#### **ADDITIONAL COMMENTS/RECOMMENDATIONS:**


CPTED was not conducted due to the unsafety and issues as follow:

- The facility has no water or electricity. Flashlights were not enough to illuminate the area.
- Electric wires and plumbing pipes appeared to be tempered. The electric wire was cut off from the fuse board. Plumbing pipes appeared not to be intact.
- The interior of the facility was trashy and big bulk items were obstructing pathways to conduct a walkthrough in the facility.
- Air quality was poor, with strong odor from inside the facility. Smelled like mold with a mixture of other smells.

The hearing before the Licenses Committee will take place on 12/2/2025 at 2:25 PM in Room 301-B, Third Floor, City Hall. This is a public hearing. Those wishing to view the proceeding are able to do so via the City Channel – Channel 25 on Spectrum Cable – or on the Internet at http://city.milwaukee.gov/citychannel. Those wishing to provide oral testimony via internet are asked to contact the staff assistant, Yadira Melendez at (414) 286-2775 or stasst5@milwaukee.gov for necessary information. Please make such requests no later than one business day prior to the start of the meeting. You are not required to attend the hearing, but please see the information below if you would like to provide testimony. Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing.

# Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.

Please include this letter in the pending application file for Teutonia Express Liquor Inc., 3833 N Teutonia Ave, Milwaukee, WI 53206, and ensure it is forwarded to the Licenses Committee for their review and consideration prior to the next scheduled license committee hearing on November 11, 2025.

On Tuesday, October 21, 2025, Mr. Navpreet Manhani, agent for Teutonia Express Liquor Inc., appeared with counsel for a scheduled hearing before the License Committee seeking the approval of its Class A Malt & Class A Liquor, Food Dealer and Weights & Measures License Application. Unfortunately, despite Mr. Manhani's attempts to speak with the Alderwoman prior to the October 21st hearing, the Alderwoman's office was unable to facilitate a meeting. At the hearing, Alderwoman Coggs' office requested the matter be held for the opportunity to speak with the applicant regarding its application. Additionally, several members of the committee took issue with the City of Milwaukee Police Department 90-5-1.5 Crime Prevention Survey completed by PO Romo and PO Nelson on September 19, 2025 ("CPS").

A brief history on the property may shed some light on the contents of the CPS. Mr. Manhani built this building in 2009 and operated the liquor store known as Express Liquor from 2010 through 2019. He then sold the location to pursue other ventures.

After learning that the building underwent a foreclosure, Mr. Manhani purchased the building and intends to reopen the location as Express Liquor again under his ownership. Upon taking possession of the property in late August 2025, he discovered that the property had been vandalized. Most of the vandalism is detailed by MPD in the CPS.

Of note, the electric panel had been damaged, the wiring was stripped, and there was mold build-up in the basement. In addition, the existing security camera system was stolen.

In order to get the property back to operational standards for a liquor store, Mr. Manhani will need to spend approximately \$125,000-\$150,000. As this is no small amount, Mr. Manhani has applied to the City of Milwaukee for his Class A liquor license to ensure that his investment will not be for naught. If he cannot obtain a liquor license to operate this location as a liquor store, he will need to find an appropriate tenant for the location and then improve the building in accordance with the type of tenant he obtains, and the expenses will be carried by the tenant.

This is not uncommon with single-tenant commercial buildings, and is particularly not uncommon in the City of Milwaukee where licenses are often granted while properties are under construction and prior to occupancy. However, in this situation, Mr. Manhani is being treated differently.

Mr. Manhani has submitted a detailed floor plan and plan of operation with his application. The floor plan and plan of operation outline his plans for the building and how he intends to surveil and maintain the premises in good order.

On Thursday, October 30, 2025, Mr. Manhani, along with counsel, met with Alderwoman Coggs to discuss the application. Alderwoman Coggs has requested that the applicant submit a letter detailing the steps he will be taking prior to occupancy to address some of the issues raised in the CPS. As such, the applicant is submitting this letter in satisfaction of that request.

The plan of operation indicates that there will be 32 security cameras on site, at least 6 of which will be exterior cameras. The system is a high-quality system which my client also uses at his Liquor Outlet store on N Lovers Lane Rd. The system is



reliable and provides real-time security footage with recording capabilities. In addition to the updated security system that Mr. Manhani will be installing, he will be spending approximately \$100,000 on the following:

- Repair electric panel to functioning state and rewire existing electrical to repair any existing damage
- 2. Mold remediation of the basement through hired mold specialist
- 3. New paint, flooring, and shelving
- 4. Restoration of plumbing system

Mr. Manhani also intends to deter crime and improve safety through several design factors, including:

- 1. The cash register will be enclosed by a bullet-proof glass partition and highvalue liquor will be stored behind the partition for cashier access only prior to purchase.
- 2. Signage will not block exterior view into the interior of the building, to permit police officers to see inside the location.
- 3. Internal lighting will ensure that all areas of the store are properly illuminated to provide for clear surveillance footage.
- 4. Exterior lighting will be updated to enhance visibility around the building, but not as to negatively impact neighboring residences.
- 5. No loitering signs will be affixed to the exterior of the building.

In addition, though he previously participated in the city's robbery prevention training a few years ago, he has contacted MPD's Robbery Deterrence Training program and will be completing this program at the next available session. Mr. Manhani does not anticipate concerns surrounding loitering and other nuisance type activity, due to the increased presence of security cameras and lighting, in addition to the way he operates his business. However, if loitering does become an issue, then Mr. Manhani will be a standing complainant regarding loitering and will submit the proper documentation to MPD to initiate his property in such anti-loitering program. All employees working at the location will have the ability to provide MPD with access to surveillance footage upon request.

Milwaukee City Ordinance 90-5-1.5 indicates that prior to the scheduling of the licensing committee hearing the police department shall meet in person with the applicant to review the floor plan and plan of operation and conduct the CPTED



survey. Mr. Manhani did meet with MPD on September 19, 2025 to review the floor plan, plan of operation and conduct the CPTED survey. Enclosed with this letter is an email correspondence with District 5 PO Letteer confirming that the CPTED was completed. The email contains no objection from MPD as to my client opening – in fact, PO Letteer indicates that once my client is ready to open for business, MPD would be willing to conduct another CPTED for any license *renewals*.

Mr. Manhani will schedule a second CPTED to be performed prior to opening for business once all improvements have been completed for the property; however, this secondary CPTED is not legally required as condition of licensing approval.

This letter may be construed as an amendment to the applicant's plan of operation. Alternatively, my client will agree at the licenses committee hearing to amend its plan of operation consistent with this letter.


