BACKGROUND & PURPOSE

- Milwaukee Code of Ordinances, Chapter 310-18.9, Purchase of Milwaukee-Made, Milwaukee County-Made and American-Made Goods (American-Made), was adopted on February 12, 2013 (Effective: June 2014)
- Established to increase local and U.S. based business participation in the award of various City commodity contracts
- Requires the City to purchase American-Made goods if the purchase does not increase the cost of the good by more than 12% or \$27,892 (Effective October 6, 2025)
- Applies to commodity purchases over \$50K



DEFINITION

- According to Chapter 310-18.9 a “Milwaukee, Milwaukee County, or American-Made good” means an article that is:
 - Manufactured, mined or produced in the **City of Milwaukee, County of Milwaukee** or in the **United States** whose components made in the City of Milwaukee, County of Milwaukee or in the United States exceed 50% of the total cost of all components



EXCLUSIONS

1. Raw materials such as salt, gravel, petroleum, any product derived from petroleum, or a chemical, including liquid oxygen, fluoride, or anhydrous ammonia.
2. The requirements of the legislation may be waived if any of the following conditions apply:
 - The good is not produced in the U.S. in a sufficient and reasonably available quantity and satisfactory quality.
 - The purchase responds to an emergency which endangers public health and safety and no other compliant contractor is immediately capable of responding.
 - It is impracticable to draw specifications to permit competitive bidding, items can be furnished from only one source, or items constitute a special adaptation for a special purpose, pursuant to s. 16-05-3 of the City Charter.
 - It would be in the best interests of the city to procure the goods as a cooperative purchasing arrangement with the state or other governmental entity.



REQUIREMENTS


- Contracts are awarded to the lowest compliant and responsible bidder based on the 12% bid preference (**not to exceed \$27,892**).
- Effective March 1st, 2026 the bid preference will increase by 1.0% to **\$28,171** per the Code.
- The bidder must submit a notarized Affidavit of Compliance affirming that their product(s) meet the requirements of the ordinance
- The 12% bid preference is 3-tiered. If three vendors in each category qualify, they will be prioritized as follows:
 1. Buy Milwaukee
 2. Buy Milwaukee County
 3. Buy American (United States)



CONCLUSION

- The Buy American Bid Incentive (BABI) program's fiscal impact from a contract award standpoint since inception is approximately \$158K, or \$15K per year.
- Although 15 bids were awarded based on the BABI program from 2014-2024, there does appear to be notable interest in program by the vendor community, based on the fact that on average 50% of the bidders by which the Buy American bid incentive applies, are seeking to qualify for the bid preference.
- Conversely, the realities of a complex, global supply chain undergird the challenges associated with directly impacting the number of Buy American contract awards.
- In spite of this reality, the BABI program appears to have a positive impact on job retention. Since the legislation has been enacted 236 U.S. based jobs have been retained – 235 full time jobs and one (1) part time job.
- To that end, the BABI program maintains relevance for the vendor community and it continues to be a helpful tool that is available to provide firms that manufacture and/or produce their products in the U.S. a competitive advantage.
