1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

The Milwaukee Police Department (MPD) in partnership with the North Central High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) will pilot alternative field drug test kits to improve test analysis, accuracy, accountability, cost effectiveness, officer safety and efficiency. Officers assigned to HIDTA and the Special Investigations Division will test and evaluate the use of MobileDetect (MDT) testing solutions as well as develop new field drug testing standard operating procedures (SOP). MDTs will address the following drugs: cocaine, fentanyl, heroin, meth, multi-drugs, and THC. The program will also provide grant funded wifi-only cellular phones for sharing PDF reports. These phones will be used only for MDT as a strategy for preventing the transfer of hazardous materials onto department members' personal phones. Grant funding will be used to outfit each MPD work location that conducts drug testing with rugged field drug test kits and dedicated cell phones to automatically read, generate and report test results uploaded from the field kits.

- 2. Relationship to City-Wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:
 - The grant aligns with the goal to reduce crime and enhance quality of life through the detection and reduction of illicit drug use/sales in Milwaukee. In collaboration with North Central HIDTA Investigative Intelligence Center, timely and strategic analysis of drug test result data will lead to greater efficiency in identifying current and future drug trafficking trends.
- 3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

The total grant award of \$38,468 with a grantor amount of \$38,468 will fund the purchase of test detection and reporting for cocaine, fentanyl, heroin, meth, multi-drug, and THC and wifi-only cellular phones for each drug testing station within the department. No Department match is required.
