1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

This grant project will enable the MHD Laboratory to assist with evaluation of a laboratory developed molecular test for detection of STI pathogens associated with genital ulcer disease (GUD) as well as the validation of the CDC real-time multiplex PCR assay for the diagnosis of GUD, especially as it relates to patients presenting suspected syphilis and/or HSV.

2. Relationship to City-Wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

This grant is directly related to the MHD program goal of detection and treatment of sexually transmitted infections (STIs), and in particular syphilis and HSV screening and treatment.

3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

These grant funds are required to support the equipment, supplies and training needed to evaluate and validate the described molecular tests at the MHD Lab, which will also positively impact the department's KHC STI Clinic operations and services.
