The purpose of this grant is to identify individuals in Milwaukee lacking health insurance and assists them in enrolling in programs for which they are eligible. The grant also works to increase the enrollment of eligible families in Healthy Start and BadgerCare in Milwaukee. The program will continue to expand the collaborative effort for outreach and education on available health benefits and enrollment.

2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

This program relates to the City-wide strategic goals of improving the overall health of children. Funding under this grant will provide the department with additional resources to accomplish stated City and departmental goals.
