00002 1 PROCEEDINGS 2 CITY CLERK: Recommendation of nonrenewal of the Class B Tavern License of Terry Heinemeier, agent 4 for Terry Lee's Corporation, for the premises located 5 at 5516 West Center Street, known as Terry Lee's. 6 On this item written exceptions have been filed. 7 PRESIDENT HINES: The has the Council read 8 the recommendations of the Utilities & Licenses 9 Committee and any written exceptions? Will the city 10 clerk please call the roll. 11 THE CLERK: Are any of the following 12 applicants or their counsel present and wish to address the Common Council, Terry Heinemeier? 13 14 MR. HEINEMEIER: Yes, sir. 15 THE CLERK: We do have acknowledgement of 16 the presence of the applicant, is that correct, for 17 Terry Lee's Corporation, premises at 5516 West Center 18 Street. The recommendation of the committee was 19 nonrenewal of a Class B Tavern License. 20 PRESIDENT HINES: Alderman Witkowiak now 21 moves that we go into committee of the whole to hear 22 oral arguments on behalf of the licensees in 23 opposition to the report and recommendations and a 2.4 statement presented by the City Attorney. Is there 25 any objections? Hearing none, we are in the committee

of the whole. Each side shall be limited to five minutes, and the arguments shall be limited to the subject matter of the report and recommendations and the written exceptions.

The licensee and City Attorney will address the Common Council. In turn, if the licensee appears in person, he must be sworn in. Council members may ask questions of either the licensee or the City Attorney.

Would you please come forth and identify yourself for the record. Once again, you have five minutes to address the Council. Thank you.

 $\,$ MR. HEINEMEIER: Okay. My name that Terry Heinemeier, I'm the owner and agent for Terry Lee's on 5516 West Center.

The first thing I should say, I wasn't at the meeting because I didn't receive -- My mail was forwarded, although I know it's my fault and my responsibility, I didn't get it until after the hearing. Otherwise, I, of course, would have showed up. I know that's my responsibility.

I can answer the three things that are on the police reports since my last renewal period. One was there was a sting operation for underage serving alcohol. It was early in the afternoon. It's Item G

on Page 3, September 17th, 2004. All I can say is Al Peters has been a bartender for 25 years. He left his guard down, didn't ask for an I.D. card. We paid the fine. He's got just about a perfect record. I think he had one other one in 25 years for serving. That's all he's ever done.

All these things are serious, but there's two other items. H, on Page 3, two girls are shooting a game of pool, and the bartender is talking to one girl, the girl hits the girl over the head with a pool stick. I don't know how you react to that until after it happens. We called the police because there was a lot of blood. He called me first. I was at home. I said yeah, call the police in case there's a serious injury. Of course, they both left before the police came. And this is when we have a 300-pound doorman at the door, so I mean, you know, I don't know what to say. Who wants a fight like that? I don't know how you do something until after it happens.

There's one more item, it's I, on Page 3, and that was a shooting. The person didn't die, but also we had a doorman. I don't know how they got a gun in. Sometimes maybe a woman puts it in her purse or in her pants or what they do, but nobody wants shootings in their bar.

Our bar is like two different bars. We have a bar during the daytime, and we got a different crowd at night. I don't know if I got to put 30, age 30 on the door, which isn't legal anyhow, I guess, or change the format at night. I've got a young crowd. Try to play rock and roll or country or something. Since the shooting, we close at 10:00 every night, and if you're in the tavern business, that's when you make your money.

Also, I purchased the building next door about eight months ago, it's A to Z Door. I'm in this for the long haul, I'm not here just to make some money and get out. I will agree to close early every night, at least for a couple months. I don't know if I'll ever open it up again after 10:00, but if I'm closed down, I don't know where my day business will go or how I'll get it back. But that's about it.

PRESIDENT HINES: Thank you, Mr. Heinemeier. Are there any questions that Council may have of Mr. Heinemeier? Okay. Hearing none, thank you. We will now hear from the City Attorney's Office.

 $$\operatorname{MR}.\ \operatorname{SCHRIMPF}\colon$$ Thank you, Mr. President, members. My name is Bruce Schrimpf, I'm an Assistant City Attorney.

With respect to the findings, the Council is

certainly entitled to take the words of the applicant in explanation of some of those things that do appear in the Findings of Fact. I would like to remind the Council that the idea of preventing anyone from entering his bar who is not at least 30 years of age is illegal as age discrimination under another provision of the Ordinances, 84-5 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances.

I stand ready to answer any questions regarding any of the matters that are set forth in the police report. The Council certainly can amend this from a nonrenewal to a renewal with a suspension, the Council within its discretion, the Council, also, if you wish, could remand this matter to the Utilities & Licenses Committee for a full hearing. The applicant indicated he did not get his forwarded mail. However, you can proceed to decide the matter this morning in an appropriate fashion.

The recommendation of the committee is nonrenewal. It is certainly supported by the evidence as set forth in the Findings of Fact. So any questions you have, I'll be happy to answer them.

PRESIDENT HINES: Thank you, Attorney Schrimpf. Are there any questions of the Council of Attorney Schrimpf? Hearing none, thank you.

MR. SCHRIMPF: Thank you.

PRESIDENT HINES: Alderman Witkowiak moves that the committee now rises. Is there any further discussion on this license? Are there any motions relative to the license? I see someone with their light on has a question. Alderman Donovan.

ALDERMAN DONOVAN: Thank you, Mr. President. I just think it's fair that this gentleman be given a hearing if he wasn't -- I understand he didn't get his mail. That's not unusual. I can tell you a lot of things that I don't get at my house, too. The mail I don't have a great deal of faith in, quite frankly. But having said that, I would make a motion to refer back to the committee to allow this man the opportunity to present his case.

PRESIDENT HINES: I think that is an appropriate motion. Are there any comments on that motion? The Chair does recognize Alderman Michael Murphy.

ALDERMAN MURPHY: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Council. This location is in my aldermanic district. There was testimony provided at the Utilities & Licensing Committee hearing by two young women, a mother and daughter, in regards to the shooting and loss of life of their son, and that case

-- it was very serious, and as you've read in the police report very damaging towards the licensee.

The licensee was not present. Is there some obligation on the licensee to know when his license is up for renewal? If you're running a business and your livelihood depends on that license, do you not have any obligation to know when our license has to expire? Notwithstanding, I think the city did forward the request of the notice of the hearing, and whether he is truthful or not, we don't know for sure whether or not the licensee just simply misplaced it or not. I think there's some obligation and responsibility on the owner to know when his business is up for renewal.

So I would request that this not be sent back before committee. I think that the evidence that was provided in the report by the Milwaukee Police Department demonstrates clearly that the committee made the right decision. This is an establishment where there's been extremely serious incidents, incidents with lack of cooperation with the police department and loss of life.
