Dear Chief Hegarty:

Based upon my review of the police reports, autopsy protocol and toxicology report regarding the death of the above named individual, the evidence indicates Milwaukee Police Officers acted appropriately during the above mentioned incident.

The police reports reflect that on July 20, 2005 at approximately 8:03 p.m., City of Milwaukee Police Officers Michael Valluch, Jr. and Steven Jaeck were dispatched to a fight and while in route, it was updated to a child abuse at 20<sup>th</sup> and Burleigh. Upon arrival, they observed a black male, later identified as Jerry Birkley, standing in the doorway on the front porch at 3105 North 20<sup>th</sup> Street. He had one arm bear hugging a female child and the child was crying and attempting to push his arms away. He also was looking around and muttering to himself. Officer Jaeck told Birkley to drop the child, but he did not comply. Subsequently, Officer Valluch grabbed Birkley's right hand while Officer Jaeck grabbed his left hand, which resulted in Birkley dropping the girl.

While the officers attempted to control Birkley, he yelled "shoot me, shoot me in the head." He also attempted to pull his arms away from the officers.

Other squads arrived on the scene, and officers began to walk Birkley off the porch. Officer Valluch indicated another officer instructed him that they should take Birkley to the ground. However, the officers all started falling and fell to the ground along with Birkley. Other squads were called to the scene, and subsequently, officers handcuffed Birkley, and used plastic zip-cuffs on his legs. After he was restrained, Birkley was placed in a conveyance wagon. The Milwaukee Fire Department was summoned to the scene, and a decision was made to initiate an "emergency detention" as a result of Birkley's behavior. A private ambulance was called for conveyance to a hospital for Birkley to be medically cleared.

The reports indicate that while the officers were engaged with Birkley, a family member told the officers he was paranoid, and encouraged him to cooperate with police and not struggle. Subsequent interviews of family members indicate Birkley's behavior was attributed to his use of crack cocaine and alcohol. George Birkley, the brother of the deceased, told police that Jerry had a substance abuse problem and uses crack cocaine. He stated that Jerry had an addiction to crack cocaine for many years, and he hallucinates when he uses crack cocaine. He also said that Jerry has a lot of anxiety over the family situation in the house and becomes very angry when he gets high.

Subsequently, a private ambulance transported Birkley to St. Joseph's Hospital. At the hospital, Birkley struggled with police, security guards and medical staff. As a doctor, several nurses and other staff were attending to Birkley, he became unresponsive with respiratory distress. CPR was utilized and Birkley was intupated. Birkley produced a pulse and was breathing by use of a ventilator. At this point, he was no longer struggling or fighting with personnel or police. A nurse remained in the room monitoring Birkley. After approximately 20 minutes, his heart stopped again and medical staff attempted life saving measures. Approximately 15-20 minutes, Jerry Birkley was pronounced dead.

The September 19, 2005 toxicology report signed by Susan B. Gock, among other things, indicates Birkley's blood was positive for cocaine metabolite and benzodiazepins. The August 9, 2005 autopsy protocol signed by Dr. Jeffrey Jenzen, Medical Examiner for Milwaukee County, cites the

cause of death as "acute cocaine psychosis associated with coronary arteriosclerosis."
