Community Prosecution Unit

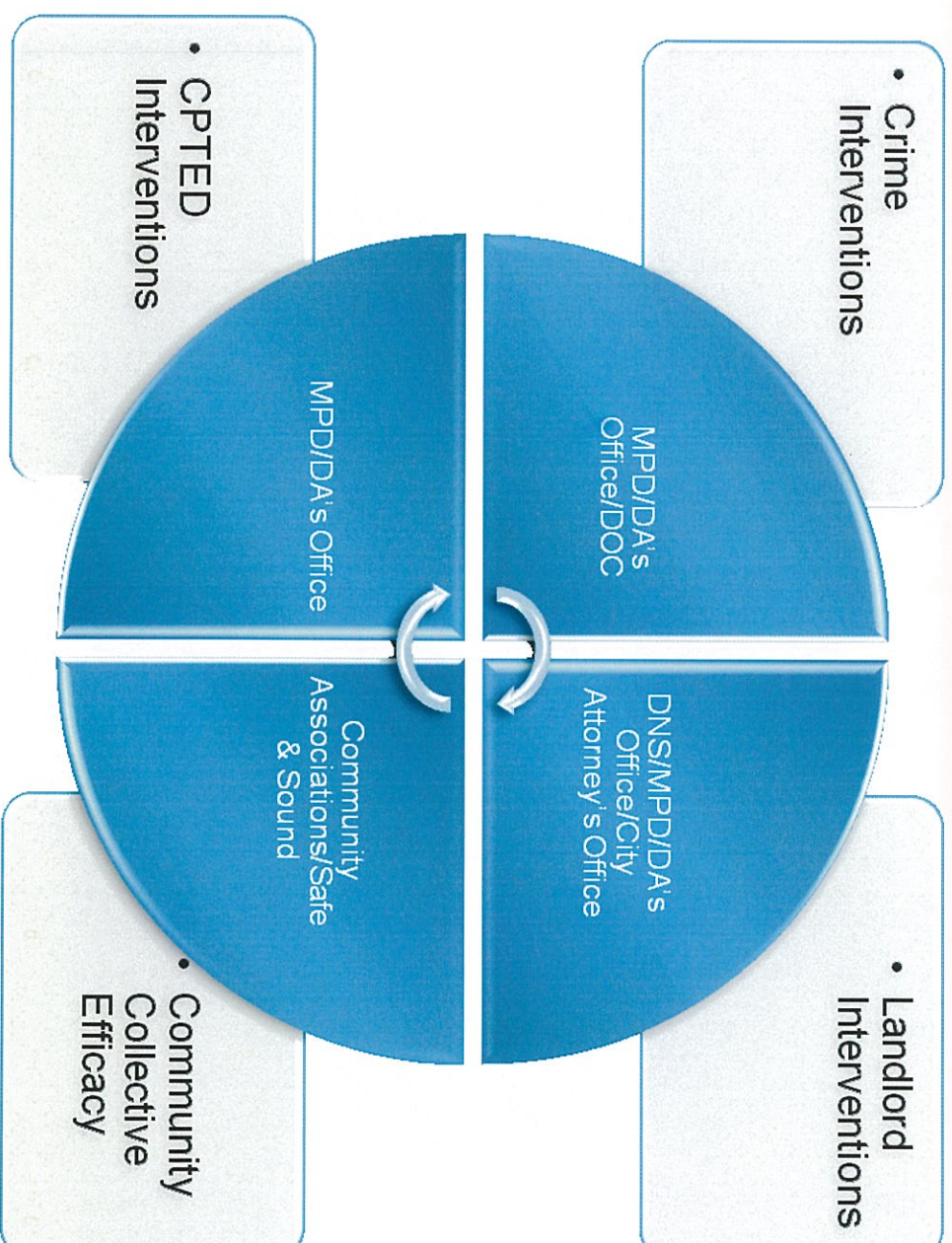
- ⌘ The City of Milwaukee's Community Prosecution Unit (CPU) consists of: District Attorney's Office Community Prosecutor; Milwaukee Police Department Community Prosecution Officers; Department of Neighborhood Services Inspectors; Community City Attorney; Safe & Sound Prosecution Coordinator; various City departments; and community resources
- ⌘ The goal of this collaboration is to deploy law enforcement, City resources, and community resources to reduce crime, increase quality of life, and increase private investment in Milwaukee's neighborhoods.

Geographic Targeting

- ⌘ The CPU model is Targeted Community Enforcement, which means the CPU chooses a defined geographic area where it will direct its resources.
- ⌘ The Target Area is chosen by: (1) need - statistical analysis and community concerns; and (2) capacity – the ability to achieve possible results. The crime-prevention initiatives in the target area are evaluated for their effectiveness.

Crime Interventions

- ⌘ Drug market abatement operations
- ⌘ Increased officer patrols
- ⌘ High value targeting
- ⌘ Prostitution interventions
- ⌘ Neighborhood-driven prosecution diversions
- ⌘ DOC geographic restrictions and increased monitoring of HVTs
- ⌘ DV intervention project

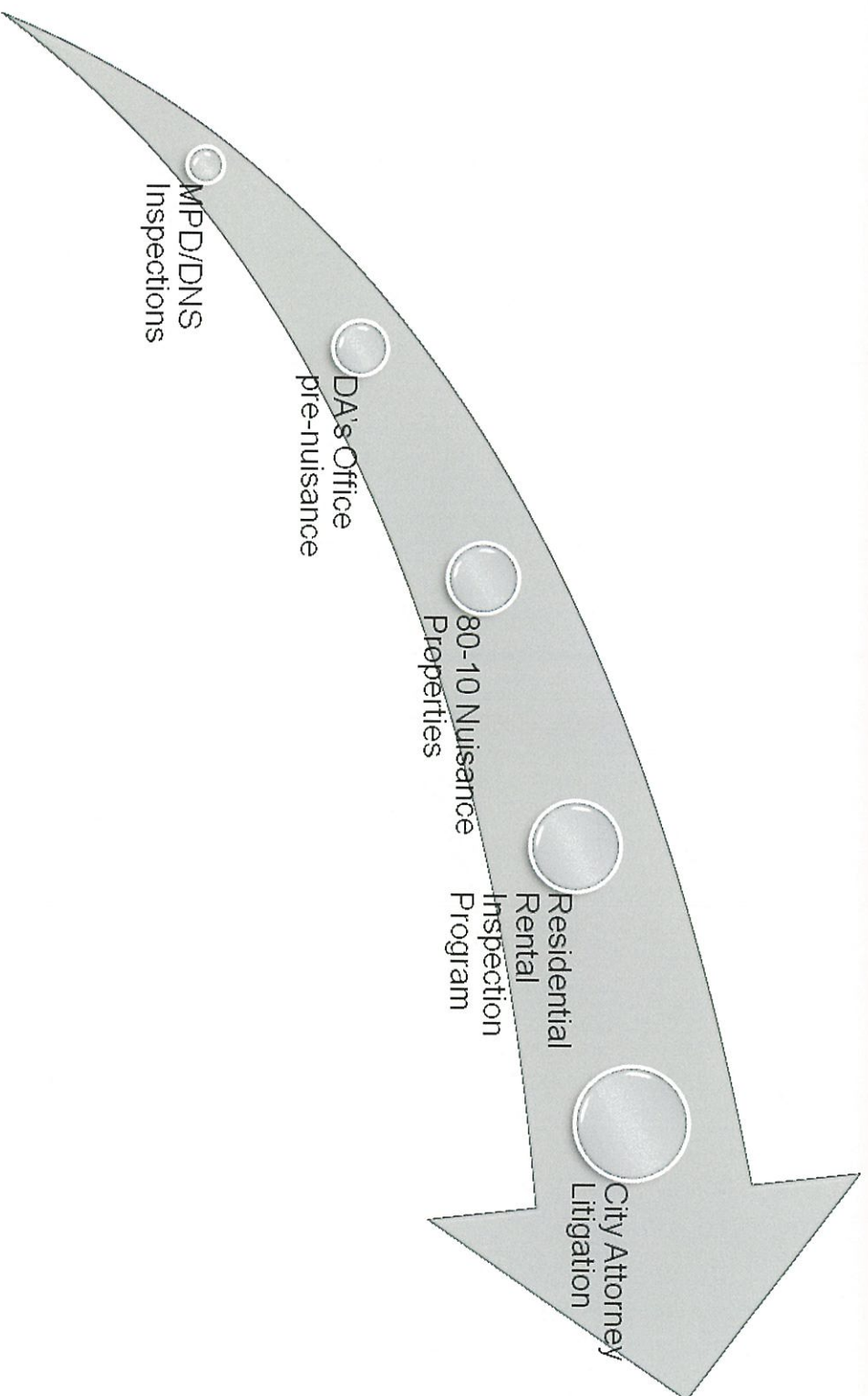
Crime Interventions – Target

- ∞ Hot Spots identified
- ∞ Identify dealers and connected properties (residence and stash properties)
- ∞ Identify reasons for hot spots – traffic; user population; deniability access... etc
- ∞ Identify problem families in the area
- ∞ Identify other physical and social disorders in the area

Landlord Interventions

- ∞ Evidence-based targeting to increase effectiveness of interventions and to diminish wasted resources and citizen complaints
- ∞ Substantial information sharing among enforcement agencies
- ∞ Scaled enforcement based on severity of nuisances or code violations
- ∞ Coordinated effort for high value target landlords

Landlord Interventions

- 80 Evaluation of existing laws and suggestions to strengthen nuisance abatement mechanisms
 - Increased use of RRI
 - DNS building code violations as trigger for 80-10
 - Lower amount of nuisance calls to trigger 80-10

CPTED Interventions

- ∞ Designated CPTED officers
- ∞ Business and residential CPTED surveys
- ∞ Public spaces and public transportation CPTED evaluations

Community Collective Efficacy

- ∞ Police waypoints
- ∞ CPU Action days based on community complaints
- ∞ Community problem solving sessions
- ∞ Educate to empower sessions
- ∞ Community collective efficacy trainings
 - Court watch
 - Contacting police
 - Home and business safety
 - Landlord compacts
 - Block watches
