This office is in receipt of your claim in the amount of \$1,600.00 relating to tow and recycling of your GMC Sierra truck on or about August 15, 2000.

We are advised by the Department of Neighborhood Services that on July 6, 2000 the vehicle was first observed and was placarded as being a nuisance vehicle. In addition, on July 7, 2000 an order was mailed to Jessie M. Spraggins-Pickett as the owner of the property at 2136 North 46<sup>th</sup> Street. This order stated that the vehicle had been declared a nuisance and to either fully correct the nuisance conditions within 72 hours or move said vehicle into a completely enclosed garage. A one week extension was granted due to a request from the owner. A re-inspection was of the property was completed on August 8, 2000. The re-inspection revealed the vehicle was present and in the same condition. The vehicle was then referred for towing. The Department of Neighborhood Services followed appropriate procedures in this matter, therefore, the City would not be liable. Accordingly, we are denying your claim.
