There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. It is the intention of the Common Council to suspend or non-renew the licenses if objectors provide testimony related to the factors enumerated in MCO 85-4-4 that the Common Council finds to be true by a preponderance of the evidence and/or police reports are found to be true by a preponderance of the evidence. The police reports and other attached documents relating to objections to the license are a part of this notice and expressly incorporated in this notice. The licensee should be prepared to addr

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

Hello,

We are writing to express our concern and frustration about the frequent private parties and events that are held on our public street, hosted by Filament wedding venue. These parties create noise, trash, and safety issues for our neighborhood and disrupt the peaceful enjoyment of our properties.

Filament has been abusing Milwaukee's 'Special Event Permit' to extend their private business to the public street for their own profit. They pay only \$20 and face no regulation, accountability, or oversight.

Filament has sponsored more than 20 'special Events' this year alone, but there is nothing special about them. They are part of a regular business plan - Filament offers them as a 'Block Party Option' to clients. This means we will endure an increasing frequency and intensity of these events in the future.

We believe that our public street should not be exploited as a facility for private business.

We urge you to act promptly and decisively to stop these parties and help us create a stable environment for all the residents in our area.

We appreciate your attention and collaboration on this matter.

We have been experiencing loud noise, public intoxication and hassle entering and leaving our building due to events the Filament wedding venue holds on the street outside of our building on a regular basis.

On each occasion a **full bar** with **sound reinforcement** is utilized in a **party tent** right outside of our buildings entrance.

No notice or opportunity for rebuttal has been given for any of these events.

I wanted to start out by letting you know we appreciate you coming forward to be a voice for you and your fellow neighbors at . Thank you for talking to me over the phone this morning. During our conversation you informed me the location 131 W. Seeboth St. is Filament, a venue used for weddings, where the events take place for approximately 3-4 hours until 7-8pm. The issues you have brought up are:

- -Speakers playing music at a level of which disturbs you inside your place of residence.
- -Being subjected to unknown subjects in the area setting off amateur fireworks early in the morning at 1am.
- -These events are permitted to be in the street, and on the north sidewalk in front of their venue. From where these events are taking

place. You explained you have been having issues with guests of these events gathering on the south sidewalk including in front

These guests continuously stop residents trying to enter

a, asking them why they were entering their private event.

-You have explained people attending these events have been witnessed being intoxicated.

-You stated started out with not too many residence, but more and more are moving in, and concerned that the venues outdoor events with speakers/live entertainment may start to become more a nuisance

I am attempting to contact the License Premise Agent to discuss these matters further. For now, I know a Licensed Premise Report will be filed regarding, which are read at their license renewal hearings, stating everything you have experienced.

FYI, there are similar future events with approved Temporary Change of Place Applications. These allow speakers to play music from 4pm-7pm.

The hearing before the Licenses Committee will take place on 11/28/2023 at 2:15 PM in Room 301-B, Third Floor, City Hall. This is a public hearing. Those wishing to view the proceeding are able to do so via the City Channel – Channel 25 on Spectrum Cable – or on the Internet at http://city.milwaukee.gov/citychannel. Those wishing to provide oral testimony via phone or internet are asked to contact the staff assistant, Yadira Melendez at (414) 286-2775 or stasst5@milwaukee.gov for necessary information. Please make such requests no later than one business day prior to the start of the meeting. You are not required to attend the hearing, but please see the information below if you would like to provide testimony. Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing.

Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.
