I am a current Milwaukee resident, born and raised. I hold a bachelors degree in science nursing and have worked in healthcare for 16 out of my 32 years of life. One of the four principles of ethics that guide nurses in their practice is nonmaleficence. This means to “do no harm”. I believe that adding a data center in Milwaukee would cause extreme harm to city and its residents. I cannot support this as a Milwaukee resident. Data centers are known to increase air pollution, noise pollution, water pollution, increase water bills and electric bills for residents, and increase health disparities. Data centers immensely consume energy, causing strain on local grids. They require large amounts of water consumption for cooling. This is often drinking water that gets heavily polluted with PFAS (forever chemicals that cannot be removed from the water). Routine use of on-site gas turbines a diesel backups emit NOx and fine particles, which are linked to asthma and cardiovascular disease. As a nurse, it is upsetting to me to see data centers on the rise, especially in heavily populated areas when we already can see the negative effects they are having on people and the environment. I heavily encourage you to do your research before allowing a data center to be this close to your own home. Please do not allow this data processing center to be built.
