#### 3. Information on Mandates (Alderman Murphy)

Year to date (10/14/2022), 648 ACTIVE L215 members have been mandated a total of \$58,984 hours. This equates to 2457.66 twenty-four-hour shifts, an average of 8.5 full shift mandates per day. Please follow up if there were other specific questions not addressed.

#### 4. What computers are included in the replacement for special funds (Alderwoman Coggs)

The Special Fund budget would cover the replacement of all department computers including 105 front line computers on the apparatus as well as engine houses, administration, dispatch, IT and academy

computers. This fund also budgets for accessories necessary to for connectivity including docks and antennas for the apparatus. Frontline computers have an average lifespan of only 1-3 years due to the harsh conditions to which they are often exposed.

#### 5. What are the residency rates for the current cadet class? (Alderwoman Coggs)

Of the 52 current cadets, 29 are residents (56%) and 23 (44%) are not residents. Communities for the non-residents include 11 from Milwaukee County (Franklin, Oak Creek, South Milwaukee, Wauwatosa and West Allis) and 12 from outside of Milwaukee County (Brookfield, Menomonee Falls, Muskego, New Berlin, Richfield, Sussex and Waukesha)

## 6. The number of structure where crews were away from their station (Alderman Murphy)

This is not a metric that we have previously tracked. We could likely pull the information but it will be a fairly labor-intensive/manual project. If it is something that the committee wants us to pursue we can look into options and costs to get this done.

7. Structure fires per station and ALS calls per station that house Med Units (Alderman Murphy) PENDING
