Dear Mr. and Mrs. Buraczynski:

In response to your letter dated 10/7/07, in which you request an extension to file a suit against the City of Milwaukee, the City cannot grant your request. Per section, 893.80(1g), Wisconsin Statutes, no action on a claim under this section against any defendant fire company, corporation, subdivision or agency nor against any defendant officer, official, agent or employee, may be brought after 6 months from the date of service of the notice of disallowance, and the notice of disallowance shall contain a statement to that effect.

Because this deadline is set by state statute, the City has no legal authority to extend it.
