


Change in Salaries and Wages from 2024 Budget (including ARPA funds in 2024).





Operating Expenditures Budget





Sewer Relay and Lining

Relining and replacement activity has decreased in recent years as the highest need pipes have already been repaired or replaced. The Sewer Relay and Lining Program will be allocated \$18 million in 2025, the same as 2024.

Green Infrastructure

In 2025, the City will increase its investment in green infrastructure by 33%, as well as apply for additional grant support to continue building and maintaining a strong green infrastructure network throughout the City. Green infrastructure will be allocated \$2.0 million in 2025, an increase of \$500,000 from 2024, in addition to \$2.0 million in anticipated grant funding.

Flood Mitigation

Currently constructing a retention basin near 31st and Capitol Drive to reduce localized flooding and sewage backups. Additional work is being planned near 35th St. & Capitol Drive from 2024 to 2026. The current cost estimate is \$11 million, with \$1 million included in both the 2024 and the 2025 budgets to help fund this project.

Infiltration and Inflow Reduction

Infiltration and Inflow Reduction will be allocated \$1.5 million in 2025, in addition to an anticipated \$1.7 million in grant funding from MMSD, the same as 2024.
