

Historic Preservation Certificate of Appropriateness Solar Checklist

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The City of Milwaukee Historic Preservation Office requires a Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) for solar installations completed in historic districts (addresses with codes 1, 2, 3 or 5). The COA is issued by City staff, in line with Milwaukee's solar zoning ordinance and Wisconsin Statute 66.0401.
