WHEREAS, Dedicating herself to education, Ruby Anita Ballard Young began working as a teacher in Lanett, Alabama, and in a career that spanned decades, went on to work as a supervisor for Negro Schools in Dale County of Ozark, Alabama, a principal in Bisbee, Arizona, a principal in Ecarse and Detroit of Michigan, a case worker for the Milwaukee County Welfare Department, a teacher at Milwaukee's Ninth Street School, and the principal at Milwaukee's Lee Street, Hopkins Street and Allen Field schools, before her retirement in 1976; and

WHEREAS, In her retirement, Ruby Anita Ballard Young traveled Europe, Asia, Africa, the Caribbean, North America and Central America with her three best friends, and also gave generously of her time and talents to her church and her community, doing work for organizations including the NAACP, the Girl Scouts, Delta Kappa Gamma Honor Society, Phi Delta Kappa, Milwaukee Teacher's Education Association, United Negro College Fund, the Milwaukee Urban League Guild, the Northside YMCA, the V.E. Carters Education Center and the Cross Lutheran Church Senior Center; and

WHEREAS, Ruby Anita Ballard Young leaves to cherish her memory her sister Cherrye Janet Trotman; nieces Enid Trotman-Anyanwu, Eunice Francis, Edwina Beanum, Susan Jones and Anita Murrell; nephews Mark Ballard and Eric Jefferson; sister-in-law Velma Ballard; special friends Tabitha Mitcham, Carrie Banty, Juliana Rhoten, Pearlie Gambrelle, Deola Lyles and Shirley Smith and a whole host of other loving friends and family; now, therefore, be it
