Resolution recognizing the 2014 Arbor Day celebration at Eighty-First Street School, 2964 N. 81st St.

WHEREAS,

EIGHTY-FIRST STREET SCHOOL

marked the historic celebration of Arbor Day on April 25, 2014; and

WHEREAS, *Students, teachers, staff, parents, and special guests celebrated Milwaukee's 49th observance of Arbor Day with a special program highlighting the special importance of trees in their world and in their daily lives; and*

WHEREAS, *First observed in Nebraska in 1872, Arbor Day was first an effort to promote re-forestation in areas where logging had left in its wake countless acres of barren forest land, and in Wisconsin Arbor Day was first observed in 1889 for the same reasons; and*

WHEREAS, *In metropolitan areas like Milwaukee, Arbor Day takes on a new significance, where development threatens the loss of trees and green areas that are indispensable to the ecology as providers of oxygen, as filters of the air and as inhibitors of noise; and*

WHEREAS, *Arbor Day offers an ideal opportunity for people of all ages, especially our youth and senior citizens, to take part in organized community projects designed to preserve and improve the environment; and*

WHEREAS, *Through Arbor Day observances like the one at Eighty-First Street School and with continued planting of trees throughout the City of Milwaukee – and by working with students, teachers and administrators of both public and private schools – the community can work together to ensure the preservation of the urban forest and a very valuable natural resource; now, therefore, be it*

RESOLVED, *That the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee herewith recognizes the 2014 Arbor Day celebration at Eighty-First Street School and commends its students, teachers, staff and parents for working to preserve a very valuable natural resource; and, be it*

FURTHER RESOLVED, *That a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution be presented to Eighty-First Street School.*
