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File # 070515 is a resolution authorizing the cancellation of receivables from the Milwaukee Health Services, Inc. (MHSI).

Background

- 1. The United States Health Care Finance Administration Centers for Medicaid and Medicare provided funding to the Milwaukee Health Services Program (MHSP) under a waiver program that has now ended.
- 2. The MHSP provided funding for health services offered at the Isaac Coggs Health Center by organizations that included MHSI, a former tenant.
- 3. The MHSI owes an outstanding debt to the City in the amount of \$365,520.48 for occupancy and maintenance services from February of 2002 through March of 2003. These services included security, reception and office cleaning among others.
- 4. Council File # 031612, a resolution adopted April 13, 2004, provided for the original balance of debt owed the City by MHS1 in the amount of \$392,587 to be treated as a no interest debt payable to the city in amounts equal to 10% of any surplus of \$500,000 or more of income realized by MHS1 in any fiscal year.

Discussion

- 1. Payments made to the City by MHSI through 2005 have reduced the debt owed by MHSI to \$365,520.48.
- Assuming that the amounts of future payments by MHSI would be comparable to those made in the past, it would take MHSI a minimum of 20 years to extinguish its debt.
- 3. An offer has been made by MHSI to pay 30% of the current liability, an amount of \$109,656, in settlement of the debt.
- 4. The current language of the resolution at File # 070515 (Substitute 1) authorizes acceptance of the offer by MHSI, and provides that the remaining balance in the amount of \$255,864.48 be written-off against amounts in the MHSP Program Income Account.
- 5. It is projected that, even contemplating the adoption of File # 070514 authorizing cancellation of receivables from the Sight Center and writing-off the Sight Center

- receivables against the MHSP Program Income Account, the Account will not be exhausted.
- 6. Negotiations have continued between the Health Department and MHSI, and MHSI may agree to amend its offer, based upon new surplus information for fiscal year 2006-2007, increasing the proposed settlement by an amount of up to \$85,000 to a total amount of up to \$194,656. The Health Department may therefore offer a substitute or amended resolution for consideration by the Public Safety Committee or by the Finance and Personnel Committee.

Fiscal Impact

1. This resolution, as currently written, will result in writing-off up to \$255,864.48 of receivables against amounts in the MHSP Program Income Account.

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
