



# THOUSANDS OF MILWAUKEE PROPERTIES HAVE HEALTH HAZARDS



While the overall percentage of investor-owned residential properties is just over half, investors own almost two thirds of all the residential properties that need multiple major repairs.

# PROACTIVE RENTAL INSPECTIONS

- Proactive rental inspection programs are a key strategy to alleviate housing quality issues by:
  - reducing the likelihood that renters will be evicted or illegally punished for reporting hazards
  - work cooperatively with building owners to improve housing quality
  - preserve the existing stock of affordable housing by preventing buildings from deteriorating to the point where they can no longer be inhabited or where teardown and replacement of the building makes more economic sense.
  - PRI programs can also be **designed to minimize inequities** that might arise from enforcement actions

Goal: Make it safe, enjoyable, and convenient to walk, bike, take transit, drive or simply experience our streets and public spaces – no matter one's age or ability

1 in 10 MILWAUKEEANS ARE FOOD INSECURE


1 in 4 MILWAUKEE CHILDREN ARE FOOD INSECURE (numbers are even higher for Black and Brown youth)

# FOOD WASTE

LARGEST CONTRIBUTOR TO WISCONSIN LANDFILLS, WITH 1.2 BILLION POUNDS DISCARDED ANNUALLY.

MORE THAN **15.4% OF WASTE** IN THIS REGION COMES FROM FOOD, EXCEEDING THE STATE AVERAGE.
