**WHEREAS,** *Evangelist Lois Sandra Bohannon was born on December 14, 1956, to the union of Dr. Albert Greer Jr. and Odessa Shaw in Denmark, Tennessee, and she received her high school education in Milwaukee Public Schools, graduating from Washington High School; and*

**WHEREAS,** *Lois's first marriage was to Reginald Tillman, and their union was blessed with one daughter, LaTonya Tillman, and later married Clayton Bohannon, and they welcomed one daughter, Lorenzya Bohannon, and Clayton embraced Leticia Joshua (another of Lois's daughters) as his own and they formed a beautiful blended family; and*

**WHEREAS,** *Lois pursued higher learning and earned multiple degrees, including an associate degree as an administrative assistant at Milwaukee Area Technical College, Bachelor of Arts in Communications in 2004 at Alverno College, and Master of Business Administration in Human Resource Management in 2008 at American Intercontinental University; and*

**WHEREAS,** *Lois was a living testament to resilience, and dedicated to using her experiences and expertise to uplift others, and in 2009, she founded Youth Development for a Change, a nonprofit organization focused on offering intervention and prevention services for adolescents, young adults, and their families, and as a substance abuse counselor, she also registered World Women Addiction Recovery & Healing LLC in Wisconsin, where she worked to support women in their recovery journey; and*

**WHEREAS,** *At Faith Temple Apostolic Church under the leadership of District Elder D. Edward Eubanks, Lois served faithfully as a Youth Sunday School teacher (and was recognized by the Wisconsin State Sunday School Association for her participation and outstanding work), and she also was recognized as an Evangelist (and a Pastor Aid Chairlady) and she ministered for 25 years in the Wisconsin Department of Corrections and in nursing homes, and she later moved her membership to New Restoration Christian Church under the leadership of Pastor Dr. Wesley and Lady Alisha Carter; and*

**WHEREAS,** *Lois was preceded in death by her daughter, LaTonya Tillman-Webb, and leaves to cherish her memory her mother, Odessa Ivory, daughters Leticia Joshua and Lorenzya, grandchildren LaRoy, Javonte, Lavonea, Mona"Shay, Lyfe Marie, Dallas Joe (along with bonus grandchildren), as well as a host of other loving family members, friends, and coworkers; now, therefore, be it*
