4	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: In the 6th District,					
5	James C. White, Class B Tavern and Tavern Dance					
6	renewal applications for J & J's Tap at 1727-1733 West					
7	Atkinson Avenue.					
8	MR. COPELAND: Mr. Chair, this item can also					
9	be scheduled on June 1st.					
10	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Can you state your					
11	appearance, please?					
12	MR. TORAN: Sure. Attorney James Toran					
13	appearing on behalf of James C. White, who appears in					
14	person.					
15	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay. Sir, could you					
16	raise your right hand and be sworn in.					
17	(Whereupon James C. White was sworn under					
18	oath.)					
19	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: State your name and					
20	address for the record, please.					
21	MR. WHITE: James C. White, 3618 North 12th					
22	Street.					
23	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: And Alderman McGee is

2	Does your client admit to receiving notice that					
3	there's a possibility the license could be denied					
4	because of the police report and neighborhood					
5	objections?					
6	MR. TORAN: Yes.					
7	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Alderman McGee, any					
8	questions of this person?					
9	ALDERMAN MCGEE: Okay. The question I was					
10	going to ask, the person that you served, was that					
11	from the incident of 3/31?					
12	MS. DAVIS: Yes.					
13	ALDERMAN MCGEE: Of this year?					
14	MS. DAVIS: Yes.					
15	MR. TORAN: And it was an underage police					
16	aide?					
17	MS. DAVIS: Yes.					
18	ALDERMAN MCGEE: In uniform?					
19	MS. DAVIS: No, plainclothes.					
20	ALDERMAN MCGEE: Plainclothes. Okay.					
21	That's all I have to ask.

25	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Five years. And what					

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1	do you do now?
2	MR. JONES: Well, right now I'm doing home
3	remodeling.
4	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: I see. And briefly
5	what is your testimony? What would you like to say?
6	MR. JONES: First of all, I wanted to say
7	that I've been here since 1:30, and I feel like if
8	there was any objections as far as the neighbors
9	complaining, that if it was that important, then they
10	should have made an effort to stay, too.
11	Second of all, I just wanted to say that
12	Mr. White I feel that he runs a clean business. He
13	does a lot to help with people in the community, and I
14	feel like really they have no reason to we really
15	have no reason to be here today.
16	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay. Thank you.
17	Alderman, any questions of this witness?
18	ALDERMAN MCGEE: No.
19	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Okay. Is there anybody

7	close do you live to the premises?					
8	MR. HERRON: Above.					
9	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: A block?					
10	MR. HERRON: Above.					
11	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Oh, above. Okay.					
12	There's more than one apartment above the					
13	MR. HERRON: Five.					
14	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: There's five					
15	apartments. Okay. How long have you lived there?					
16	MR. HERRON: Twelve years.					
17	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Twelve years. Okay.					
18	And you've known this gentleman for all 12 years?					
19	MR. HERRON: I've known him before I moved					
20	there. When I became disabled, he was the one who					
21	gave me a place to live.					
22	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Do you also work for					
23	him?					
24	MR. HERRON: Yes.					
25	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: You're an employee.					

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1	What do you do there?					
2	MR. HERRON: Security, and I'm apprentice					
3	bartender.					
4	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: And give us your					
5	testimony. Why are you here in support?					
6	MR. HERRON: Basically the same thing. I					
7	don't understand. The problem on Atkinson is not at					
8	J & J Tap, it's across the street. There's a lot of					
9	drug activity, and I mean the police are aware of it.					
10	They stand out there all the time. There's nobody					
11	loitering in front of the tavern. I make sure of					
12	that.					
13	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Alderman, questions of					
14	this witness?					
15	ALDERMAN MCGEE: No. I was going to ask					
16	what establishment in particular is across the street.					
17	MR. HERRON: There's a four-unit apartment					
18	building, 1720 and 1730, and it just recently had a					
19	homicide in one of them.					
20	ALDERMAN MCGEE: I was also going to ask					
21	you, how long have you stayed upstairs?					
22	MR. HERRON: About 12 years.					
23	ALDERMAN MCGEE: Twelve years.					
24	MR. HERRON: So I'm really aware of					
25	everything that goes on around there.					

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1	ALDERMAN MCGEE: Okay. Has anybody ever					
2	died in that establishment in the 12 years you've been					
3	there?					
4	MR. HERRON: No.					
5	ALDERMAN MCGEE: Okay. That's all I have to					
6	ask.					
7	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Questions by committee?					
8	Mr. Schrimpf?					
9	MR. SCHRIMPF: Nothing.					
10	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Thank you very much.					
11	Anyone else here to testify? We made it to four.					
12	Okay. Please raise your right hand for us.
