Communication from WILLIAM TAYLOR

Dear Mr. Taylor:

We are in receipt of your claim for damages sustained to your vehicle, when you struck a hazard in the roadway on October 11, 2024, at or near the 3900 block of N. 35th Street.

The City takes every report of defective streets or sidewalks seriously. Upon notice of any defect the Department of Public Works will investigate, and/or patch, repair or barricade known hazards in its discretion. However, state law relative to roadway defects changed significantly following the adoption of 2011 Wisconsin Act 132. Under current state law, municipalities are only liable for known defects that the municipality has failed to timely repair. Generally, the City is not liable for damage related to roadway defects.

Our investigation determined that there is no record of any calls or reports of a hazard in the roadway prior to when you struck the hazard on October 11, 2024, and in the preceding three years. The City had no notice of the allegedly defective condition. Because the City did not have any notice, it cannot be held liable. As such, we are denying your claim.
