This report is written by P.O. Anthony KRUEGER, District One, Early Shift, Sqd. 1421.

On the evening of Saturday May 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2014 through the morning of Sunday May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2014 District One personnel performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative. This was supervised by Sq 1413, Sgt. David LIGAS, and staffed with MPD officers Robert FERRELL, District One, Power Shift, Jennifer RAMOS, District One, Late Shift and myself. For the underage persons in this initiative we used two MPD police aides who work in the Police Administration Building. They were P.A. Paige CARLONI, W/F 12-15-93, Sensitive Crimes Day Shift, and P.A. Kourtney HARTL, W/F 06-18-94, Central Booking Day Shift.

Prior to attempting any checks of licensed class B tavern establishments the police aides were given instructions. CARLONI and HARTL were told that they were not allowed to consume any intoxicating beverages. They could not lie if asked if they were underage, or show any form of documentation, which could be construed as identification. It was explained that they had to order a Miller Lite Beer, directly from a bartender behind a bar, then meet the plain clothes officer observing them with the alcoholic beverage for a photo in the tavern and then leave together. It was explained that at all times the plainclothes officer shadowing them would be in visual sight and observe the financial transaction for alcoholic beverages.

After this briefing Sq 1413 Sgt. LIGAS, escorted P.O. Anthony KRUEGER who was in plainclothes and P.A. HARTL. While P.O. FERRELL escorted P.O. RAMOS in plainclothes, and P.A. CARLONI to multiple taverns located throughout the District One boundaries.

On Sunday, May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2014 at 12:30 AM P.A HARTL gained entry to the class "B" licensed tavern Upper 90 322 W State St. P.A. HARTL wasn't challenged at the point of entry by security staff, as none were present. After gaining entry the underage P.A. HARTL while being observed by P.O. KRUEGER, did approach the bar and ordered a Miller Lite from the bartender, (w/f, 20's, tall, skinny, blonde hair). P.A. HARTL again was not challenged for identification to verify her age. Upon exchange of money the bartender served an alcoholic beverage consisting of a Miller Lite Beer to PA HARTL. At that time P.O. KRUEGER took a photo of P.A. HARTL inside the tavern and both left together to perform additional checks of nearby class "B" licensed establishments.

After the checks were completed the above listed tavern was notified of the violation(s) and informed that a PA33 and citations regarding would be filed. I was able to identify the bartender who served P.A. HARTL by description and her on scene identification. She was identified as Rzyborowski, Amanda L (W/F 07-23-88, of 7768 N 49<sup>th</sup> St., Brown Deer, WI 53223 ph# 920-217-2251). Rzyborowski did not recognize P.A. HARTL or remember the transaction.







This report is being written by P.O. Luke LEE, assigned to District One, Early Shift, Partner P.O. James LUCKETT, Squad 1491 and 1490.

On Sunday, 11/10/13 at 1:14 AM, we were flagged to Trinity Bars Night Club at 125 E. Juneau Av for a Trouble w/Subject.

During the investigation of the incident, I interviewed the victim, Jeremy C. FREEMAN, M/B, 8/12/85, phone: 414-213-8828. FREEMAN stated that he was in the Trinity Bar having a good time and because there were lots of people in the bar, he bumped into a white male. The white male's glass of drink spilled all over FREEMAN's front shirt and some onto the suspect's, Amanda J. MONTEMAYOR (F, W, 11/11/89) dress. FREEMAN stated that MONTEMAYOR started yelling at FREEMAN, calling him names and stated that the Marines that she is with just came over Seas, so what's FREEMAN going to do? FREEMAN stated that he was sorry for spilling the male's drink and he's willing to buy him a new drink. FREEMAN stated that he turned around and MONTEMAYOR threw her glass of drink at him. FREEMAN stated that the glass hit him in the mouth, the drink splashed onto his face and glasses. The glass knocked his front left upper tooth off from his gum, chipped two other teeth and caused a small laceration to his upper left lip. FREEMAN stated that MONTEMAYOR's actions were done without his consent causing him pain and suffering. He wants to press charges.

I went to interview Amanda J. MONTEMAYOR (F/W, 11/11/89) but she was uncooperative and kept yelling, "I'm white and he's black, why you (Police) arresting me?" MONTEMAYOR refused to talk to me.

Medical was called and Bell ambulance #403 came on scene to check out FREEMAN's mouth and tooth.

PO LUCKETT called District One LT. on scene regarding the incident.

Photos were requested and sqd 1360, PO MLODZIK took photos of victim's injuries.

MONTEMAYOR was conveyed by sqd 1490 to Central Booking for booking process.

PO Sean McCORD, 018647, conducted a Portable Breath Test on MONTEMAYOR at 3:40 AM and her BAC was at 0.111.

I checked for and asked Jessie REIDERS (Manager of Trinity Bars, 278-7033) on 11/10/13 at 4:20 PM if there are cameras in the bars where the incident occurred. I was told that there was no camera in the bars. REIDERS stated that he would talk to the other manager that was on duty and the staff that worked during the incident if they had seen the incident. If any staff saw the incident I will be called.

This report is written by Police Officer Alberto FIGUEROA, assigned to District 1, LATE POWER SHIFT.

On Saturday April 26<sup>th</sup> 2014, Squad 1441 (PO Todd BOHLEN and I) were assigned to Code Red Entertainment District uniform foot patrol, on N. Old World Third St. starting at 10:00 pm.

At approximately 1:15 am (04/27/14), Squad 1411 (Sgt. Thomas Ackley) while also on Code Red foot patrol, observed a disturbance and an ensuing foot pursuit at 125 E. Juneau St. Sgt. Ackley observed Trinity security personnel chasing the suspect - Carl H. WILKINS, b/m, 11/28/1994 - west bound on E. Juneau St. from N. Edison St., then over the Milwaukee River bridge. Sgt. Ackley made a radio transmission of his observation, and requested squads to respond to investigate. We (Squad 1441) were close and responded to the area in our squad car. Upon arrival we observed (2) Trinity security personnel had the suspect WILKINS pinned face down to the sidewalk at 250 W. Juneau St. The Trinity security personnel were: (#1) Brian L. KASTELIC, w/m, 05/11/1990, (#2) Jesse M. BAKER, w/m, 10/19/1984. KASTELIC quickly related that WILKINS had just hit a fellow Trinity security person with a bottle and seriously cut his face. We handcuffed WILKINS to detain him to further investigate.

As we were conducting our investigation, PO BOHLEN and I were told by Security, that they were flagged down inside the tavern that WILKINS and CARTER were groping women. WILKINS and CARTER were then escorted outside the tavern in which NIESEN observed WILKINS walking outside with a Miller Lite Bottle.

PO BOHLEN then went to Trinity to investigate. I learned that the victim - Samuel T. NIESEN, w/m, 08/03/1991 - had been cut by WILKINS, who smashed a beer bottle over NIESEN'S face causing the severe laceration to the left facial cheek of NEISEN. Bell Ambulance #401 responded and conveyed NEISEN to St. Mary's Hospital for medical treatment. I learned the incident occurred on the city sidewalk on the southeast corner of the intersection at E. Juneau St. at N. Edison St. I observed several pieces of brown broken glass lying in the gutter near the curb at the location of incident. This glass appeared to be from a dark brown bottle, consistent with a Miller light 12 oz. beer bottle. This broken glass, and the overall scene was photographed by Squad 1360 ( P.O. Eric Mlodzik).

Bell # 401 conveyed NIESEN to St. Mary's Hospital, and Niesen was admitted at 1:50 am to be treated for a severe 2 1/2" long laceration to NIESEN'S left facial cheek. This laceration cut all the way thru his cheek, exposing the inside of his mouth thru the gaping laceration. Niesen also suffered severe pain and profuse bleeding from this injury. NIESEN received (41) stitches to close the laceration, and a plastic surgeon will have to provide an additional surgery to avoid permanent disfigurement. P.O. Mlodzik took photos of NIESENS' injury at St. Mary's Hospital.

While we were investigating this incident a van came west bound on Juneau St. at a high rate of speed, slammed on the brakes within feet of our location causing the tires to squeal loudly, and stopped in the street at our location. The driver who was identified as Donovan T CARTER quickly exited the van.

PO BOHLEN spoke to BAKER, Jesse M. (W/M 10/19/84), who works as security for Trinity, who stated he heard CARTER make statements earlier at Trinity during the battery complaint that he was going to get "guns". BAKER stated he heard CARTER state he was a "hood nigga" and that he was "going to come shoot you guys".

CARTER was arrested for Disorderly Conduct and unrelated municipal warrants.

At the Hospital, I asked WILKINS how he got inside the tavern due to his age. WILKINS stated he was a "VIP and can get in anywhere". I then asked again, and WILKINS stated he told one of the staff he just went outside to smoke a cigarette and was already inside Trinity. WILKINS stated he then gained access into the tavern.

Det. Dale BORMANN (CIB Early Shift) attempted to interview WILKINS in which WILKINS stated he understood his rights and refused to make any statements.

WILKINS was arrested for Substantial Battery, an unrelated injury by negligent use of a weapon, and citations for possess/consume alcohol under the age of 21 and presence of a minor in a license premise (underage).

During our investigation, Trinity security staff members were very helpful and cooperative. Robert C SCHMIDT (Licensee) was issued a citation for presence of minor at license premise.

On the evening of Saturday May 3rd, 2014 through the morning of Sunday May 4th, 2014 District One personnel performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative. The officers who participated in the operation were officers Robert FERRELL, District One, Power Shift, Jennifer RAMOS, District One, Late Shift, Anthony KRUEGER, District One, Early Shift, and myself. For the underage persons in this initiative we used two MPD police aides who work in the Police Administration Building. They were P.A. Paige CARLONI, W/F 12-15-93, Sensitive Crimes Day Shift, and P.A. Kourtney HARTL, W/F 06-18-94, Central Booking Day Shift.

Prior to attempting any checks of licensed class B tavern establishments the police aides were given instructions. CARLONI and HARTL were told that they were not allowed to consume any intoxicating beverages. They could not lie if asked if they were underage, or show any form of documentation, which could be construed as identification. It was explained that they had to order a Miller Lite Beer, directly from a bartender behind a bar, then meet the plainclothes officer observing them with the alcoholic beverage for a photo in the tavern and then leave together. It was explained that at all times the plainclothes officer shadowing them would be in visual sight and observe the financial transaction for alcoholic beverages.

After this briefing I escorted P.O. Anthony Krueger who was in plainclothes and P.A. HARTL. While P.O. FERRELL escorted P.O. RAMOS in plainclothes, and P.A. CARLONI to multiple taverns located throughout the District One boundaries.

P.A. CARLONI attempted to gain entry to the class "B" licensed tavern Trinity, 125 E. Juneau St. P.A. CARLONI was challenged at the point of entry and turned away when she couldn't prove she was of age.

Since there was no violation this tavern was not notified that this PA-33 was filed.
