PRESIDENT HINES: Will the City Clerk please identify the matter before the Council?

CITY CLERK: Item No. 3, the Utilities and Licenses Committee recommends approval of File Number 041394, motion to approve the recommendation of the Utilities and Licenses Committee to revoke the public passenger vehicle license for Isadore Mbadiwe by a sworn written complaint as authorized under Chapter 100-68(1) of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances. No written exceptions were filed.

PRESIDENT HINES: Okay. Alderman Witkowiak moves that we go into the Committee of the Whole to hear oral argument on behalf of the licensee in opposition to the Report and Recommendations, and a statement presented by the City Attorney. Is there any objection? Hearing none, we are now in the Committee of the Whole.

Each side will be given five minutes, and the arguments shall be limited to the subject matter of the Report and Recommendations and the written exceptions.

(Whereupon Mr. Mbadiwe was sworn under oath.)

PRESIDENT HINES: The applicant will give a brief statement. Please give your name for the record, and then you have five minutes to address the body.

MR. MBADIWE: My name is Isadore Mbadiwe. PRESIDENT HINES: Continue, sir.

MR. MBADIWE: Good morning. Yeah, I been driving for American United Taxi Company for about five and a half years now. And I failed to appear the last time because I had kind of jail problem with the probation officer. She put me for incarceration for two weeks, because I was supposed to come here on the

8th of March for me to return to taxi driving.

I been driving for the public of Milwaukee for five years now, and I been keeping good conduct with the customers and the public of Milwaukee city. It's just I had a mistake. I made a mistake being around bad people, and that led me to being in the condition that I'm in today. It's not that I'm a bad person. But if the Common Council can give me a pardon from the revocation of my license, I would appreciate that.

All of the allegations concerning my condition right now are false allegations. Even through what the police department said on my behalf, all those things are false allegations. Why I plead no contest is because I already wasted too much money by having about three attorneys for my case, and I wasted too much time.

And I have a cousin that advised me that if I would get a new attorney which would get a good deal from the City of Milwaukee to handle my case, I should go ahead and take a plea because the people that owned the drugs doesn't want to take a plea of what they did. I was in the wrong place at the wrong time.

That's what happened to me, so I got a letter from the company when I was going to sentence, which they

gave me this letter which states that anybody that wants to know more about me, -- because I've been working for them for five years, -- I've been here like six and a half years. I worked with them for five years. So they gave me the letter saying anybody that wants to talk with them about me, because they know me better than anybody in this Milwaukee.

So if you guys can comply with me on signing the license, I will be really appreciative. And my Huber is not taken. There's a page on here that says my Huber privileges are ordered to be taken because I revoked, which is not true. I'm not incarcerated. You guys can see I'm not incarcerated, and I'm still working.

It's not just the PPO license that you guys give me. You guys give me a contractor license, too, so I have that one too for home improvement, do home improvement, and I work for the public. I was born to work for the public. I will keep the public satisfied if you guys give me a pardon. Thank you and God bless.

PRESIDENT HINES: Are there any questions of the applicant at this time? Chair recognizes Alderman Murphy.

ALDERMAN MURPHY: Thank you, Mr. President,

members of the Council. What were you incarcerated 1 for? 2 MR. MBADIWE: It was a possession with the 3 intent, party to a crime, marijuana. 4 ALDERMAN MURPHY: What types of drugs was 5 it? 6 7 MR. MBADIWE: Marijuana. ALDERMAN MURPHY: Thank you. 8 PRESIDENT HINES: Chair recognizes Alderman 9 Joe Davis. 10 ALDERMAN DAVIS: In the police report it 11 indicated that you were caught with 200 to a thousand 12 13 grams of marijuana. Is that true? 14 MR. MBADIWE: Pardon? 15 ALDERMAN DAVIS: It indicated in the police 16 report that you were caught with 200 to a thousand 17 grams of marijuana. Is that true? 18 MR. MBADIWE: It was not true. 19 marijuana -- I did not have the marijuana. Is the people that I was in their car had it in their car. 20 21 It was not on me. So three of us got charged of it 22 because two guys that had it in the car, not me, were 23 the owners of the property. So I was sitting in the car with them all of us got charged with that. 24 25 ALDERMAN DAVIS: Did you -- At that time was

it in your taxi cab at that time?

MR. MBADIWE: No, it was not. It was in a different -- in a Tahoe truck. It was no way I had marijuana in a taxi. I never possessed marijuana in my life.

ALDERMAN DAVIS: You never transported marijuana in your taxi cab?

MR. MBADIWE: No, sir.

ALDERMAN DAVIS: Okay. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HINES: Seeing no additional questions, thank you. I do appreciate it.

We will now hear from Assistant City
Attorney Mr. Bruce Schrimpf.

MR. SCHRIMPF: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Bruce Schrimpf from the City Attorney's Office.

Included with the materials that were received into the record of the proceeding before the Utilities and Licenses Committee is the judgment of conviction of the licensee. It indicates that his license, his regular Wisconsin driver's license, was suspended for six months as a result of the conviction. He was also sentenced to eight months in the House of Correction.

The indications were that he had Huber

privileges. The committee was informed at the last meeting that the Huber privileges were revoked. Evidently the Huber privileges have been reinstated. However, the Wisconsin Department of Corrections in the person of his probation and parole agent has indicated that he is not permitted to drive a taxi cab during the course of his probation, which will extend for two years, and the Wisconsin Department of Corrections, along with the Milwaukee Police Department requested that the taxi cab driver's license be revoked for those reasons.

Whether or not the Council decides to revoke the license or suspend the license, that's something that's repose to your sound discretion, or for that matter to dismiss the case. But the facts are that his driver's license was suspended for six months. you take that from the date of conviction, which was December 3rd, 2004, he's still in his period of suspension of his driver's license.

At the conclusion of that period of time, his license is not automatically reinstated. applies for reinstatement of his driver's license, and that then is a process that the Wisconsin Department of Transportation decides if it will be reinstated or Then once that license is reinstated, he can

apply, -- depending on what the terms are that the council sets this day, he can apply for his public passenger vehicle driver's license. But to have a public passenger vehicle driver's license you first have to have a regular Wisconsin operator's license. That is suspended for six months, and of course his probation is for two years. So if there's any questions, I'll be happy to answer them.

PRESIDENT HINES: Are there any questions of Assistant City Attorney Bruce Schrimpf? Chair recognizes Alderman Joe Davis.

ALDERMAN DAVIS: The items B and C in this report, have those items been -- has there been any conclusion to those items? And was there a plea bargain or anything of that nature as concerning these items in the police report?

MR. SCHRIMPF: I believe -- I'm just checking the judgment of conviction. I believe the defendant pled -- Yes, the defendant pled no contest. The court then found him guilty based upon the information that was received in court, as well as whatever testimony the court would have received.

Be a little careful with the no contest That does not mean he pled guilty to the charges. It simply meant that he was not about to

challenge the charges, and then based upon those charges and whatever the testimony the court received, the court found him guilty as charged by the district attorney.

ALDERMAN DAVIS: All right. Thank you.
