H) COMPUTATIONS USED IN ARRIVING AT FISCAL ESTIMATE:

There should be no significant impact on Parking Enforcement or Tow Lot to enforce this ordinance. There will be an impact on the Tow Lot staff to sell certificates, inspect vehicles, review applications and vehicle titles and check for stolen vehicles, however no additional staffing will be requested to implement this program. During the six-month pilot program 230 vehicles were cited, 175 vehicles were towed and 28 certificates were sold. Of the vehicles towed, 22% had no registered owner, 11% had out of town ownership and 18% had no license plates. Approximately 14% of the vehicles towed were not claimed. It is not known the number of stolen vehicles towed under this program. Any vehicle towed or tow eligible under this program would have been checked as a stolen vehicle and towed accordingly.
