Officers later spoke to Patsy Smith who stated they couldn't allow any more patrons in due to capacity. A meeting was suggested to Smith to discuss recent incidents before something serious occurred. On 06/25/08 Smith went to District # 2 to discuss the concerns of Club Rain with district officers. Investigation found numerous underage patrons inside the bar who were trying to leave the establishment. Officers confirmed 72 underage patrons and who were not with any parent or guardian. Police spoke with Robert F Smith, the licensee, who had no explanation for the large number of underage patrons inside his tavern. A total of 60 citations were issued for Possession/Consumption of Alcohol 17-20, 10 citations for Presence of Underage/Minor, 5 for Misrepresenting Age, and 4 for Obstructing Issuance of Citation. Police were on scene for 3 hours and had to ask the bar staff several times to stop serving while police were investigating.

8. On 03/16/12 at 4:30 pm, members from District one and the License Investigation Unit met with Robert Smith and his attorney, Vincent Bobot in regards to large amounts of patrons who were underage and found inside 730 N OWT Street, Boardroom. An investigation found that 72 citations were issued one night with many of the ID's from out of state. Mr. Smith stated he was embarrassed by this incident and provided suggestions of improvements that included using an ID scanner, changing cameras and using a height measurement to check against ID information. Mr. Smith also provided a typed security measure plan and a suggestion was made that Smith should required a Wisconsin state ID, as most students need to change their addresses to a local one in order to vote. Police personnel provided other suggestions to Smith and advised him that if problems persist, uncover surveillance would be conducted.

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9. On 11/24/12 at 1:36 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 730 N. Old World Third Street for an Underage Persons complaint. Upon arrival, officers were posted at the entry door and the rear door to ensure that no one would exit from the rear door. Investigation found eight patrons who were underage and also found that the bar's license had not been posted, only an invoice. No licensed manager was on scene. All underage patrons were cited and released.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

They each had what appeared to be alcoholic beverages. A bartender was present and was observed drinking. The agent, Michael Kozak, was on the premises. He stated that everyone was an employee. He could only produce 3 out of 5 employee time cards.

6. On 4-12-2005 at 2:10am while on patrol, a Milwaukee police officer observed 3 males exit the front door of the Velvet Room 730 N Old World Third St. When the officer entered the tavern, he observed a male and 2 females on the premise, and the male, the licensee, Michael C Kozak, was telling the females to go out the back. Kozak was very uncooperative and very argumentative. He stated "Don't you have something better to do? This is bullshit. What other bars did you fuck with tonight. Come on, give me some more tickets. I have been in business seven years and I have a criminal justice degree, and a lawyer." While inspecting the licenses, the officer found the Occupancy Capacity sign posted in the kitchen area. Kozak was issued the following municipal citations:

7. Incident - On 8-20-2005 at 11:10pm Milwaukee police conducted a tavern check at the Velvet Room, 730 N Old World Third St. The licensee, Michael C Kozak was informed by a police sergeant that the noise variance permit granted for the Velvet Room's block party ended at 10:00pm Kozak produced a document that the variance was granted until 12:00am. The sergeant instructed Kozak that he would have to shut down the music. Kozak became very argumentative and uncooperative with the sergeant. Kozak stated give me the ticket; I am not fucking shutting down the music. A police inspector was called and permitted the music to go on until 12:00am. A David Krey from the Dept. of Nuisance & Environmental Health, who signed the variance permit, stated 2 permits were issued on 8-17-2005. The first was for midnight and a second was issued rescinding the first because the alderman wanted the permit granted until 10:00pm. No citation was issued.

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8. On 07/09/07 at 1:13 am, Milwaukee police were flagged down by employees from Martini Mike's for a Trouble With Subject complaint. Investigation revealed a fight took place inside the tavern with the patrons continuing the fight outside of the tavern. Police spoke to the parties who were involved in the fight with all them stating it started inside the tavern. Officers spoke with the licensee, Michael Kozak who first stated the fight did not occur in the tavern but outside the tavern. Kozak stated he pushed some of the patrons involved in the fight out the back door with another employee escorting the other patrons out the front door. Kozak also stated the one of the patrons threw a glass at him and he wanted to prosecute for it. When asked why Kozak didn't call for police when the fight started he offered no explanation. Kozak and his staff were uncooperative at times with police and this incident tied up three squads and a patrol sergeant for 5 hours and 56 minutes. Citations were issued to the parties involved in the fight for Disorderly Conduct, Assault and Battery and Resisting/Obstructing An Officer.

With 11 minutes left till closing, officers observed no lights on or heard any announcements being made that the tavern would be closing. Employee's observed officers standing outside the tavern and the licensee, Michael Kozak, starting having staff members close the overhead garage doors to the outside seating and the doormen were pulled inside and were told to "get everyone out now". Kozak stated to police that he was hosting wrestlers from the WWE Wrestlers who had just performed at the Bradley Center and officers advised Kozak that it was 1:58 am and he and his staff needed to get the patrons out of the bar. Officers observed most patrons standing around finishing their drinks. Police entered the tavern and informed patrons it was time to leave and were counting patrons as they left. A total of 31 people were still in the tavern after 2:00 am. After officers informed Kozak that a tavern report was going to be filed, Kozak became argumentative and uncooperative with police. A citation was issued to Kozak for Patrons After Hours. On 03/10/08, the charge was amended to Special Hours For Liquor Sale In Original Package.

Officers spoke to Michael Kozak who apologized and stated he would close the windows and turn down the music.

On Thursday, April 9, 2009, at 9:53pm, Officers Mary Sikora and Tracy Tabiaddon of the License Investigation Unit went with District One Officers and agents from the Wisconsin Department of Revenue to Martini Mike's at 730 N. Old World Third St. The agents were there to serve a tax warrant on the licensee Michael C. Kozak. The warrant was to seize any cash on the licensed premises for overdue taxes. An underdetermined amount of money was seized.

While on the premises the agents conducted an alcohol audit and the licensee Michael Kozak was advised of the following violations:

16. On 06/27/09 at 2:28 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 730 N 3rd Street for a Fight complaint. Officers spoke to Michael Kozak who stated one of his employees Daniel Wagner, was beat up by a subject he only knew as "Dee". Kozak further stated he had gone outside after his bar closed and observed a fight between two females, one of which was Wagner's girlfriend. Kozak stated then he observed "Dee" go up to Wagner and punch him in the head causing Wagner to fall. Kozak further stated that five other unknown males then approached Wagner with one of them punching Wagner to his neck. Kozak stated he yelled that he was calling police and all subjects left. Medical personnel was on scene and Wagner stated to officers that he was going to seek treatment at St Luke's and was having a friend drive him there. An anonymous caller stated he observed a burgundy Cadillac circling the area and believed he observed the passenger waving a gun out of the window. Officers checked the area and could not locate the auto. While in the area, officers observed a heavy presence of vehicular and pedestrian traffic. Autos were honking horns and revving their engines while pedestrians would occasionally hoot and holler as the cars passed. Officers observed that the cars would then stop in the vicinity of Martini Mike's. As police monitored the area, a citizen approached police and stated, " This is ridiculous! It's like this every time they're open! (meaning Martini Mike's) I have a young child that gets woken up by this every weekend!" Officers inquired if the citizen ever tried to talk with the owner regarding the noise to which he replied, " Yeah, but he (Mike Kozak) doesn't care. " Officers conducted followed up the next day and spoke to the doorman/bouncer regarding the closing time and noise issues. The bouncer stated to officers that, " it would be great if you guys (the police) could allocate some time to come and help us out." Officers further advised that every effort should be made to prevent excessive noise from the bar's patrons as they leave the tavern and to be respectful and aware of the neighbors that are in the area.

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Item # 15 previously reported, disposition now added on 04/21/11.

Applicant currently has an open warrant regarding item # 10. There is an outstanding balance of \$2,814.69 that was due by 12/17/10.

19. On 05/15/10 at 2:22 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to W. Wisconsin and N Old World Third Street. Investigation revealed that three subjects had been shot with one fatality. Officers attempted to make contact with employees inside Martini Mike's and found that interior lights were off and that the doors were locked. While checking the rear of the tavern, police observed a subject sitting on a parking rail near parked autos. This subject was identified as Eric Folsom who stated he worked as a security guard for Martini Mike's. Police asked to speak with Folsom inside the tavern and Folsom stated there was an argument between two patrons between 11:00-11:45 pm, and that it was over a woman. Folsom stated one patron was calm and was allowed to remain in the tavern and that the other patron was still causing a disturbance and was being escorted out by security. When asked if there was any video surveillance, Folsom stated there were no working cameras either inside or outside the tavern. Folsom further stated that at approximately 1:30 am, the bar was evacuated at which he was told by unknown subjects that the individuals involved in the earlier altercation were just involved in a shooting. Folsom could not recall who gave him the information. Officers attempted to contact the licensee, Mike Kozak, but was advised he was in Las Vegas.



NARRATIVE SECTION: This report was written by P.O. Keith MILLER, assigned to District Two, Power Shift, Squad 2441.

On Sunday, April 20, 2014 at 1:02am, my partner P.O. Eligio CAVAZOS and I, along with Sgt. Bradley SCHLEI, Squad 2411, conducted a License Premise Investigation at 3530 W National Ave (Romos Silver City Sports Bar).

Upon arrival I, spoke with Osvaldo ROMO (W/M/03-04-75), who stated he was the owner of the establishment. While walking through the establishment, I observed a large speaker along with other tavern equipment obstructing the emergency exit door, which was located in the northwest corner of the tavern. I immediately notified ROMO of this violation and he addressed it right away. Upon trying to open the emergency exit it was determined it was locked. I observed a sliding lock style lock mounted into the floor, which was in the vertical position. I also observed a second lock on the door, which was also locked. Upon ROMO'S attempting to unlock the door I observed that it was not functional. The door would not open making it unsafe in the likely event a fire would've occurred. After 5-7 minutes of applying force to the door, another employee at the tavern was able to get the door to open. ROMO'S stated he did not own the building and was unaware that the door was not in fully working condition. A warning was issued to ROMO regarding this offense. A check with the Department reveal the owner of the establishment was Peggy A ROMOS-WEST (W/F/09-22-70). At the time of this report ROMOS-WEST was not notified regarding this violation.

On Thursday, June 5, 2014, at 12:05 PM, Captain Alfonso Morales, P.O. Matthew Diener, and I, held a meeting with Peggy Romo-West (W/F, 09/22/70) at 245 W Lincoln Av (District Two Police Station), regarding Romo's Silver City Sports Bar located at 3530 W National Av.

The meeting was in regards to recent citizen complaints regarding Romo-West's establishment. Romo-West stated Alderman Robert Donovan had also addressed the complaints with her and her husband and she submitted a plan to help resolve the complaints. The complaints citizens had were patrons leaving after hours, rudely patrons as they left the bar, loud music, and patrons urinating outside. Romo-West stated as to the after hours complaint, her employees do stay after bar close on the weekends because they have to clean the bar, so that it could be ready for the next day, since they open early. She stated she was not aware of loud patrons but will have the security guard monitor the patrons when they are outside smoking. Romo-West stated she didn't know who was urinating outside. She stated she received a warning for having an emergency exit locked and since then, she has unlocked it. Romo-West stated the reason it was locked was because they had forgot to lock after the bar was closed and tenants from the upper unit went into her bar and started drinking her liquor. Romo-West was cooperative with officers and stated she was thinking of having her husband get the license in his name, since she is not always at the bar. Romo-West was not cited. There weren't any recent nuisance related calls for service for this location. I advised Romo-West I would be filing a License Premise report regarding this meeting. No violations at this time.

The following is a synopsis of the plan that Romo-West submitted to Alderman Donovan to resolve the problems and provided officers with a copy.

- 1) Stagger smokers. Security to limit only 6 people at time to smoke at once.
- 2) Limit severely the rap music. No rap music after midnight on weekdays and 1 AM weekends.
- 3) Security on weekends will do perimeter checks once. Monitor loud music from cars and ensuring patrons leaving.
- 4) Bartenders will not over serve customers. Enrolled in the designated driver program.
- 5) At Bar close, exit will be staggered. DJ will play slow songs at 2 AM, 2:10 AM last call will be announced, and 2:15 music will be cut off.
- 6) Age restriction of 25 and up on the weekends.
- 7) Dress code- no hats or bandanas.
- 8) Responsible hiring of good bartenders.
- 9) Sponsoring neighborhood cleanup with hosting a block party.
- 10) Adding benches, garbage cans and flowers to outside of business.
- 11) Will flyer neighborhood with contact info, so neighbors could contact them to report a problem regarding the bar.
- 12) They will be adding additional cameras to help monitor the bar at all times and help correct any neighborhood complaints/problems.

Committed to holding neighborhood meeting to address the neighborhood's concerns and will work with the Alderman's office to schedule meeting.

Noise Mitigation for the Neighborhood:

1. Stagger smokers – Security to limit only 6 ppl are allowed outside to smoke at a time to diminish and noise in the neighborhood. Benches will be added so that customers can smoke ON 36th Street away from the doors.
2. Limit severely the rap music. No rap after midnight on weekdays at 1 a.m. on weekends. After Midnight on weekdays and 1 a.m. on weekends, music will be turned down.
3. Security on the weekends will do perimeter checks at least once, check the parking lot, and the street to be sure OUR customers are getting in their cars and leaving to ensure that they aren't listening to their music loud, or participating in any other undesirable behavior in the neighborhood.
4. Bartenders have been trained and instructed to not over serve customers. Customers will be cut off when they have had too much so that we are not sending customers out of the bar to be involved in undesirable activity in the neighborhood. Romo's Silver City has a designated driver program. Customers identified as designated drivers receive free soda all night.
5. At Bar Close, exit will be staggered. The DJ will play slow songs starting at 2 a.m. once that music comes on, 1st wave of customers will start to leave, then at 2:10 a.m. last call, 2nd wave of customers will leave at 2:15 music will be cut off all together, 3rd and final wave of folks will leave.

Attracting only the Best Customers:

6. 25 and up - on the weekends we will enforce patrons 25 years and older only.
7. Dress Code - no hats or bandanas I know you do this now but I think you need to not allow hats at all.
8. Responsible hiring of bartenders – GOOD bartenders bring in GOOD patrons.

Curb Appeal – Being good Neighbors:

9. Romo's Silver City is committed to holding a block party/sponsoring a neighborhood cleanup. We'd like the neighbors get to know us and see that we want to be good neighbors and we'd like for them to feel more comfortable with us. Free hot dogs, prize drawings, and some bar

promotions so we promote the bar to the neighbors, we want to be the neighborhood corner bar.

10. We will be adding benches, garbage cans and flowers to the outside of our business to make it more inviting to the neighborhood and to improve our curb appeal.
11. We will flyer the neighborhood (37th Street – 35th Street from National – Pierce Street) to distribute our contact info so neighbors can call us to report any problems. Contact info will include the number in the bar so they can call us directly. Flyers will be distributed the Week of May 19th, 2014.
12. We will be adding additional video cameras by June 2014 so we can monitor the bar at all times and to help correct any neighborhood complaints/problems. We will hang signs on the premises alerting people that they are on camera.

****If it will help, Romo's Silver City is committed to holding a neighborhood meeting to address directly the neighbor's concerns as soon as possible. We will work with the Alderman's office to schedule a meeting.**

This report was written by PO Gina METZ assigned to district two, late shift. On Sunday, 06/08/2014 at 1:14am, I was dispatched with squad 2330 (PO POVLUCK) to investigate a battery complaint at Silver City Sports Bar, located at 3530 W National Av. When I arrived at the location, PO POVLUCK was interviewing two female subjects outside, in front of the location.

I went into the bar and I spoke with the bartender, Mary A TOBAR, who explained that there was an unruly patron that was escorted out of the location by the security guard, Cruz LUCIANO (w/m 11/24/1975) 919 S 10th St, 414-640-0457. As this subject, who was identified as Angela L VRANA (w/f 07/23/1981) 2100 S 32nd St, 262-895-9103, was being escorted out of the building, she was joined by her friend, Nicole M BOWEN (w/f 10/27/1983) 2236 S 59th St, West Allis, WI 53219, 414-552-8859. There were other unknown patrons inside the bar as the girls were being escorted out, and an unknown subject threw an object that struck BOWEN on the forehead. TOBAR included that VRANA was yelling and swearing about her drink, but she finished the drink anyhow.

TOBAR stated that after the subjects were escorted outside, she closed the bar and made the remaining patrons leave. TOBAR was unaware that there was any further issues until VRANA came back into the bar and informed them that BOWEN was injured. TOBAR included that she was not familiar with any of the patrons that were at the location and she checked the bar for any object that might have been thrown at BOWEN, but she did not find anything unusual or out of place.

I then spoke with VRANA who explained that she was upset that she was served a beverage that she did not like the taste of and that when she complained about it, she was escorted out of the bar with her friend BOWEN. VRANA said that when they were standing on the sidewalk in front of the location, BOWEN said that her head hurt and layed down on the ground. VRANA said that when she looked at BOWEN, she observed a red mark on her forehead. VRANA was highly intoxicated and was boisterous and profane. VRANA claimed that a subject inside the bar threw an unknown object at BOWEN and struck her on the forehead. VRANA was not able to identify who was involved or what the object was.

I attempted to speak with BOWEN, however, she was also highly intoxicated, she did not know what happened to her. BOWEN did not say she was struck in the head by an object and she could not explain what caused her injury. BOWEN complained of pain to her head and I observed a red area at the top of her forehead at her hairline. BOWEN was laying on the ground and when I asked her how she got on the ground, she said she fell. There were four cement steps at the entry way to the bar that were approximately three feet high. I asked BOWEN if she fell down the steps, but she did not know.

MFD Engine 26, Lt Scott ALWIN, red shift, responded and evaluated BOWEN. Curtis 328 conveyed BOWEN to St LUKES where she was admitted at 1:55am and treated by Dr William HARSHBARGER.

BOWEN and VRANA were provided my contact information and were instructed to contact me with any additional information regarding this incident.

All employees at the location were cooperative during the investigation and there were no violations to report.

The owner, Osvaldo ROMO contacted PO POVLUCK on 06/09/14 regarding security video footage and explained that there was no footage that captured the events described by VRANA.

This report was written by P.O. Dean DRAJKOWSKI assigned to the License Unit day shift.

On Monday, November 3, 2014, I received a complaint about Romo's Silver City Sports Bar located at 3530 W. National Ave.. The complaint indicated the operators were purchasing alcohol for the bar from Discount Liquor. I contacted Agent Georgeann KING from the Department of Revenue. Agent KING advised me that the Department of Revenue was in the process of revoking their seller's permit for unpaid taxes.

On Wednesday, November 26, 2014, at about 4:45 PM, while assigned to Squad 2741, along with Agent Georgeann KING, Sgt. Chad RADEN, P.O. Kevin VODICKA, P.O. Efrain CORNEJO, and P.O. Jose ACEVEDO, we went to Romo's Silver City Sports Bar and conducted a licensed premise inspection.

Upon arrival, we spoke with Osvaldo ROMO, W/M, 03-04-75, of 2904 W. Pierce St., phone #414-810-0461. ROMO is the husband of the agent/licensee, Peggy A. ROMO WEST, W/F, 09-22-70, of 2904 W. Pierce St. Osvaldo ROMO had a valid Class D Operator's License. Agent KING spoke with ROMO regarding the inspection. I located three liquor bottles that were contaminated behind the bar. ROMO admitted some of the liquor bottles came with the bar when they purchased it and he did not have invoices for those liquor bottles. Agent KING asked ROMO for all the liquor invoices for the bar. ROMO only had two recent invoices for about 10 bottles of liquor in the business. Agent KING advised ROMO that beer and liquor invoices need to be on the licensed premise for two years. ROMO had the beer and liquor invoices dropped off at the bar. Agent KING and I located retail receipts with liquor purchases from Discount Liquor and Oklahoma Liquor. ROMO admitted he had purchased liquor for the bar from liquor stores. ROMO stated he was unaware that he could not make purchases from retail stores. Agent KING advised ROMO it is illegal to purchase liquor or beer from another retailer or liquor store. Agent KING confiscated 52 various liquor bottles that were uninvoiced and illegally purchased. Agent KING also confiscated the beer and liquor receipts. Agent KING advised ROMO that the Department of Revenue revoked their seller's permit for unpaid taxes and the bar must be closed at the end of the day.

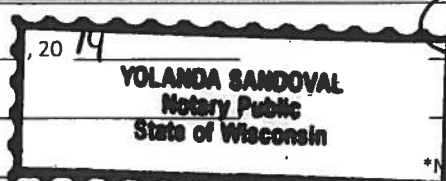
