Later, the MPD decided not to issue criminal charges against the officers. Attached is a copy of the clearance report and an itemization of the time and services rendered.

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INVESTIGATIVE NARRATIVE:

This report is being dictated by Detective Michael CARLSON, of the Crimina Investigation Unit/Internal Affairs Division (CIU/IAD), day shift.

On Monday, April 9, 2001 at approximately 7:33am the complainant contacte the Milwaukee Police Department regarding a battery complaint. The complainan alleged that this occurred on Sunday, April 8, 2001 at approximately 6:15pm in th booking room at District #2, 245 W. Lincoln Avenue. The complainant further state that he did not experience any pain when the alleged battery initially occurre but that at approximately 7:00am the next day, after sleeping in a vacant garag overnight, he did wake up with pain in the side of his rib. He states that h attributed this pain to allegedly being kneed in the ribs by an unknown Milwauke police officer.

Investigation revealed that the complainant was arrested on April 8, 2001 fo a loitering city citation and was conveyed to District #2. Upon arriving a District #2 he was placed in the booking room with two other prisoners who sat o either side of him. The complainant allegedly was intoxicated, stood up, state he was a Marine, and then was placed back down on the booking bench by Office HERNANDEZ. The complainant then received a citation from the arresting office and was released from District #2. During the time he was at District #2 until he was released he made no complaint of any mistreatment. Two non police witnesses to this offense one sitting on either side of the complainant gave contradicting statements as to what had occurred on that date.

On April 9, 2001 the complainant was interviewed by myself and at that time he informed me that he was homeless and had been living in vacant garages. He further informed me that after leaving District #2 on April 8, 2001 he did consume 12 cans of beer and slept in a vacant garage overnight and experienced the pair to his ribs when he woke in the morning. The subject was given a business car with my name and number on it and I instructed him to keep in touch with me due to the fact that I had no way of getting a hold of him. As of this date, May 14, 2001, I have had no contact from the complainant and do not know his whereabouts.
