Iconic This Is It! bar closed for good

After 56 years in business, This Is It!, an LGBTQIA+ bar in Downtown Milwaukee, has shuttered.

A sad and shocking post from This Is It! appeared on Facebook this afternoon, announcing that the legendary LGBTQIA+bar, located at 418 E. Wells St., was permanently closed for business.

June Brehm opened the bar in 1968, and it was later run by her son, Joe. Notably, both of the Brehms were heterosexual. By 2016, mother and son passed away and Geroge Schneider, the longtime manager, became the co-owner until the present day. Television personality and drag queen Trixie Mattel is the other owner.

Just before Joe's death, Mayor Tom Barrett proclaimed Thursday, March 31, 2016 "Joe Brehm Day" to recognize both Joe and June's LGBT community involvement by providing a destination "that welcomes members of the LGBT community into a place of acceptance and safety."

"This always has been a melting place for the community regardless of age, race, gender or sexual preference. June set that tone from the beginning and Joe preserved that tone," Schneider told OnMilwaukee in 2019.

This Is It! is an important part of Milwaukee history and will be missed by many. Here is the Facebook post from Schneider:

One last time, we honor our founders June and Joseph Brehm. While they are no longer with us, they would have been fighting the last few years along side us. Their memory and legacy lives on in our hearts too.
