Hundreds of boats congregate and anchor in an area close to each other in the Outer Harbor during these Special Events such as Firework Displays, Air Shows and Boat Races. Boats that approach this area at high speed create wakes that cause boats in the area of the event to severely rock which loosens anchors, damages boats rafted (tied) together, discomfort to boat occupants and possible collision and injury.

Accordingly, we feel the Milwaukee Harbor Safety Committee should request the City of Milwaukee to provide a "No Wake "Zone in the Outer Harbor during Special Events.

I am sending this letter to you to show my support for a City of Milwaukee ordinance to control speed in the outer harbor before, during and after special events. The special events should be limited to those where there is a very large number of watercraft in the harbor.

I feel that the authorities are hampered in dealing with unsafe speeds at this time because the current ordinance for craft 40 feet and larger is limited to 5 MPH, or, "No Wake". My safety concern is that the craft under 40 feet are free to cause big wakes as they are accelerating. The skippers weave about the larger craft in hazardous zeal to get back to the launch ramp or dry stack FIRST.

For the past four years, I have given up on enjoying fireworks and air shows due to the careless operation of smaller craft at the aforementioned times.

The Milwaukee Harbor Safety Committee is an excellent organization that could set the particular dates for the ordinance so that a minimum of dates would be affected.

The U.S. Coast Guard, Milwaukee County Sheriff, Milwaukee Police Department and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, who have patrols on the water, have indicated that the above mentioned ordinance would help them enforce "An Ordinance" if one is enacted.

In short, I support a NO-Wake Ordinance in the Milwaukee Outer Harbor before, during and after special events as deemed by the Milwaukee Harbor Safety Committee.

Thank you for taking time to pursue the addressing of the safety problem BEFORE THERE IS A SERIOUS ACCIDENT OR FATALITY.

Dear Mr. Happel:

I whole heartedly support any efforts your committee takes in improving boater safety in Milwaukee harbors during special events. As a frequent spectator of summer fireworks, it has become dangerous to be out there at night and has reached the point that, without ordinances to deal with the problem, there will inevitably be a serious accident and deaths.

During the 2006 Summer fest Big Bang, I took what I thought was a conservative approach to anchor my 41 ft sailboat away from the crowd, about halfway back to the entrance to McKinley. That turned out to be a huge mistake. I suddenly realized I was in the path of every uneducated boater racing back to return to the McKinley launch ramp after the fireworks. Three boats came within 10 to 20 feet of my bow traveling at least 30 mph, the closest of which was at serious risk of snagging my 5/8ths inch anchor line. Had he snagged it, both boats would have sunk from the collision. My attempts to warn these approaching boats of my presence with a high beam light was met with obscenities.

There is a serious lack of respect for Wisconsin boating laws and common sense during these events that detract from their safety and enjoyment. A "No Wake" ordinance must be promulgated during these events.

The Harbor Safety Commission should also consider an ordinance that prohibits helicopters from hovering over the harbor and downtown area during fireworks. The noise is excessive, extremely annoying and detracts from the enjoyment of the event. In 2005, one helicopter hovered over Milwaukee Yacht Club during July 3 that totally downed out the sound of the fireworks. I wrote to all the Milwaukee TV stations requesting greater sensitivity to the issue and suggesting the event could easily be covered from cameras on the ground or nearby rooftops.

I have been enjoying the harbor for the past 3 years now since I purchased my boat. I have also gone to Chicago for the past 3 years for Venetian Nights. One of the comments that I have said and any friends who have been at Venetian Nights and at events such as Milwaukee 4th of July fireworks is how they need to make the harbor a "no wake zone" in these times as Chicago does..

Personally, I never go above idle when it's that crowded out there – it's just asking for an accident. I just do not understand why others can't do the same. It would make the nights so much more enjoyable if we could have the area as a no wake zone for the events.

The past 2 years I have had no problems, however this year for the 4th of July fireworks, I was rafted together with a friend of mine. After the fireworks concluded we stayed around for about a hour to avoid the rush of people coming back in. While we were sitting out – someone in a "go fast" boat came by and did a 180 right to our side – creating a enormous wave, and crashing our boats together. The guy then said, oh, I thought you were some friends. My friend and I couldn't believe this guy – and, if he was a friend of ours – he wouldn't have been a friend any longer after doing that. The swells he created were atleast 2 feet from his wake doing this. Luckily there were no other boats rafted together – it would have been even worse!

I am requesting that the City of Milwaukee pass an Ordinance specifying a "No Wake" zone in the Outer Harbor during special events. The Outer Harbor is defined as the open water from the shoreline to the break walls.

Hundreds of boats congregate and anchor in a confined area in close proximity to each other during special events such as Fireworks Displays, Air Shows and Boat Races. Exemptions from this ordinance should be any vessel involved in the actual event, for example competition boats in a sanctioned boat race and emergency boats.

Some boats have approached this area before an event or exit after an event at high speed creating wakes. These wakes can cause:

- Anchors to loosen causing boats to become adrift
- Possible damage boats rafted (tied) together
- ☐ Discomfort to boat occupants
- Injury from falls or fending off other boats
- ☐ Loss of navigation control of small boats underway.

A boat traveling at high speed, in a confined and congested area, with limited night time visibility is very dangerous and should be stopped. Please address this issue before there is a tragedy which could be avoided.

Dear Wayne,

As you know I have a 50' Ocean Alexander which because of it's length can only be operated at a no wake speed in the inner harbor of Milwaukee at any time. I have been told that any boat over 40 feet must operate at no wake speed in the inner harbor of Milwaukee. I don't know if this is a local or Coast Guard regulation. You might check on the regulation and find out if I am correct. If I am correct I would guess most of the boaters are unaware of this regulation. I tried to find the regulation on the internet, but was unsuccessful.

I feel that especially during harbor events like the Big Bang or 3rd of July fireworks a no wake from say 5 pm to dawn would be a good thing. I have been out many times trying to anchor or just float during these events and have been rocked, cut off, and have had near misses from boats that have no regard for their wake! They think that I can stop and maneuver my boat on a dime or since my boat is so big a wake won't bother me. Let me tell you a wake from even a 16' boat can create enough motion to knock dishes off the table and make it uncomfortable to sit on the aft deck. I see no reason why boats have to speed around during special events and create unsafe conditions for other boaters. To that end I would strongly support a NO WAKE zone in the inner harbor during special events. If the regulation I mention above is true I think the boating public should be informed at launch ramps and marina's in the area along with increased enforcement of the regulation.

Dear Wayne,

On December 14, 2006, the Board of Directors of Milwaukee Yacht Club voted unanimously to support a request from the Milwaukee Harbor Safety Committee for passage of a City of Milwaukee Ordinance that prohibits boats to operate at high speed or on plane during special events in Milwaukee's outer harbor.

Hundreds of boats congregate and anchor in a confined area in close proximity to each other during events like July 3rd fireworks, the Air Show and boat races. When boats approach this area before, during or after a special event at high speed this causes wakes resulting in severe rocking of anchored boats. As a result, anchors are loosened, boats tied together are damaged and occupants of the boats are put in danger of suffering injury. We have had a number of club members who have reported near miss collisions with speeding boats. Further, when the harbor has been overtaken by wakes, it makes navigation much harder for sail boats with small motors.

There is a 5 mile speed limit, no wake rule, in place in McKinley Marina, an area of dense boat traffic and moored vessels. During special events, the outer harbor comes to resemble the Marina, dense with vessels at anchor. It only makes sense that when the density of vessels becomes extremely high, a speed limit be in place.

Milwaukee Yacht Club is a strong supporter of safety on the water. We feel it is imperative that the outer harbor be a safe environment for <u>all</u> boaters and this safe environment are maintained during special events.
