My name is Raymond Banks, and I reside at 11015 W. Daphne Street, I am a 25+ year resident of the Heritage Subdivision. I am requesting an “Honorary” name change of North 111<sup>th</sup> Street (6700 blk) between West Green Tree Ave. and West Daphne Street to “Shirley Smith Blvd”. This location is inside of the Heritage Subdivision, located on the far northwest side of the City of Milwaukee. The requested location extends for only (1) block and does not have any residential homes located on it, which has no direct impact on any residents. Therefore, this action would not require any address changes or adjustments. Shirley Smith was the Matriarch of the Heritage Subdivision, and she passed on September 25, 2025. Shirley was a resident of the Heritage Subdivision for 20+ years. Shirley served as the President of the Granville Heritage Neighborhood Association, and she sat on the NID #5 Board. Shirley also served as the Architectural Review Board Chairperson. Shirley's plethora of titles led her to enforce the bylaws and regulations required for the Heritage Heights neighborhood to become one of the most beautiful, safest, and neighborly areas in the entire State of Wisconsin.

**Shirley Smith Bio:** Shirley Smith was born on June 17, 1949, in Wesson, Mississippi, and was raised by her aunt, Glover Mae. She accepted Christ at an early age and attended St. Paul AME Church. Shirley received her formal education at Eva H. Harris School in Brookhaven, Mississippi, graduating in 1967. After high school, she moved to Milwaukee, Wisconsin, where she married Walter Smith in 1973, and they were blessed with four children.


Shirley began her career at the Continental Can Company and later joined the secretarial team at St. Mark AME Church of Milwaukee WI., eventually becoming head of the administrative team. She served faithfully in various church ministries and continued her ministry as the Servant Director of the St. Mark Food Pantry after retirement. Shirley's love for the church was evident in her dedicated service across many ministries, including the Steward Board, Pastor's Aid, Culinary Ministry, Wedding Ministry, Women's Missionary Society, and the Praise Team. Her involvement in these activities and her presence in the Heritage Subdivision made her a well-known and respected figure.

**Association with Shirley Smith:** Shirley Smith's name is strongly associated with the street in question due to her long-standing involvement in the Heritage Community. Shirley and Walter Smith (late husband) purchased their home located at 11028 W Daphne Street in the Heritage Subdivision over 20 years ago. The Smith Home is located on the northeast corner of North 111<sup>th</sup> Street and West Daphne Street, which borders along North 111th Street (the requested area of change)

**Rationale for Renaming the Street:** Renaming the street after Shirley Smith is a fitting tribute to honor her remarkable life and dedicated service to the community. Shirley Smith was a beloved figure who made significant contributions to the Heritage Subdivision, St. Mark AME Church, and the broader community. Her relentless commitment to her faith and her tireless efforts to bring neighbors and communities together will always be remembered. Shirley's dedication to her church ministries has left an indelible mark on all those around her. Shirley drove through the neighborhood every day; and she made sure she greeted her neighbors, notifying neighbors of deliveries (sometimes standing by until neighbors came home). Shirley inspected neighbor's properties to determine if they were intact and if she found something wrong, (e.g., packages on the porches, debris on resident's properties, etc.) she made the appropriate notification. Shirley decorated the entrance to the subdivision on various holidays. The Smith's maintained the most beautifully manicured yard in the subdivision, setting the standard on how a yard should look. She led by example. Shirley exemplified everything a caring Neighbor, Friend, Mom, Sister, and Deaconess should be.

Renaming the street after Shirley Smith would not only honor her contributions but also serve as a reminder of the positive impact she had on the lives of many people in the community. It is a way to celebrate her legacy and ensure that her name remains a symbol of dedication, service, and community spirit,

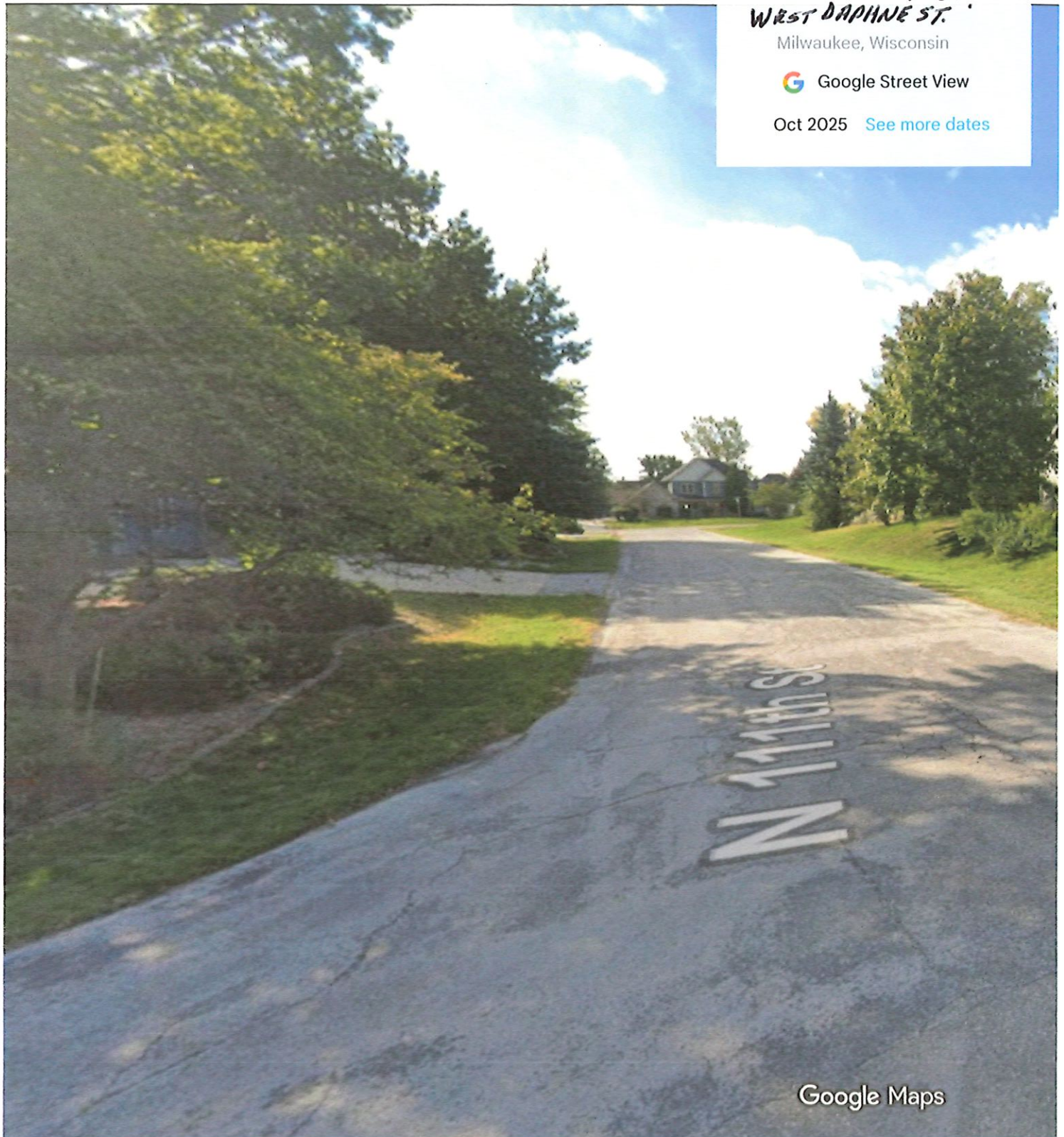

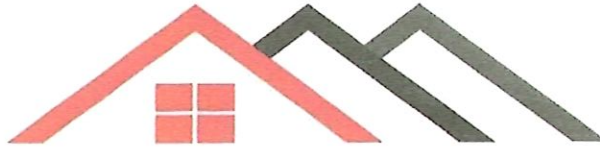



We urge you to consider this request and take the necessary steps to honor Shirley Smith in this meaningful way. Thank you for your attention.


