

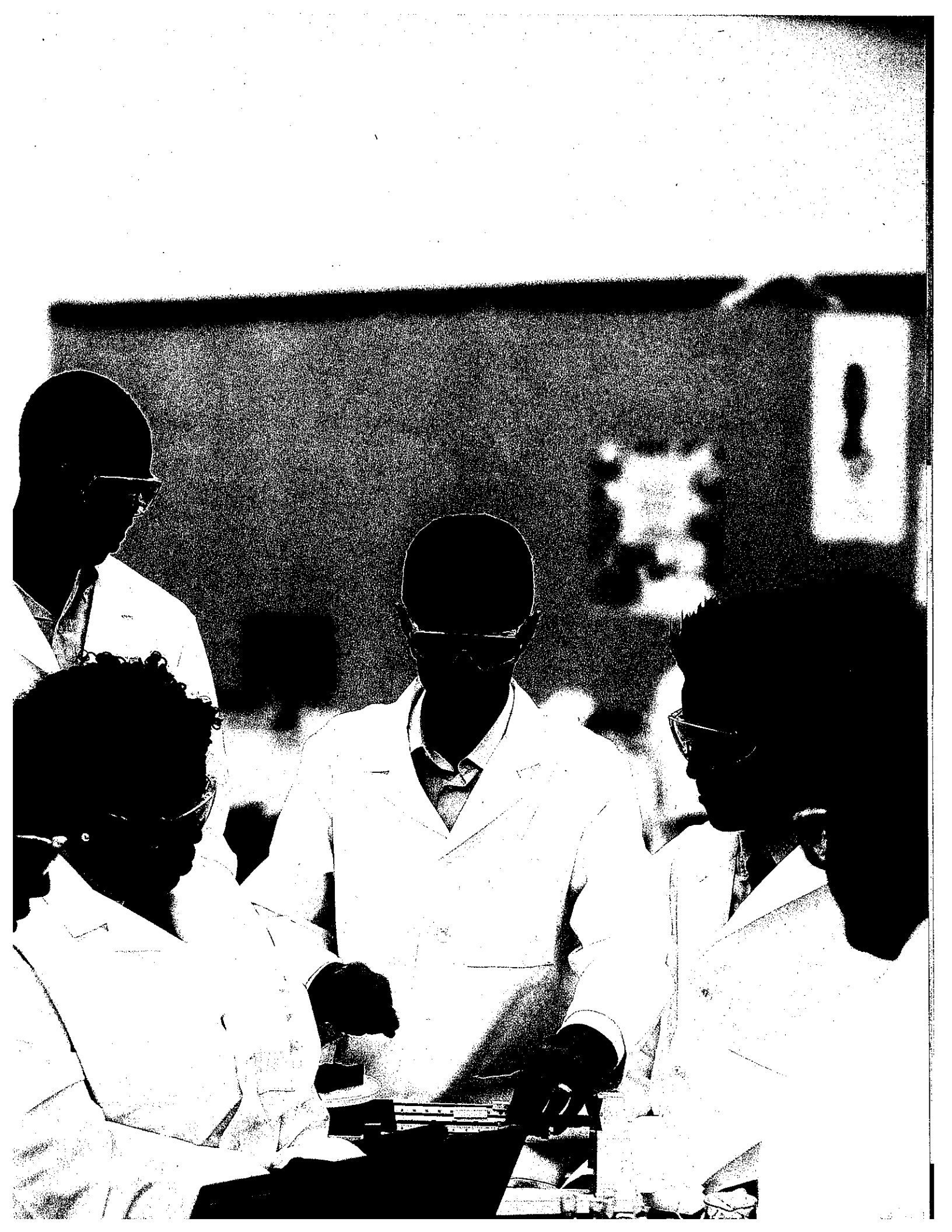

Concept's school design is a comprehensive one. It is student-centered and evidence-based. We are proud of the results, and we believe they speak for themselves.

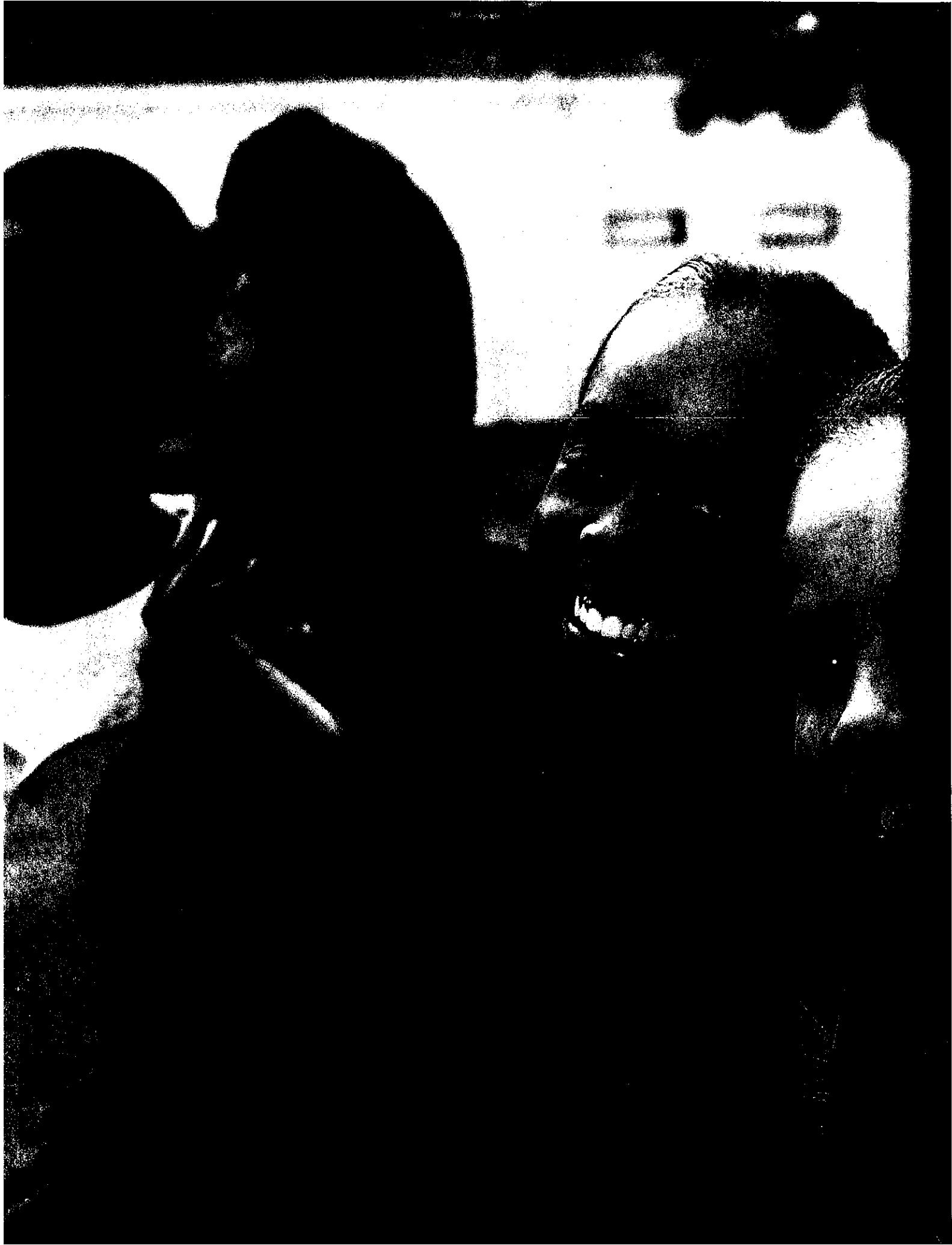

STEM FOCUS

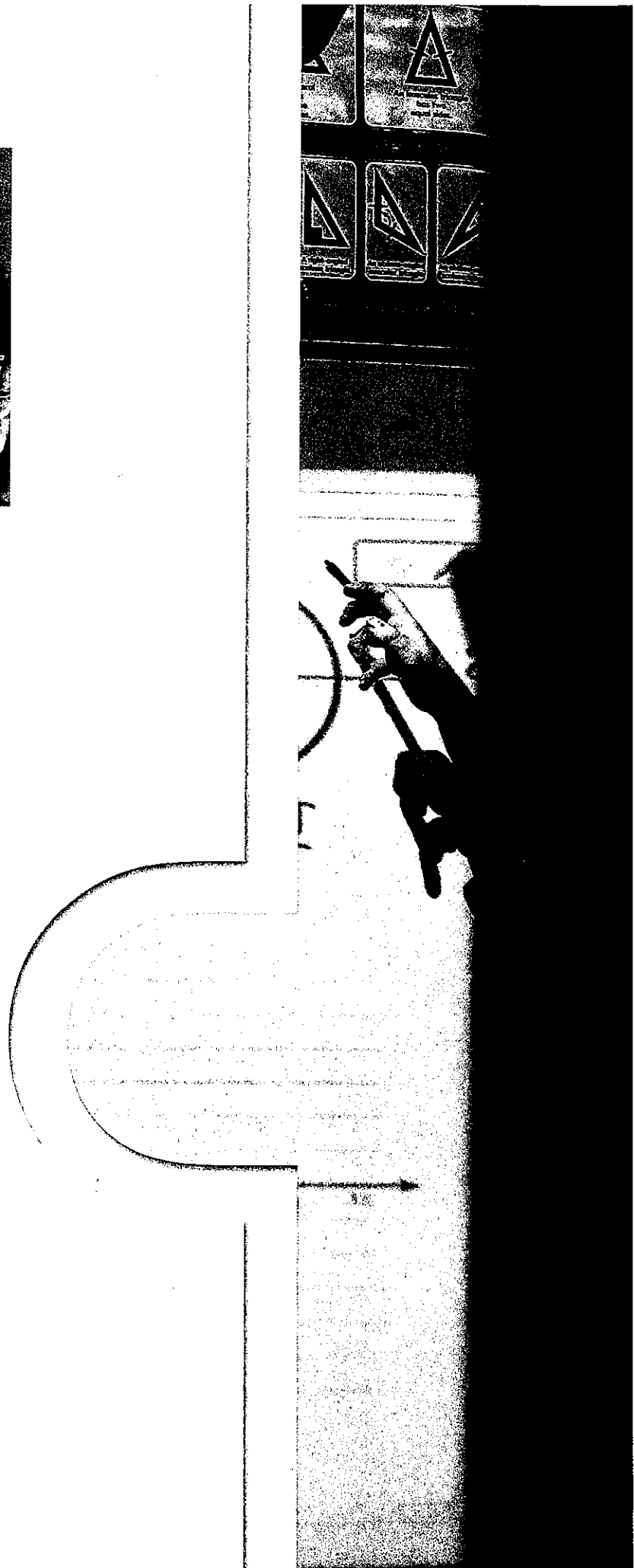

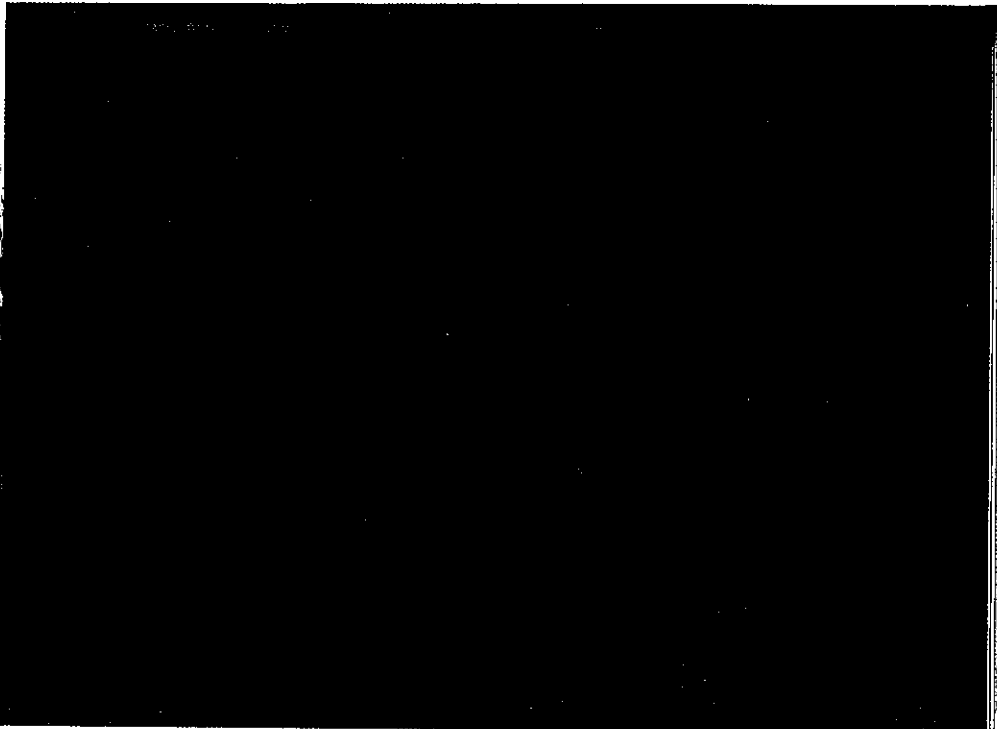
HOME VISITS

Your organization's international trips are a great way to build relationships with other organizations and to learn from their experiences. These trips can be a valuable learning experience for your staff and volunteers.



CONCEPT SPELLING BEE

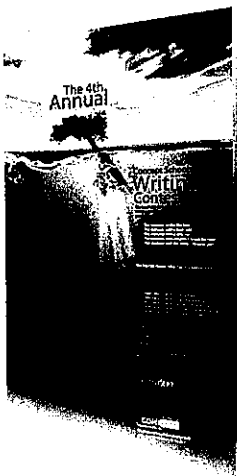

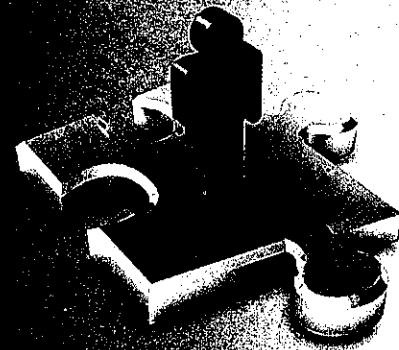
School Visits And Evaluations

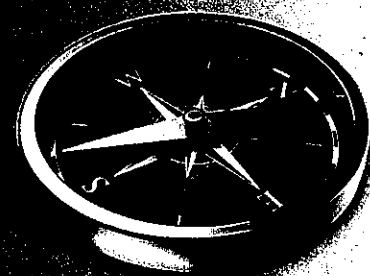
Student Information System

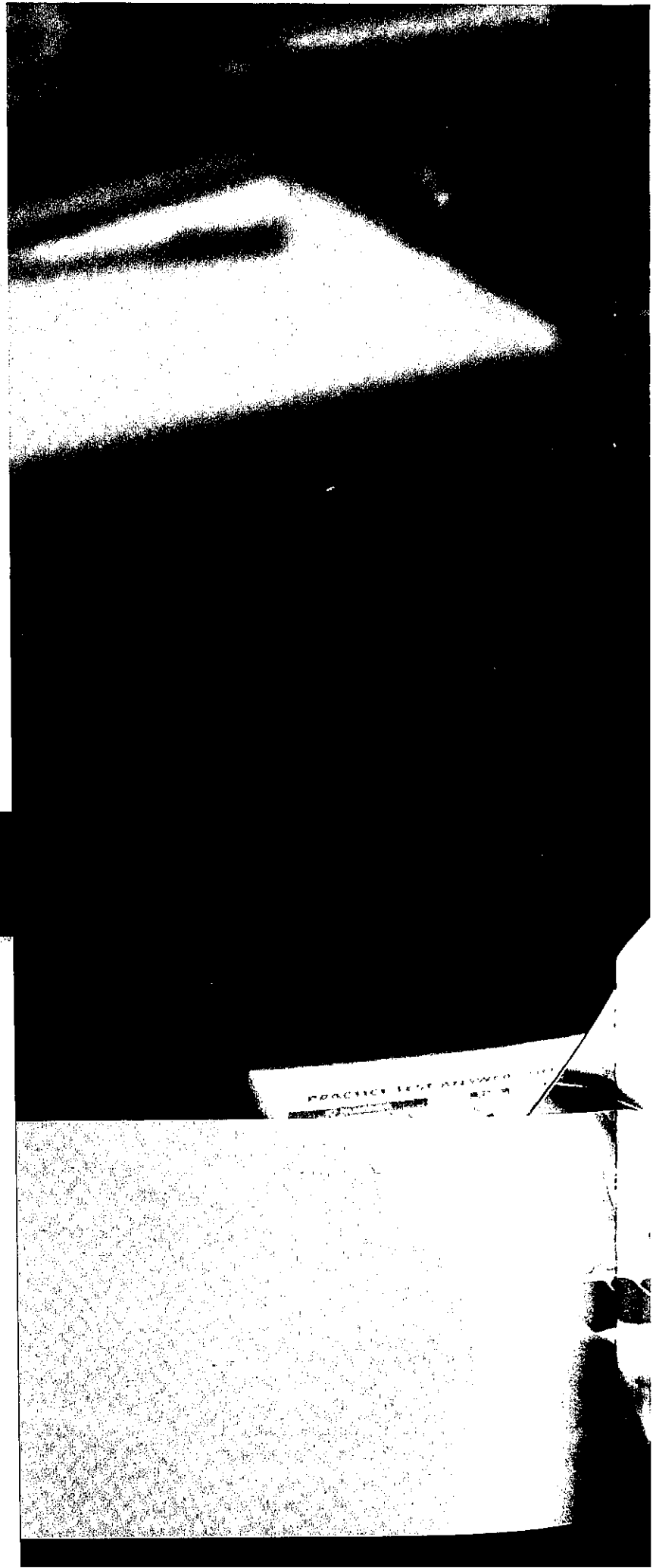

ONGOING ASSESSMENT OF LEARNING

It is critical to know what's working in our classrooms, but more importantly, what needs to be changed. Student learning at Concept is assessed and monitored on an ongoing basis.

Students take formative assessments every 6-9 weeks. The tests are aligned with common core standards, state standards, and the schools' curricula. Prepared and analyzed by Concept, these tests are utilized by teachers to guide instruction.

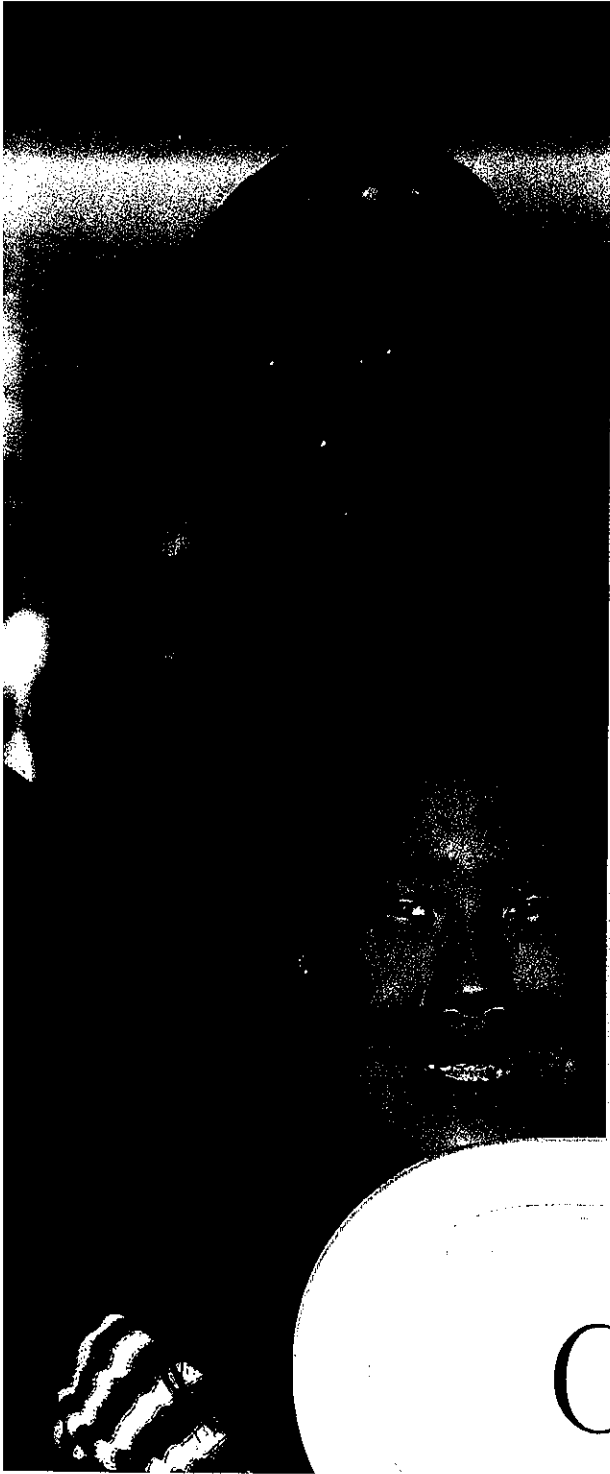

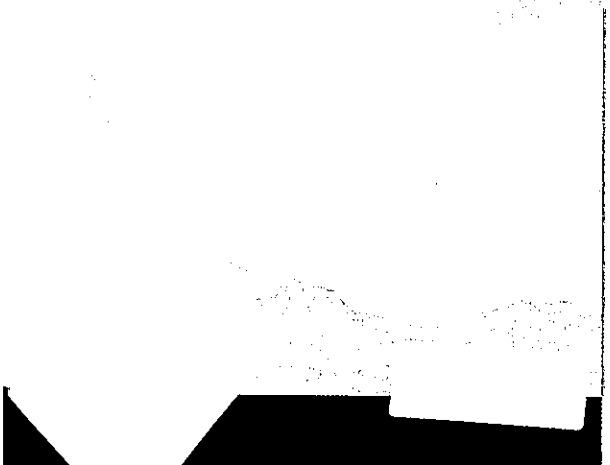

2 Two Blue Ribbon Schools

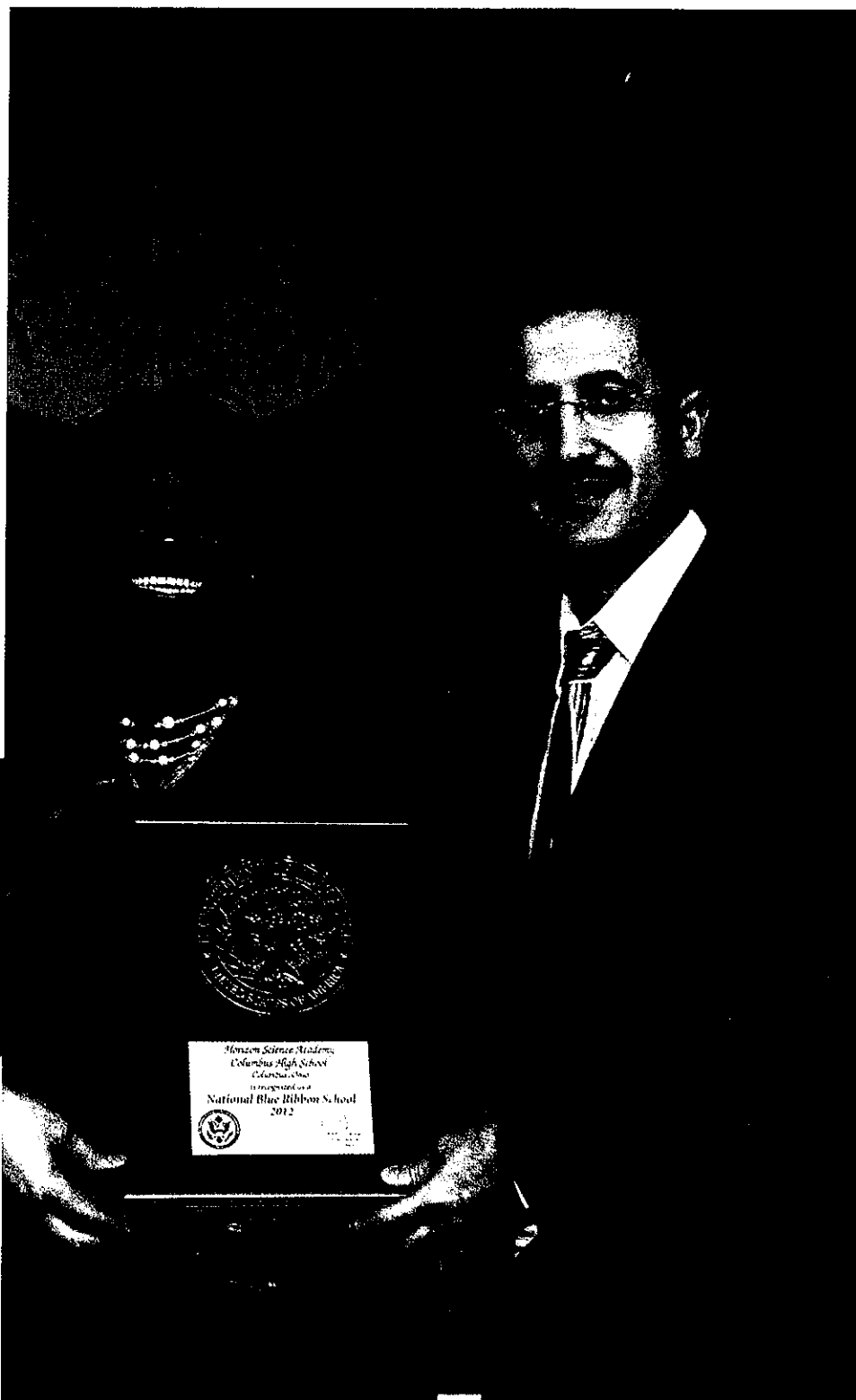
In 2009 and 2012 respectively, Horizon Cleveland High School and Horizon Columbus High School received the National Blue Ribbon School Award, a prestigious award given to successful schools by the U.S. Department of Education.

Horizon Cleveland was one of the 10 charter schools nationwide and the only charter school from Ohio, out of 350, to receive the award.

Horizon Columbus High School is the only charter school in Ohio to receive the 2012 National Blue Ribbon Award too.

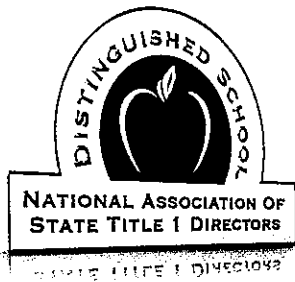
HSA Columbus High School, founded in 1999, serves over 400 students in grades 9 through 12. 81% of the students come from economically disadvantaged families.

HSA Cleveland High School, founded in 1999, serves 475 students in grades 9 through 12. 78% of the students come from economically disadvantaged families.

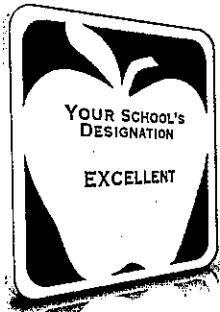

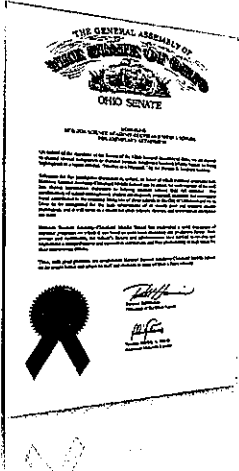
Best "High Schools" List

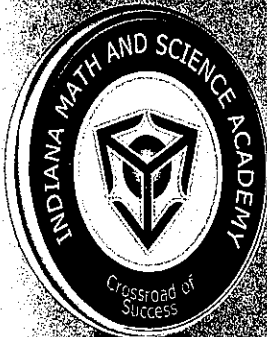

CREDO ENDORSES THE CONCEPT'S PERFORMANCE

Concept was included in an extensive study conducted by the Center for Research on Education Outcomes (CREDO) at Stanford University. The study, released on January 2013, covered longitudinal (5 year) performance of 176 Charter Management Organizations, 38 Education Management Organizations, and individual charter schools.

Concept stands out in the study as one of the highest performing EMO's in the 25 states that the CREDO study covered.

In regards to poverty level, percentage of minority students, and the number of total students, Concept may easily be considered the highest performing EMO in both math and reading.
