Dear Ald. Bauman,

I'm beginning to sound like a broken record, but the problem of the excessive noise in our neighborhood from the party room at the Astor Hotel has again begun making us dread weekends in our own home.

Saturday, May 23, we had to call the Astor twice to ask them to close the fire exit doors located in the party/events room on Marshall St. near Juneau Ave. because of the loud music. The employee at the front desk of the hotel was uncooperative and didn't want to help with this simple temporary solution to the problem; he just kept giving excuses that it wasn't the hotel's problem. When we can understand the music's lyrics from across the street and half a block away, I think that's a bit much. We can't even have our windows open as the weather gets warmer.

I would call the police, but the chances of them showing up for a noise ordinance violation would, sadly, probably not happen. And I would much prefer the changes take place within the

Astor Hotel organization, but they just don't seem to care about their neighbors or the residents living in their building (I have friends living at the Astor who have also complained about the loud bands and/or DJs). If they can't keep the noise level down (and sometimes parties drinking on the street), maybe they should not be booking these types of events.

Hopefully you can help alleviate this problem. Again thank you for taking the time to address it.

On Friday the music was so loud that they couldn't hear their phone ring when I called to complain. Last night (this morning at 2AM) when I called the man answering the phone basically told me they were here before the "f@!&ing" condo and he could care less and I should call the police if I wanted. Besides the loud music it is not unusual to have large groups of people outside the pub smoking, talking, and screaming, especially at closing time. All I am asking is that the Pub be a good neighbor, turn their music down and remind their patrons as they leave that this is a residential neighborhood. I don't think that is asking much. I used to live around Wrigley Field and the bars there take their responsibilities very serious. If they get too many complaints like mine they could lose their liquor license.

I discussed the tavern's procedures to prevent these ordinances from being violated. I then offered WILLS time to ask questions related to these ordinances or any other issues

This report is written by Police Officer Donald Krenzien, assigned District One, Late Power Shift.

On the evening of Thursday, February 26, 2015 through the morning of Friday, February 27, 2015 District One personnel performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative. The officer's who participated in the operation were Police Officer Christopher Martin, assigned to District One, Police Officer Dorian Andress assigned to District 3, and myself. For the underage persons in this initiative we used one MPD police aide who works in the Police Administration Building. Police Aid Teresa Westfahl assigned to the Police Academy. Westfahl was confirmed to be underage by her Wisconsin identification card (2/17/1996)

Prior to attempting any checks of licensed class B tavern establishments the police aide and plain clothed police officer were given instructions. Westfahl and Andress were told that they were not allowed to consume any intoxicating beverages. They could not lie if asked if they were underage, or show any form of documentation, which could be construed as identification. It was explained that they had to order an alcoholic beverage, directly from a bartender behind a bar, then meet the plainclothes officer observing them with the alcoholic beverage for a photo in the tavern and then leave together. It was explained that at all times the plainclothes officer shadowing them would be in visual sight and observe the financial transaction for alcoholic beverages.

After this briefing Martin and I escorted P.O. Andress who was in plainclothes and P.A. Westfahl to multiple taverns located throughout the District One boundaries.

Westfahl and Andress attempted to gained entry to the class "B" licensed tavern, The Loaded Slate located at 1137 N. Old World Third St. Westfahl and Andress was challenged at the point of entry and turned away when Westfahl couldn't prove she was of age.

I informed Joshua Kuntz that they passed.

This narrative was written by PO Lawson MURRELL, assigned to District 1, early shift. On Saturday, 06/28/2014, at 10:52 pm, while assigned to Squad 1240, I responded to an injured/sick complaint at the "Loaded Slate" bar, located at 1137 N. Old World 3rd St., Milwaukee, WI., 53203. Upon arrival at the location I observed a middle aged white male, lying in the street, outside of the bar. The male was identified to me as Robert J. JOEPECK (M/W, 04-17-52), by his son, Matthew J. JOEPECK (M/W, 09-02-86) who was also on scene. With the help of his son, Matthew, I was able to help Mr. JOEPECK up and assist him to a seat outside of the bar. Mr. JOEPECK smelled of alcohol and was unable to walk without assistance but was able to answer basic questions. JOEPECK (with the help of his son) stated he attended a Brewers game at Miller park before "bar-hopping" in the area. JOEPECK stated he and his son had settled at the "Loaded Slate" and had "a few drinks". The bartender at the "Loaded Slate", Jacob T. WOOD (M/W, 08/11/88) stated he had served Mr. JOEPECK "a couple" of drinks that night but insisted he seemed fine. WOOD stated JOEPECK was "in a good mood" and was talking to him about his recent retirement. WOOD stated JOEPECK then ordered "shots" for several patrons to celebrate his retirement. WOOD stated after drinking the shot (he did not remember what the shot was) JOEPECK stood up and fell down. WOOD stated he called a cab for JOEPECK. JOEPECK and his son entered the cab and left the bar. WOOD stated about 10 minutes later, the cab returned and ordered the JOEPECKS out of the cab, stating they had no money. At that point the elder JOEPECK laid down in the street and refused to move. WOOD then called for an ambulance. Bell 412 responded and conveyed JOEPECK to Mt. Sinai hospital. Sq. 1411, Sgt. ACKLEY, also responded. Based on JOEPECK's state when police arrived, it was determined that JOEPECK was (likely) overserved at the "Loaded Slate". This report is in regard to that. The owner of the bar was not on scene at the time of the incident. I have attempted to contact the owner via telephone. No contact has been made as of the time of this report.

On the evening of Saturday May 3rd, 2014 through the morning of Sunday May 4th, 2014 District One personnel performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative. The officers who participated in the operation were officers Robert FERRELL, District One, Power Shift, Jennifer RAMOS, District One, Late Shift, Anthony KRUEGER, District One, Early Shift, and myself. For the underage persons in this initiative we used two MPD police aides who work in the Police Administration Building. They were P.A. Paige CARLONI, W/F 12-15-93, Sensitive Crimes Day Shift, and P.A. Kourtney HARTL, W/F 06-18-94, Central Booking Day Shift.

Prior to attempting any checks of licensed class B tavern establishments the police aides were given instructions. CARLONI and HARTL were told that they were not allowed to consume any intoxicating beverages. They could not lie if asked if they were underage, or show any form of documentation, which could be construed as identification. It was explained that they had to order a Miller Lite Beer, directly from a bartender behind a bar, then meet the plainclothes officer observing them with the alcoholic beverage for a photo in the tavern and then leave together. It was explained that at all times the plainclothes officer shadowing them would be in visual sight and observe the financial transaction for alcoholic beverages.

After this briefing I escorted P.O. Anthony Krueger who was in plainclothes and P.A. HARTL. While P.O. FERRELL escorted P.O. RAMOS in plainclothes, and P.A. CARLONI to multiple taverns located throughout the District One boundaries.

P.A. CARLONI attempted to gain entry to the class "B" licensed tavern Rosie's Waterworks, 1111 N. Water St. P.A. CARLONI was challenged at the point of entry and turned away when she couldn't prove she was of age.

Since there was no violation this tavern was not notified that this PA-33 was filed.

Interview of Ryan A. Goebel

Goebel stated that he is a bartender at Buffalo Wild Wings at 1123 N. Water St. and he went to Rosie's Waterworks at 1123 N. Water St. to drink. Goebel then stated while he was at the bar drinking he made some comments to the person next to him on how cheap he was for not leaving a tip for his bar tab. Goebel stated he made these comments about thirty minutes before he was struck. Goebel then stated he was in the hallway by the bathrooms where someone struck him in the back of the head with a glass and went to the ground. Goebel stated that he then lost consciousness and when he came to he was bleeding from the mouth. Goebel stated that a bouncer from the bar approached him and asked if he needed an ambulance called. Goebel stated that he could not afford it and his two friends took him to Mt. Sinai Hospital. Goebel then stated he was admitted into the hospital at about 2:00 A.M. and was treated by Dr. Ann Y. Lagerlund for a lip laceration and sprain of the right hand. Goebel also stated that he had a broken bridge of the top mouth that consisted of an area of three teeth. Goebel stated that his friends did not witness the incident. Goebel also stated that his mother went to Rosie's earlier and asked to see video and was told that there was no camera in the area he was assaulted at. End interview.

I then took eight digital photographs of Goebel's injuries at his place of residence.

I then changed locations to Rosie's Waterworks at 1111 N. Water St. I was unable to locate the licensee at this time.

Overall I took thirteen digital photographs, please see PP-45 CD-R for detailed description of the photographs.

On 10/06/14, at about 6:53 P.M. I made contact via phone to the licensee, James P. Pack, 08/12/68, who stated that Goebel has been in his bar before and when he starts drinking he can be a "mean drunk." Pack stated that the night of the incident Goebel was talked to numerous times by staff due to him aggressive towards females inside the bar. Pack stated that he did not witness the incident and saw him laying on the ground, with his friends around him. Pack had his staff see if he needed an ambulance and Goebel stated now and left out the rear of the bar with his friends. Pack stated that the other party involved ran out the front door. Pack stated that video could be reviewed and downloaded on Thursday or anyday after. On 10/11/14 Squad 1920 responded to retrieve video and was unable to. F.I. Robbie Lloyd later reponded to retrieve video and stated that he was unable to.

I arranged to meet with him at his tavern at 21:15p.m., to recover the video.

In the video AVILES is seen wearing the clothes he was arrested in, a black hooded sweatshirt, with a white tank top underneath. During the course of the video AVILES removes his hooded sweatshirt and is seen only in his white tank top, which clearly shows the tattoo on his arms which witnesses recalled. AVILES, was also seen removing victims property from her purse. The quality of video provided by PACK, aided in the prosecution of AVILES for the theft. PACK helping investigating officers took time to find and mark the relevant video and have it ready for pick up at the time arranged with officers.





On Tuesday, May 27, 2014, while assigned to Squad 2741 with P.O. Penny BROWN, we received information that Golden Mid Town Foods located at 801 N. 27th St. was selling single cigarettes to minors. At about 2:15 PM, we conducted a licensed premise inspection at the store.

Upon arrival, the employees were identified as Nirmal SINGH, A/M, 05-24-61, and Taranjit KAUR, A/F, 05-03-73, of N53 W15766 Whispering Way, Menomonee Falls, WI. KAUR was behind the cash register. SINGH and KAUR both had valid class D Operator's licenses. During the inspection, P.O. BROWN located an open pack of Newport cigarettes and open five packs of cigars behind the cash register. SINGH and KAUR did not have a reasonable explanation for the open pack of cigarettes. SINGH apologized for the open packs of tobacco and said he did not know he could not sell as individual cigars. I asked SINGH if they check identification when customers purchase cigarettes or beer from the business. SINGH stated they have a sign posted and check for identification. I advised SINGH they can not sell individual cigarettes. I also advised SINGH they can purchase individual cigars for sale, but can not open packs. The licensee/agent for the business was Jaswinder SINGH, A/M, 03-02-58. The licenses were posted in the business.
