1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):
This DHS grant supports the Milwaukee Health Department's Sexual and Reproductive Health Program at the Keenan Health Center. Funding sustains the Disease Intervention Specialist team, which conducts case investigations and partner services for individuals impacted by sexually transmitted infections, with a focus on Milwaukee communities at highest risk.
2. Relationship to City-Wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:
Milwaukee's STI strategy focuses on reducing sexually transmitted infection rates through education, testing, and timely treatment. The city continues to experience significant inequities in STI incidence, prevalence, and access to affordable, responsive care. This program directly supports city-wide goals by advancing equitable access to services and strengthening our ability to identify, treat, and prevent STIs in the communities most impacted.
