**1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):**

The Beat Patrol - Overtime program provides additional overtime funds to support police personnel for community policing work, or beat patrols targeting specific local crime issues. Funds are available to the ten Wisconsin communities with the highest rates of violent crime index offenses in the most recent full calendar year for which data is available under the uniform crime reporting system of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

**2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:**

Decreasing crime trends in specific high-crime neighborhoods are maintained through constant presence and engagement of officers who regularly police and serve the residents of those neighborhoods. The overtime pay from the grant award will help to maintain a constant police presence to deter crime and improve community connections.

**3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):**

The funds for this grant are to be used to specifically fund overtime for beat patrol officers. This can improve police saturation within high-crime neighborhoods by covering more total area during patrols, improving police response times, and increasing around-the-clock coverage. Ideally, these funds will also allow for greater visibility and community connections that result from regular interactions with beat officers serving particular neighborhoods.
