Common Council President Perez & members of the Milwaukee Common Council,

Please note my opposition to the presentation of an ordinance regarding any change in zoning at 7930 W Clinton Ave from light industrial to planned development. to allow the building of a type 1 juvenile correction facility.

I have reviewed both the city's comprehensive plan, the Northwest Side Area Plan, the Granville Strategic Action Plan, and the Granville Design Charette (in which I participated), and ordinance 295-907.

In my review of the ordinance I note that the Planned Development districts are intended to do the following:

1. Allow flexibility in land development
2. Promote creativity, variety, and environmental sensitivity
3. Encourage development compatible with its surroundings and consistent with the city's comprehensive plan

I may have missed it, but I didn't see development of any prison in any of the plans and this prison certainly does not meet the ordinance requirements of item 2 or 3.

In addition, DOC operates 4 correctional facilities in the city of Milwaukee and they are all north of I-94. Adding this facility would make it 5. That surely is not in any planned development for the city. Given the decline in the area of 76th & Good Hope, the city should be engaged in development that allows the area to recover from the hits we've taken over the years. The city should be implementing the approved plans and they certainly should not be engaged in approving any major development anywhere in the 9th aldermanic district while we are unrepresented.

Again, please note my opposition.
