Proposal	The applicant proposes to build a Green Infrastructure Treatment Train. This will include repaying drive and adjacent parking lot with permeable payers, expanding existing rain garden and constructing a new rain garden at the grounds of the No Point Lighthouse and keeper's house.	g an
Staff comments	Currently the ravine located south of the Lighthouse and upstream from Bradford Beach is highly eroded. It takes the runoff from 12 acres of medium to high dense residential urban areas and park land. The ravine will be retrofitted with regeneral storm water conveyance (RSC) and consists of a series of pools, riffles, and cascades that will direct runoff to an underlying media layer. This will help reduct storm water impacts to coastal areas. In this instance, outflow from the Lighthous area will be directed to the existing Bradford Beach infiltration cells. Although mutwork has been done to enhance beach sands, E.coli bacteria is still found along the storm water discharge points to Bradford Beach.	sity tive e se ch
	The proposal to the HPC consists of the following:	
	1) Permeable pavers will be installed where the current drive is located as well as the parking lot. The style and color of the pavers will tie into the current traditional pavers used on the walkways approaching the lighthouse.	
	2) The pavers will be a standard finish in Rustic Red, a color that has a more hist appearance.	oric
	3) The pavers will extend from Wahl Avenue to the Oak Leaf trail	
	4) The pavers will be used for the drive that leads to the parking lot and the lot its The lot will not be expanded. There will be parking for six vehicles, one of which handicap space.	
	5) The raingarden currently located north of the drive will be expanded by 1000 square feet.	
	6) A new raingarden will be added to the northeast of the keeper's house to captur runoff from the building's roof.	re
