That's why we have an interpreter. He just doesn't have 100 percent understanding of every word that's being said.

I ask you to renew his Public Passenger Vehicle driver's license. He has a clear driving record. He has no prior arrests. And he does have his explanation of the - - the complaints that were lodged against him for you to read and review. Thank you.
