surveyed at \$1.75. The highest flag drop fee is $\$ 3.00$ in Madison. In terms of mileage fees, Milwaukee, Madison and Indianapolis show the highest rates at $\$ 2.00$ per mile. The lowest rate is $\$ 1.60$ in Minneapolis, Detroit, Cincinnati and Cleveland. Milwaukee, Cleveland and Detroit have the lowest waiting rates at $\$ 0.25$ per minute. The highest rate is twice that amount, \$0.50, in Madison.

Among the cities surveyed, Milwaukee and Madison are the only ones that have fuel surcharges; this charge is $\$ 1$ in both cities. Additional passenger charges vary among the three cities that have them in terms of how the fee is charged. For example, Chicago charges $\$ 1$ for the first additional passenger and $\$ 0.50$ for each additional passenger. Milwaukee's additional passenger fee compared to Chicago is: less for one additional passenger, the same for two additional passengers, and more for three or more additional passengers. Indianapolis' fee of $\$ 0.65$ is less than Milwaukee's fee of $\$ 0.75$. Milwaukee is the only city with a luggage fee, which is $\$ 0.10$ per bag; it applies to grocery bags and luggage handled by the driver.

There were three cities with minimum charges: Cincinnati, Milwaukee and Minneapolis. Milwaukee differs from the other cities in that the minimum charge only
applies to fares originating at Mitchell International Airport to any other part of the city.

Table 2 below compares the total cost of a 1-,3-,5- and 10- mile taxi fares in each city. These fares are for a single rider, without luggage, where a minimum charge and waiting rate do not apply.

The fares shown above include flag drop charges and mileage rates. The fares for Milwaukee and Madison do not include the $\$ 1$ fuel surcharge for either city.

Table 3 provides a ranking, in descending order, of taxi fares for 1-,3-,5-, and 10mile rides.

**Fares have been calculated based on the rates in Table 1.
Milwaukee's 1-mile taxi fare is the second lowest among the cities surveyed. This reflects the city's low flag drop fee. The comparatively higher 3-, 5 - and 10-mile fares reflect Milwaukee's higher mileage rate.

In summary, Milwaukee's flag drop fee and waiting time rate are among the lowest of all the cities surveyed, though the mileage rate is comparatively high. Additionally, fees unique to Milwaukee such as the luggage fee, the minimum charge for rides originating at General Mitchell International airport, and the additional passenger fee raise Milwaukee's fees above the average of the cities surveyed.

Graph 1 plots Milwaukee's taxi fares for one, three and five mile rides with the fuel surcharge. It also shows Milwaukee's fares without the fuel surcharge. The highest, lowest and average fares for these distances are shown on the graph as well. Milwaukee's fares are shown in yellow, the highest fares are red, the average fares are blue and the lowest fares are green. The orange line shows Milwaukee's fares without a $\$ 1$ fuel surcharge.

This Graph illustrates how Milwaukee's taxi fares with a fuel surcharge remain comparatively more expensive than the average fare for one, three and five mile rides. After one mile there was only a $\$ .07$ difference between the fare in Milwaukee and the average; but after 5 miles that difference increased to $\$ 1.40$. The average fare without Milwaukee's fuel surcharge is $\$ .11$ less than the average with the fee. It is not graphed. Without the fuel surcharge, Milwaukee's fare remains below average for one, three and five mile cab rides.
