There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. It is the intention of the Common Council to suspend or non-renew the licenses if objectors provide testimony related to the factors enumerated in MCO 85-4-4 that the Common Council finds to be true by a preponderance of the evidence and/or police reports are found to be true by a preponderance of the evidence. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. This report is written by Police Officer Penny Monreal, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

- 1. On 03/17/24 at 1:30a.m., Milwaukee Police were assigned to Code Red, when they heard Shots fired in the area of 1213 N. Water St. Officers proceeded to the alley and observed multiple subjects fighting. A subject involved was ordered out of a vehicle, where a firearm was recovered. Two casings were recovered near the vehicle and the subject was subsequently arrested. Investigation revealed subjects were escorted out of 154 E Juneau for a physical altercation in the business, when it continued in the alley.
- 2. On 08/17/24 at 11:23p.m., Milwaukee Police observed a fight in front of 154 E. Juneau. Officers separated the parties and issued a citation to one of the subjects. The fight took place outside of the bar and it was undetermined if the subjects were inside the bar earlier.

#### LICENSED PREMISE REPORT

This report is written by P.O. Jason CHADWICK, assigned to District 1, Late Power Shift, Squad 1421.

On Sunday, March 17th, 2024, at approximately 1:30 am, I, P.O. CHADWICK was assigned to Code Red at N Water St and E Juneau Ave.

P.O. CARLETON stated he was standing in front of Brothers Bar and Grill (1213 N Water St, City and County of Milwaukee) when he heard two shots fired from the west of his location.

P.O. CARLETON stated he walked through a parking lot to the north of Red Rock and then west to the alley. P.O. CARLETON stated he then walked south through the alley. P.O. CARLETON stated he observed multiple subjects fighting in the alley.

As P.O. CARLETON was walking south through the alley, Sgt Marlin SCHILCHER was walking north through the alley. Sgt SCHILCHER stated he observed multiple subjects causing a disturbance, and then observed them get into a 2016, White, Dodge, Journey. Sgt SCHILCHER stated all occupants of the vehicle were removed and arrested.

A white male subject was seated in the front passenger seat and was ordered out of the vehicle. While CUSTER was exiting the vehicle I observed the butt of a firearm in the front left pants pocket of the subject.

The firearm was removed from the white male subjects front left pants pocket by Sgt SCHILCHER, after Sgt SCHILCHER removed the firearm from CUSTER, I took possession of it and placed it in the trunk of my squad car.

A canvas of the alley revealed there were two casings located in the immediate area of where the white male subject was observed on surveillance video firing the shots.

Surveillance video was recovered from Brothers Bar and Grill and placed on Evidence.com, I reviewed the surveillance video and observed the following:

At 1:25:29 am I observed the White, Dodge, Journey, in the alley, to the south of the vehicle there is a large group of subjects engaged in a verbal and physical altercation.

At 1:26:00 am two black females begin to physically fight at the rear of the White, Dodge, Journey. The fight continues from 1:26:00 to 1:28:56 am, until a white male subject is observed with a handgun.

CUSTER then aims the firearm over his head and fires two shots, this occurred without consent.

All the females' parties involved in this incident were escorted out of Scooters Pub by the Milwaukee Police Department. The females were actively engaged in a physical altercation, and they continued to fight after being removed.



Those wishing to provide oral testimony via internet are asked to contact the staff assistant, Yadira Melendez at (414) 286-2775 or stasst5@milwaukee.gov for necessary information. Please make such requests no later than one business day prior to the start of the meeting. You are not required to attend the hearing, but please see the information below if you would like to provide testimony. Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing.

# Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.
