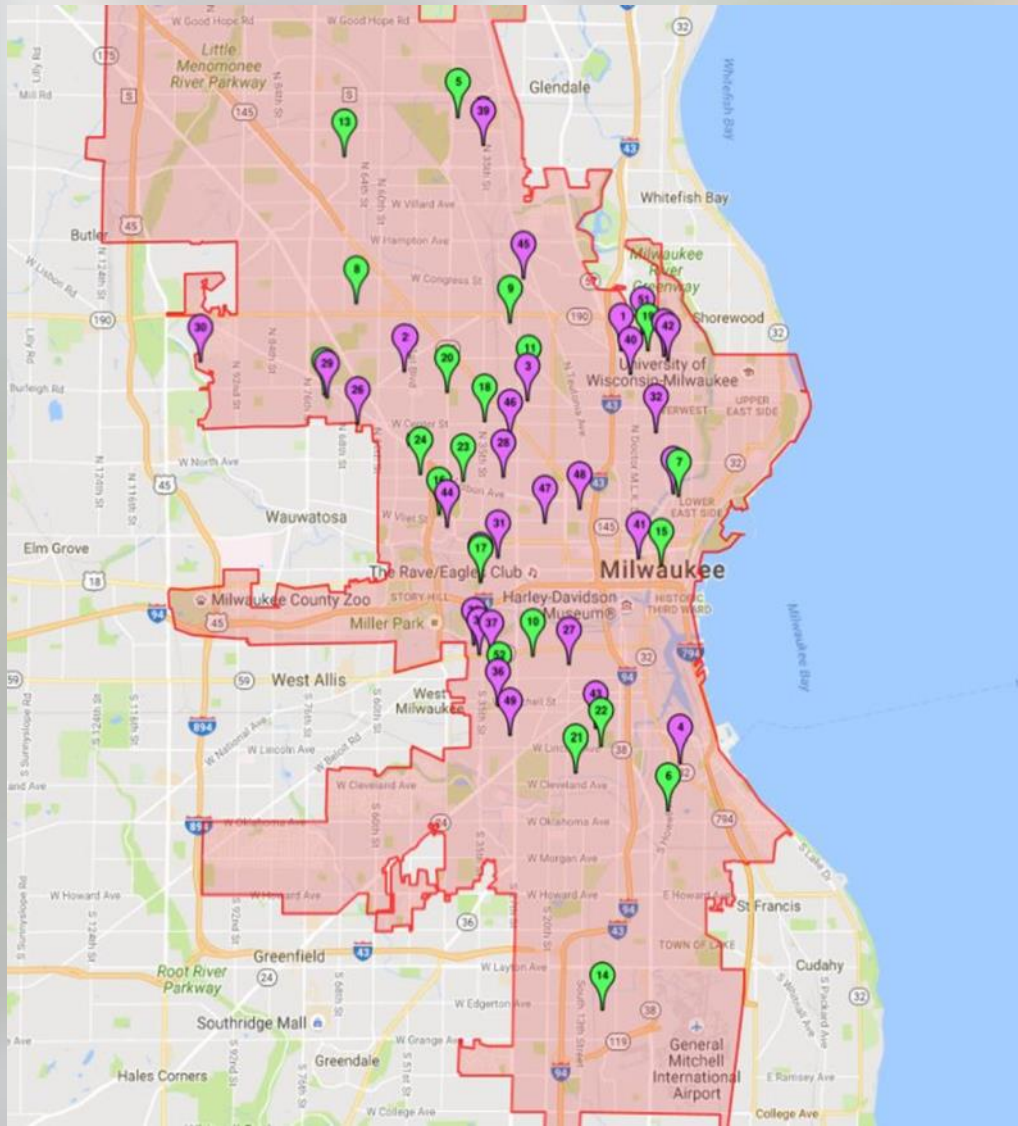


NIDC RESOURCES

- **Common Council allocated funds to NIDC for implementation of Healthy Neighborhoods CIPs and Citywide CIPs:**
- **45 projects were approved in 2016 for over \$96,000 leveraging more than \$130,000***
- **Funding is available to operate the program at the same level in 2017**

*Enderis Park Playground Project, created additional \$196,000 of leverage

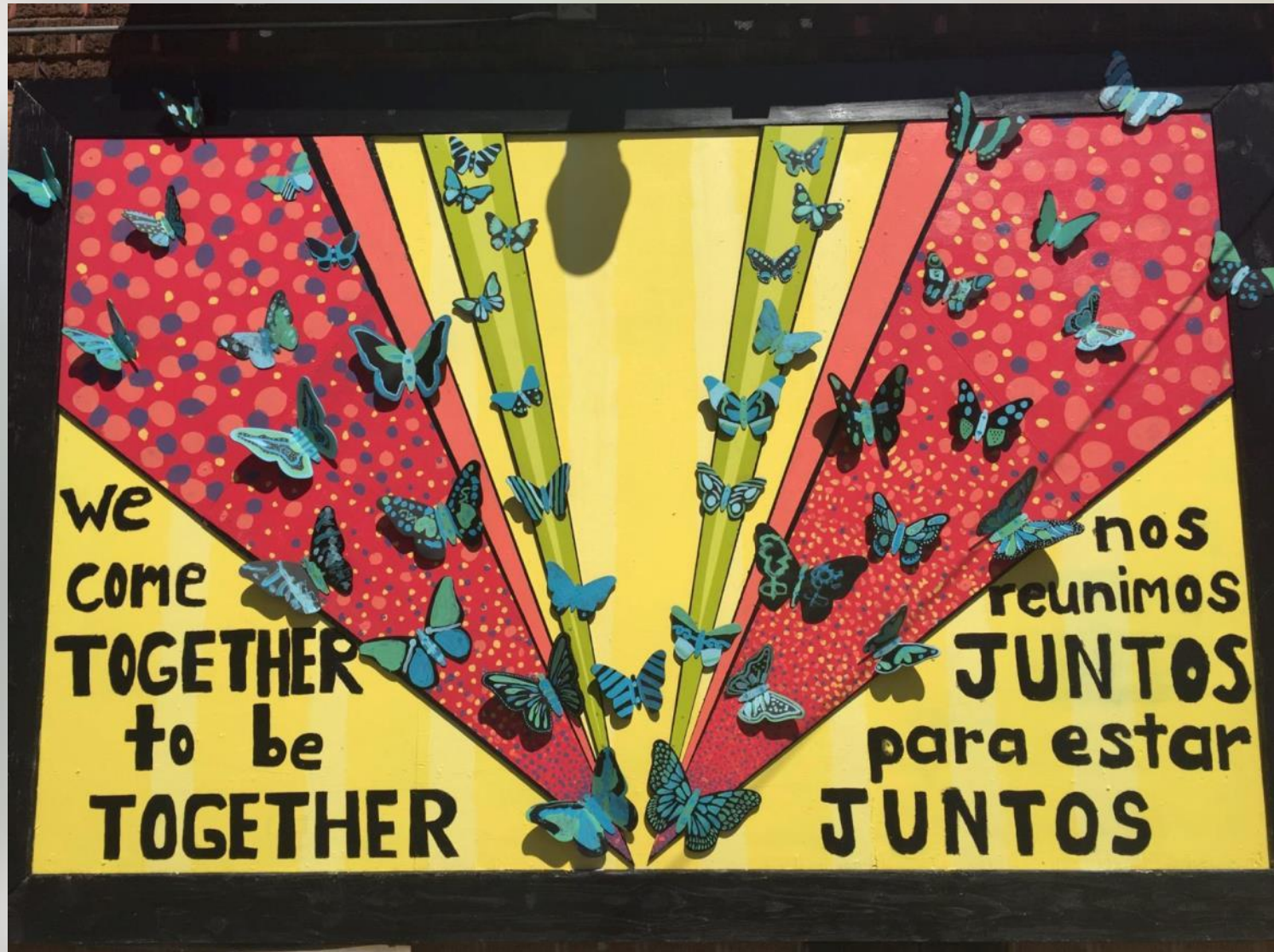
