There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-2.7-4, probative evidence concerning whether or not a new license should be granted may be presented on the following subjects: whether or not the applicant meets the municipal requirements, the appropriateness of the location and premises where the licensed premises is to be located and whether use of the premises for the purposes or activities permitted by the license would tend to facilitate a public or private nuisance or create undesirable neighborhood problems such as disorderly patrons, unreasonably loud noise, litter, and excessive traffic and parking congestion. Probative evidence relating to these matters may be taken from the plan of operation submitted with the license application, if any, but shall not include the content of any music. Evidence regarding the fitness of the location of the type for which the license is sought; whether the proposal is consistent with any pertinent neighborhood business or development plans, or the location's proximity to areas where children are typically present. The applicant's record in operating similarly licensed premises; and whether on ot the applicant has been charged with or convicted of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the activity to be permitted by the license being applied for or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety or welfare may also be considered. This report is written by Police Officer David NOVAK, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

1. On 06/11/2008 the applicant was charged in Milwaukee County with Possession of THC §961.41(3g)(e).

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2. On 11/12/2016 Milwaukee police were dispatched to a fight/subject with a gun complaint at 634 West North Avenue. Investigation revealed there had been a fight inside the bar and all the involved parties were pushed outside. A gunfight ensued, during which several rounds were fired into the air and two subjects chased each other while firing weapons. One round struck a vehicle. The armed security guard told officers that "shooting in the air and at people was not a danger towards anyone" so he didn't take action during the gun battle. Milwaukee police incident report # 163170011 filed.

- 3. On 09/29/2017 at 2:35am officers observed cars parked in the bus zone in front of 634 W. North Av. The officer began issuing parking citations and the owners began moving their cars. The officers attempted to speak with owner of the tavern at 634 W. North Av but as they approached they heard the door being locked. The officer looked in the window and observed several people hide behind the bar. On 10/05/2017 the officers spoke with Terence SMITH, the bar manager. He stated he was aware of the incident. He was advised they could not lock the bar in an attempt to keep officer out. The officers checked the posted licenses which stated their closing hours were 1:30am Monday through Saturday.
- 4. On 10/13/17 at 6:15pm officers responded to Levels on North Bar (634 W North Ave) regarding a complaint that the establishment was open even though their license was expired. Upon arrival officers observed the open sing on and people inside the establishment with drink in their hands. Officers spoke with a bouncer and advised him that the bar was no supposed to be open. The bouncer called the owner by phone and explained the situation. The owner stated he didn't know the license was expired and stated he would comply and close the business.
- 5. On 10/17/17 at midnight officers conducted follow up regarding Levels on North Bar being open for business when their license was expired. An officer drove past the business and found it to be closed. The officer received an email from Terence Smith, the manager, asking why they could not be open. The officer responded by email explaining the Class B Tavern license was expired and the application for a provisional license was denied. Smith responded to the email stating he would comply and that they would be doing some remodeling until the license was renewed.

6. On 03/17/18 at 3:15 am, Milwaukee Police were investigating a shooting at N. 6<sup>th</sup> Street and W. North Avenue when an officer observed blood and multiple bullet casings on the stairs outside 634 W. North Avenue (Level's on North). An officer entered the tavern and made contact with a subject, who identified himself as the manager, and asked him if he knew anything about the shooting. The manager stated that he did hear 2 gunshots, went outside, but did not observe anything. While the officer was interviewing the manager, the door of the woman's restroom opened and a male and female exited and was told to wait for detectives. The officer did observe blood inside the threshold of the door to the tavern which caused the officer to look around the establishment for more signs of blood. While doing this the manager became defensive and agitated, questioning the officer as to what he was doing. The manager told the officer who the owner of the business was and asked the officer to contact the owner because he was "just the manager". While waiting for detectives, the officer observed and heard the bar manager became extremely uncooperative with them and kept repeating himself when asked questions. The agent was issued a citation.

7. On 03/20/18 at 10:30 pm, Milwaukee Police conducted follow-up regarding a shooting which occurred outside of 634 W. North Avenue (Level's on North) on 03/17/18. Employees of the tavern lied to officers about the events surrounding the incident and only told the truth when officers confronted them with the fact that police knew the shooting victim entered the establishment after being shot. One of the employees also said that he was the Manager of the tavern but when he was asked for his "Class B" manager's license, he changed his story and told officers that he just stocks and cleans the bar. While conducting these interviews, officers could smell fried food being made and found that there was an employee, in the kitchen, standing next to an oil fryer. There were four baskets of wings frying in the deep fryers and a five gallon bucket of chicken wings defrosting in the sink. The employee stated that they were selling food items and he was "in charge" of the food. Officers later check to see if the tavern had a food dealers license and found they did not. A citation was issued.

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- 8. On 03/21/18 at 8:30 pm, Milwaukee Police performed follow up at 634 W. North Avenue (Level's on North) regarding earlier contacts with police at the tavern (Items #6 and #7). The agent stated that he wanted to work with police on any problems that may be the result of the establishment. He was informed that the employees were uncooperative with officers during a shooting investigation, the manager urinated in a sink, and employees were cooking and selling food. The agent informed officers that he was unaware of these problems and the person urinating in the sink was not the manager but just a "helper". He was informed that a meeting needs to take place per the request of the Captain of the Fifth District in order to work out any problems and about the citation's he will be issued for the earlier violation observed by officers.
- 9. On 07/22/18 at 12:40 am, Milwaukee Police conducted a tavern check at 634 W. North Avenue (Level's on North). In past contacts with police, occupants would lock the entrance to the establishment and open it after several knocks. When officers approached the tavern during this check, patrons attempted to shut the door on officers but they were able to gain entry before the door was fully closed. As police gained entry, multiple subjects blocked the entrance and officers observed multiple subjects flee into the back rooms of the location. Officers checked the two bartenders for Class D Operators license but neither one could verify their license status. The maximum occupancy of the establishment is 62, but officer's body cameras revealed that the tavern appeared to be above that occupancy. There was armed security inside the tavern and officers did have a conversation with the agent. No citations were issued.
- 10. On 08/14/18 at 10:29 pm, Milwaukee Police conducted a tavern check at 634 W. North Avenue (Level's on North). Officers were met outside by the agent and they proceeded to enter the rear of the business which is a kitchen area. Officers observed in the kitchen that the agent had four fryers on and a large bucket of chicken in the sink defrosting under water. The agent was informed that he is not allowed to serve food because he did not have a proper license and he stated that he was not selling the food, it was for a party. Officers informed him that making chicken for a party is still in violation and he could receive citations if he does it again. The agent understood and said he would stop making chicken. The agent informed officers that his license was up for renewal and he has a meeting with the alderperson regarding his license.

11. On 10/12/2018 officers conducted a licensed premise check at 634 W. North Av. The officer observed a customer with food in a Styrofoam container. The officers attempted to check the kitchen but found it locked. The officer advised that as a licensed premise he could check the entire property. Access was granted and the officer observed 5 fryers operating and chicken defrosting in the sink. The applicant arrived while the officers were on scene and could not explain the food being prepare. The applicant was cited for Food Establishment License Required.

- 12.On 11/30/2018 officers conducted a licensed premise check at 634 W. North Av. The officers spoke with a bartender about whether the business would be open on New Year's Eve and she stated she was not sure because the owner has not advised them yet.
- 13. On 03/19/2019 at 2:04am officers observed people inside Level's on North, 634 W. North Av. The officers shined their lights on the windows and 4 females left the building. At 2:10am officers conducted a licensed premise check and spoke with the applicant who was standing in the door way. There were several more people inside that left without incident. The officers checked the bar and found evidence of marijuana being smoked in a back room and a bag of rifle ammunition. The bartender stated it was her birthday and the patrons were her friends who were celebrating with her. The officers counter a total of 22 people inside the bar. The applicant stated he thought the time was 2:00am when the officers arrived and that he had time to have the patrons leave.
- 14. On 04/22/2019 officers received information that Level's on North was having a "Repass" party and there were subjects inside with guns and one of them was wanted. When the officers arrived it appeared the business was open with the open sign illuminated. As they approached the door it was locked by a subject inside. The officers observed people inside running to the back of the bar. After they were let inside they checked for subjects hiding in the basement and upstairs, but did not locate anyone. They did recover two guns in trash cans, one in the kitchen and the other in the men's bathroom. Officers located suspected heroin and cocaine in baggies on the floor of the bar. Officer located suspected marijuana in a back room of the establishment. Officers also located 10 baggies containing heroin in a stairwell leading to upstairs apartments. The kitchen was in full use with brats, ribs and other foods being cooked. The applicant arrived and stated this was a private party and the food being prepared was being provided for free.
- 15. On 08/16/2019 at 1:20am officers were dispatched to a fight at N. 6<sup>th</sup> St and W. North Av. The caller stated a large group of people were fighting in the road and female had a board. The investigation revealed the subjects involved came from Level's on North, 634 W. North Av. The security guard at Levels stated some patrons left the bar and began to fight on the corner of 6<sup>th</sup> and North. He and another security guard ran down to the fight and broke it up. Officers spoke to two victims who stated an argument occurred on the dance floor and left the tavern. One group followed the other to their car and broke the car's window with a board.

16. On 09/03/2019 at 1:40am officers observed people outside of Level's on North and auto double parked on North Av. The officers observed 6 people walk inside the tavern, which has a 1:30am closing time listed on their license. They also observed a Black female approach the bar and attempted to open the door which was locked. Officers observed and employee who is known to them, open the door and allow the female inside. The officers drove around the block and when they returned they observed 10 people on the sidewalk and a bartender telling them to leave the area. One subject had a small liquor bottle in his hand. At 1:49am officers entered the business and found 7 patrons still inside the bar. The applicant was issued a citation for allowing patrons after hours.

- 17. On 11/27/2019 the applicant was cited for Operating while Intoxicated and Intoxicant in Vehicle. On 06/18/2020 the applicant was convicted and his license was revoked for 6 months.
- 18. On 12/31/2019 at 10:50pm officers conducted a license premise check at Level's on North, 634 W. North Av. The officers spoke with the bartender, who stated she has a Class D Operator's license but did not have it on her person. A check revealed the subject was in fact not licensed. The applicant was called and arrived on scene. The officers also observed food being prepared and fryers warmed and ready to cook. The applicant stated he cooks the food but does not sell the food because her does not have a food license. The applicant was cited for Responsible Person on Premise and Food License Required. At 3:09am the officers returned and observed a subject enter the bar and heard the front door being locked after the patron entered. They observed another patron attempt to enter but the door was locked.

  - 19. On 02/02/2020 at 2:11am officers were dispatched to a Shooting at Level's on North, 634 W. North Av. The investigation revealed no one was shot but a subject was observed firing shots in the air outside of the business. Security stated there was a fight inside and the subjects were being escorted out. One of the security guards observed a subject sitting in an auto firing shots in the air. The officers spoke with the applicant, who stated he called the police after hearing the shots in case someone was shot.
  - 20. On 02/22/2020 at 12:42am officers were dispatched to a Shooting at N. 6<sup>th</sup> St and W. North Av. The responding officers observed numerous cars parked in the area. The only

businesses open were Wendy's and Level's on North. The officers spoke with security working at the door for Level's on North. He stated he did not hear any gunshots, or see anyone shot. The officer spoke to the applicant about what the head count of the tavern was. The applicant did not know. The officer then went inside and observed a large crowd. The officer observed numerous patrons coming from an area of the business that was labeled "employees only". When theofficer's checked that area they located a chest freezer in the hallway with a pistol inside. The officers recovered the pistol and inventoried it at the station.

- 21. On 02/25/2020 officers assisted the FBI and IRS serve a search warrant at 634 W. North Av. The officers recovered 2 air pistols, ammo in several different calibers, a digital scale and 9.4 grams of Heroin.
- 22. On 03/22/2020 officers conducted a license premise check at Level's on North, 634 W. North Av, to see if the business was complying with the Safer at Home order. The officers found the business was closed.
- 23. The applicant has 4 warrants with Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office for Failure to Support (warrant #'s: 2020006139, 2020006138, 2020006145, 2020006974).

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24. On 11/25/2020 at 10:30pm an officer conducted a license premise check at Level's on North, 634 W. North Av. The business was closed. The officer checked LIRA and found the business license expired on 11/07/2020.

25. On 10/01/2021 at 10:04pm officers, along with agents from Wisconsin Department of Revenue conducted a license premise check at Level's on North, 634 W. North Av. The agents advised the applicant owed the State back taxes. The applicant was on scene and the establishment was open for business. The DOR agents conducted an inspection and seized the alcohol because the applicant had no invoices and it was purchased from an unknown source. The license posted on the wall was expired but a check of LIRA revealed the liquor license was valid. The DOR agents closed the business and advised the applicant he could not reopen until the taxes were paid and his sellers permit was reinstated.

This report is written by Police Officer Xavier Benitez, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

- 1. On 06/09/23 at 10:01 pm, Milwaukee Police conducted a license premise check at the location of 634 W North Av due to a complaint the business was operating without licenses. Officers observed an Open Sign illuminated, and a known security person standing outside the main door. Patrons were observed sitting at the main bar and consuming alcoholic beverages and there was a female behind the bar. Two subjects in the bar area did not identify themselves and called for the manager. An officer requested business receipts for the liquor on the premise but the manager stated there were no receipts. The manager contacted the new owner/agent Soraida C. Carthran. She stated the business licenses were at her residence and that she does not have receipts for liquor because it came from the previous business. Officers informed her that the licenses should be kept at the business and posted for inspections at all times. Officers asked her to bring the licenses to the location but were preempted to a higher priority assignment. Officers checked LIRA system, and did not locate a valid license. Upon their return the business was closed. Officers noted that prior to the premise check the business had been opened during the hours of 10pm-2:15am on multiple previous weekends.
- 2. On 07/11/23 at 4:25pm Milwaukee Police conducted a business check at 634 W. North Av. The business check was regarding a CPTED, for a class B Tavern License application. On scene for the CPTED was the agent, Soraida Carthran and the manager. After the officer completed the CPTED assignment he inquired about the incident on 06/09/23, were the business was opened

to the public. The agent stated that they were operating with the belief that the previous owner had requested a 2 month extension, and that she was able to operate.

634 W North Av, formally known as AVYBE, which had been a licensed premise in the city of Milwaukee.

Our check came after receiving an anonymous call regarding AVYBE being open and conducting business without any licenses.

Upon our arrival PO TERRELL and I observed the location to have a neon "open" sign on the front door. I observed the location with the main door open and music was heard playing from the inside of the business, before officers entered the main door. PO TERRELL and I spoke with a male subject who was sitting outside of the main door. He did not say he was working at the location, however PO TERRELL and I are familiar with him working security at the location in the past.

PO TERRELL and I entered the business. I observed two patrons sitting at the main bar, which is along the <u>EASTERN wall of the building. I observed each person to have a glass with presumed liquor in front of</u> them. I observed the individuals to be actively drinking from their perspective glasses.

PO TERRELL and I did observe one female subject behind the bar when we entered the location. As PO TERRELL and I approached the bar, a male and a female subject walked out of a back doorway into the bar area to speak with us. I asked them if they were working and or bartending. BOTH female subjects stated they are not bartenders at the location, and one stated she was not working at the location. When asked to provide identification, the two female subjects were uncooperative and stated the manager would speak with us. PO TERRELL then walked behind the bar and requested business receipts regarding liquor purchases.

The male subject who, I was told, was the manager at the location then stated they do not have any receipts at the location. Due to the music volume, he and I walked into a back room at the location to speak without interruption. Once in the rear room, the male subject handed me his cellular phone and stated the owner of the location was on the phone and would like to speak with me.

At that point, I took the phone from the male subject and identified myself. The female subject, who I was speaking with on the phone then identified herself to me, verbally, as **Soraida C CARTHRAN (b/f, 9/8/84)**. CARTHRAN stated she is the new owner of the location and bought the business in May of 2023. She was unable to provide me with an exact date of purchase. I asked CARTHRAN where the business licenses were, in order for me to conduct a check that they were current. CARTHRAN indicated she is the owner and agent of the business. She stated the business had been owned by P & C Investments Limited. She stated she now is the new owner and operates as AVYBE LLC.

Due to CARTHRAN stating the business is licensed and her licenses were with her, I asked her to come to the location with the licenses. I informed her I would check the licenses as well the best I can.

PO TERRELL and I then left the location with the intent of checking the licenses. The subjects who appeared to be working at the location were not identified at that time.

This report is written by PO Stephen COLWELL, assigned to District Five, Early Power Shift, Squad 5266

On Tuesday, July 11th, 2023, at 4:25 PM, I placed myself on a Business Check at 634 W North Ave (A Vybe Bar), located within the City and County of Milwaukee. I conducted this Business Check for the purpose of conducting a CPTED assessment that had been requested by the MPD Licensing Investigations Unit regarding the businesses Class B Tavern license application.

Upon my arrival, I spoke to the licensing agent, who identified herself as Soraida C CARTHRAN (B/F, 9/8/1984). Also on scene was the future manager of the bar/tavern, who identified himself as Marcus A NUELL (B/M, 6/17/1985).

I completed the inspection of the location with the assistance of both CARTHRAN and NUELL. While completing the security assessment, I identified areas in need of improvement. These improvements included additional cameras to include at least one camera that captures a detailed image of anyone entering or exiting the main entrance. Currently, there are no cameras directed towards the main entrance. I also suggested CARTHRAN either improve or replace the entrance door which is a wooden door with existing damage and would be an easy point of entry for anyone attempting to force entry.

After completing the CPTED assessment with CARTHRAN, I inquired about an incident that occurred on 6/9/23 at the location. On 6/9/23, PO Nora BURLO and PO James TERRELL in Squad 5468 were dispatched to the location after receiving a complaint that the business was open to the public and operating without a license. Squad 5468 was able to confirm the location was open and serving beverages to the public. Squad 5468 was preempted to a Priority One assignment prior to concluding their investigation. When Squad 5468 returned to complete their investigation that same night, the location was closed. (See IR: 231610012 for Licensed Premise Report regarding)

CARTHRAN and NUELL stated they were operating under the belief that the previous owner of the business had requested a two-month extension of their Class B Tavern License and that they were able to operate under the previous owner's extended license.





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
