
Dear Ms. Burdue:

This is to notify you that on Tuesday, January 28, 2020, the City's Licenses Committee voted to recommend to the City's Common Council not to renew the Class B Tavern, Public Entertainment Premises, and Food Dealer licenses for the premises located at 100 W Maple St ("Ollie's") based on the police report, and aldermanic and applicant testimony.




Dear Christopher Case:
