There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the tollowing reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, lilegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. It is the intention of the Common Council to suspend or non-renew the licenses if objectors provide testimony related to the factors enumerated in MCO 85-4-4 that the Common Council finds to be true by a preponderance of the evidence and/or police reports are found to be true by a preponderance of the evidence. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing. You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. This report is written by Police Officer Corstan D. COURT, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

- 1. On 06/03/07 at 5:49 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 340 E Bay for a Fight and Man With Gun complaints. Officers spoke with the bartender/manager, identified as Jay Poshepny, who stated that two known actors who were outside of the tavern started to argue with some of his patrons who were seated in the beer garden. Poshepny stated he observed these subjects enter the tavern and start to physically fight these patrons who were seated in the beer garden. Poshepny stated he asked these subjects to leave and they refused. Poshepny further stated that one of these subjects displayed a knife and caused damage to the front of tavern. When police arrived, both victims and suspects were gone.
  - 2. On 03/03/2010 at 2:08am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a battery complaint at 338 E Bay Street. Investigation revealed that the bartender working at the time was the victim of a substantial battery by two unknown actors who had been giving her a hard time and becoming argumentative with her prior to refusing to leave the bar at closing. The agent informed officers that his video system was not working due to a burned out motor, but it was being repaired.
  - 3. On 04/15/2010 at 12:10am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a fight at 338 E Bay Street. Investigation revealed that there was an altercation between two patrons that arrived together. The incident started as a verbal argument and escalated into a physical fight with the two punching each other. The bartender called the police while one of the patrons picked up a barstool and struck the other. The bartender told them the police were called and they both fled out the front door. No other patrons were involved.

4. On 03/22/2013, a customer inside the business at 338 East Bay Street (Bay Street Pub) created a disturbance and was cited for Disorderly Conduct. All licenses were current and no violations were observed.

5. On 03/15/20 at 12:22am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 338 E. Bay Street for a property damage complaint. Upon arrival, officers interviewed the applicant who stated a subject knocked over an air conditioning unit and he was holding him for police. The applicant was advised to see if the unit was, in fact, damaged and to call police with the results.

- 6. On 02/14/22 at 10:06pm, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 338 E. Bay Street for a battery compliant. Surveillance footage revealed that a patron engaged in an argument with the bartender, went behind the bar area, and struck the bartender several times. The patron left the establishment before police arrival. The applicant was cooperative.
- 7. On 03/17/22 at 1:21am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 338 E. Bay Street for an overdose compliant. The applicant and employee were cooperative and the applicant showed officers video footage from his phone which captured the overdose inside the tavern.
- 8. On 03/18/22 at 8:00pm, Milwaukee Police conducted a license premise check at 338 E. Bay Street. The only violation was the posting of licenses and the staff was cooperative.
- 9. On 09/12/22 the applicant was cited in Milwaukee County for Possession of THC.

- 10. On 08/05/23 at 2:43a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Subject with Gun at 338 E. Bay St. The anonymous caller stated they observed 2 subjects outside and one struck the other in the head with a firearm. On arrival officers interviewed the bartender who stated they did not call the police but there were two subjects fighting outside, however, no weapons were observed.
- 11. On 09/17/23 at 2:02a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Shooting at 338 E. Bay St. On arrival officers encountered the victim holding their neck and stating they had just been shot. Investigation revealed a fight ensued inside the bar between patrons, to which the bartender did not call the police. The victim was outside when they believed they were struck by gunfire. The victim was conveyed to the hospital and

it was determined the victim's injury was more consistent with a battery. No casings were found on scene and there were no camera's that captured the incident.

- 12. On 09/30/23 at 2:51a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Subject with Gun at 338 E. Bay St. The caller/victim stated they were inside the bar, when a subject was allowed in, who pointed a firearm at the victim and told them to leave the bar. The officers attempted to interview the bartender regarding the incident however they were extremely uncooperative and eventually cited for Obstructing an Investigation (J981SNQ6N4). The suspect was located in the basement area and taken into custody. The agent later arrived on scene and stated the camera system was inoperable and they didn't intend to fix it as they were closing the business soon.
- 13. On 10/02/23 at 2:40p.m., Milwaukee Police conducted follow up at 338 E. Bay St. regarding Item #12. The agent was cooperative and allowed officers to check the basement area for a firearm that may have been discarded. Officers observed an offwhite powdery substance suspected to be cocaine, and a firearm in a box below the suspected cocaine was recovered.

Re: Notice of Mandatory Retail Establishment Security Measures

Dear Mark R. PASCHAL:

This letter serves as notice to you that Jeffery B. Norman, Chief of Police, by his designee, District Two Commander, Captain Patrick Pajot, has determined that three (3) or more separate incidents of qualified activity have occurred at Bay Street Pub, a retail establishment located at 338 E Bay St Milwaukee, WI, within a one-year time period. As the premises owner or other responsible party, you are required to install a security camera system and comply with all regulations set forth in Milwaukee Code of Ordinances § 105-91.

The qualified activities that have occurred at the premises include:

- 1. On Saturday, September 30, 2023, at 2:51-am, Milwaukee police offices were dispatched to the premises to investigate a report of a "Subject with Gun". The investigation revealed that a patron had been in the bar after close with an employee, an acquaintance of the employee arrived on scene and allegedly threatened the patron with a firearm, and the suspect then concealed himself inside of the premises and was taken into custody A firearm and a quantity of a suspected controlled substance were later recovered. MPD IR #232730027.
- 2. On Sunday, September 17, 2023, at 2:02 am, Milwaukee police offices were dispatched to the premises to investigate a report of a "Shooting". The investigation revealed that a fight had occurred between patrons inside of the premises that continued outside of the premises. An unknown subject then discharged a firearm, striking a patron. The cameras for the premises were not functional. The investigation remains open. MPD IR #232600014.
- 3. On Saturday, August 5, 2023, at 2:43 am, Milwaukee police officers were dispatched to the premises to investigate a report of a "Subject with a Gun" where an anonymous caller stated that they were driving past and observed 2 males outside of the location with one of the males striking the other in the head with a firearm. Officers arrived on-scene and spoke with the bartender, who had not called. The bartender stated that there had been females fighting outside but that they had not observed any weapons and did not know the subjects. Officers were traable to locate any injured parties or anyone requiring

The regulations of Milwaukee Code of Ordinances § 105-91 require you to install, maintain in proper working order, and operate during all hours the establishment is open to customers, security cameras that provide clear images of the entire premises, including areas as specified on the license as well as the public right-of-way abutting the premises and any off-street parking lot used expressly for patron parking. In addition, at least one security camera shall provide an overall view of each counter and register area, and at least one security camera shall be positioned to provide a clear, identifiable, full-frame image of the face of each person entering and leaving the retail establishment. Security camera views shall not be obstructed by fixtures or displays. If a time-lapse digital video recorder is operated, images shall not be recorded at a slower speed than 24 hours. All digital video records shall be stored and maintained in good viewing order for 30 days after recording. On-duty store employees shall provide a copy of recorded digital images to law enforcement officers immediately upon request. The surveillance security cameras shall be maintained in proper working order for a period of 2 years from the date of this notice.

You must install a security camera system within sixty (60) days of receiving this notice. Any premises owner who violates any of the provisions of § 105-91 shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000, and in default of payment thereof, be imprisoned as provided by law.

All installation work must be completed by a licensed electrical contractor. In accordance with Milwaukee Code of Ordinances § 200-24, permits are required except when the installation of wiring order equipment operates at less than 100 volts, unless any such installation is located in a plenum or it is penetrates fire-rated or smoke-protected construction. Permit information may be found by calling (414) 286-2532.

Please be advised that you may appeal the determination of the Chief of Police to the Administrative Review Appeals Board as provided in Milwaukee Code of Ordinances § 320-11. The Board may extend installation beyond sixty (60) days in the case of a financial hardship.

Re: Notice of Acceptance of Proposed Course of Action

Dear Mark R PASCHAL:

This letter is notice to you that the Milwaukee Chief of Police, by the chief's designee, the district commander, has received, reviewed, and accepted your proposed course of action for abatement of nuisance activities occurring at the premises located at 338 E Bay St ("the premises"), pursuant to Milwaukee Code of Ordinances ("MCO") § 80-10, Chronic Nuisance Premises.

Be advised that you now have 45 days from the date of this notice of acceptance to implement the course of action. The premises will be monitored during the implementation period and if you follow through and properly implement the course of action, no further action will be taken; except that if nuisance activities persist thereafter, you may be asked to modify and re-submit your course of action for review, and acceptance or rejection.

If you fail to properly implement the accepted course of action within 45 days, and a subsequent nuisance activity occurs at the premises, you will be subject to a collections action for the cost of any police services and enforcement.

Once you have been billed for the costs of enforcement for three or more separate nuisance activities within one year, the premises may be designated a chronic nuisance, pursuant to MCO § 80-10-6, and each and every subsequent incident of nuisance activity at the premises may be deemed a separate violation and result in a citation being issued to you for failure to abate the nuisance activity. Each citation would subject you to a forfeiture of not less than \$1,000.00 or more than \$5,000.00. Upon default of payment of a chronic nuisance citation you would be subject to imprisonment in the county jail or house of correction for a period of not less than 40 days or more than 90 days for each violation.

Those wishing to provide oral testimony via phone or internet are asked to contact the staff assistant, Yadira Melendez at (414) 286-2775 or stasst5@milwaukee.gov for necessary information. Please make such requests no later than one business day prior to the start of the meeting. You are not required to attend the hearing, but please see the information below if you would like to provide testimony. Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing.

# Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.
