Among many reasons for increasing Wisconsin's minimum wage for the first time since 1997, I speak to the integrity of the Common Council itself, of which I was a member for all those years. Wisconsin legislator's annual pay rose 16.2% compared to a 12.7% rate of inflation for that period. During the same period Milwaukee alder's pay rose 25.4%.

That was on my watch, I voted for it, I accepted it, and I think it was justified. A living wage freed me and all of us concentrate on the work of the city, and not on our own survival. An increase in the statewide minimum wage will be a small step toward guaranteeing others have the same freedom we enjoy.
