Dear Mr. Zielinski:

The Health Department is submitting the following grant resolutions for Common Council approval:

<u>Urban Partnership Tobacco Education Grant</u> - This continuing grant funded by the Wisconsin Area Health Education Center System will focus on tobacco education and prevention for youth-of-color, ages 8-18.

<u>Std/HIV Prevention Training Grant</u> - Funded by the Cincinnati Health Department, this continuing grant supports the Health Department's Sexually Transmitted Diseases STD/HIV Program to serve as a model training center for students and professionals enrolled in the STD/HIV Prevention Training Center in Cincinnati.

<u>AID/HIV Counseling and Testing Grant</u> - The Wisconsin Division of Health and Family Services funds this continuing grant. The funds support HIV testing and counseling performed jointly by the Health Department's Sexually Transmitted Diseases Clinic and City Laboratory.

<u>Beach Monitoring Grant</u> - New to the Health Department, these funds from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources have been made available to the department to be used for the implementation of bacterial monitoring at Wisconsin public beaches.

<u>Congenital Disorders Grant</u> - The purpose of this continuing grant is to screen every infant born in Wisconsin for 26 rare disorders. The funding was awarded to the department by the Wisconsin Division of Health and Family Services.

<u>Covering Kids Grant</u> - This a new grant for the Health Department funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation through Community Advocates. The purpose of the grant is to assist low-income families in obtaining medical insurance and food stamps and other entitlements and to develop strategies to reach out to families of school children. There are changes to the Positions Ordinance as part of this file.

<u>Making Connections Grant</u> - Previously funded as the Medical Assistance Outreach Grant, these funds from the Annie E. Casey Foundation will

assist low-income families in obtaining medical insurance and food stamps, reduce health related barriers to education and employment through school linked health services and measure the impact of the Health Department's programs in target areas. Again, changes to the Positions Ordinance are incorporated.

<u>Hepatitis B Immunization Grant</u> - Continuing funds from the Wisconsin Division of Health and Family Services will be used to assure that pregnant women who test positive for hepatitis B are identified and that their infants and household contacts receive appropriate treatment.

<u>Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening Grant</u> - These funds from the Wisconsin Division of Health and Family Services will support the continuing goal to reduce mortality from breast and cervical cancer by increasing the number of low-income and under-served women 50 years of age and older who are routinely screened.

<u>Early Child Care Grant</u> - This continuing grant is funded by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. The grant will work to assure the health and safety of children who attend group licensed child care centers.

<u>2003 Consolidated Contract</u> - This file amends C.C. File 030397 which approved the funding for six initiatives. Additional funding was received for the Adolescent School Health initiative and Immunization Action Plan initiative which increased the award by \$209,813.
